Financial Empowerment Center and College Now Partner to Bring Services to Kenmore

It has been almost two years since the Financial Empowerment Center (FEC) in Kenmore opened its doors and began offering free tax preparation and financial coaching services to residents of Summit County. During that time, our certified financial coaches have facilitated over 2,000 coaching sessions with almost 800 clients. Through these one-on-one sessions, we have helped individuals negotiate settlements with their creditors, save for a down payment on their dream home, create a manageable payment plan to tackle credit card debt, reestablish their credit after bankruptcy, and much more. Coaches have helped clients collectively save over \$277,318 and reduce debt by \$326,407.

As we enter our second year of operations, we have begun identifying additional programs that complement FEC services in helping individuals achieve their personal financial goals. To that end, we recently partnered with College Now to host a College Now advisor at the Financial Empowerment Center on a weekly basis. As a nonprofit organization with over 50 years of experience, College Now's goal is to help individuals pursue educational opportunities that empower them to embark on rewarding careers and strengthen the community. College Now advisors are trained to match individuals of all ages and levels of experience with educational pathways that lead to wealth-creating occupations. Much like financial coaching, this is not a "one size fits all" approach. College Now advisors meet students where they are, assess their education, career experience and goals, and match them with the opportunities that are their best fit.

The College Now advisor at the Financial Empowerment Center will provide guidance and resources to students of all ages, from traditional high school students to adults who have some college, but no degree, or who have never started the postsecondary process. In addition to helping individuals explore and apply for educational opportunities – including two-year, four-year and certificate programs – College Now also offers guidance on financial aid. This includes completing the FAFSA application, researching and applying for grants and scholarships, and evaluating financial aid award packages.

By helping individuals explore higher paying career options while also avoiding student debt, the work of College Now strategically aligns with the goals of the Financial Empowerment Center. We are proud to bring yet another valuable resource to the Kenmore community that can benefit all residents of Summit County. Councilman's Corner

Snow and Ice-It is Coming

I am often asked, "Why doesn't my street get plowed when others around me have?"

Akron's roadway network consists of over 829 centerline miles of roadway with over 1,919 lane miles (about the same distance as driving from Akron to Phoenix) covering almost 122 million square feet (about 2,118 football fields) not including the expressways. Every single winter event is different based on the many factors that influence snow and ice control operations. Here are a few items to help you enter the season with a better knowledge of what The City of Akron is doing as the snowflakes fall.

Akron has divided all streets and roadways into three classifications: first priority, second priority and third priority. In order to get as much traffic moving as soon as possible, the most heavily traveled streets are serviced first and then on down to the streets that are less traveled. These groups are further broken down into 51 zones with each zone having a 1st priority route map, a 2nd priority route map and a 3rd priority route map.

The first priority group streets are the most heavily traveled roadways covering approximately 900 route miles. The second priority group streets are less traveled than the first priority streets covering approximately 200 route miles and include collector streets, heavily travelled local roads, sloping dead end streets and streets surrounding roads. The final group is all of the remaining City of Akron streets and roadways covering approximately 300 route miles. These local streets are generally less traveled.

In addition to this, Akron has established four levels of response to cover all events. These levels of response are based on existing roadway conditions (surface conditions, pavement surface and subsurface temperatures, previous snow accumulations, residual de-icing materials, etc.), storm event forecasts (precipitation, temperatures, wind, sun, etc.) and forecasts following the event (precipitation, temperatures, wind, sun, etc.).

LEVEL 4 - This is the level of response for larger snow events and ice events. Fifty one trucks are in service for a level 4 event.

Ward 9 Councilman's Meetings

LEVEL 3 - Twenty eight trucks are in service. This is the level of response for smaller or minor snow events.

LEVEL 2 - Twenty one trucks work during this level of response for very minor snow events. Primarily, the most critical routes would be serviced. This level of response is for the very small snow events, plowing is not usually performed at this response level. Ice removal chemicals are applied.

LEVEL 1 - A level 1 response includes eight trucks covering either the main routes (arterial streets – AMATS) or the 8 bridge routes. This is the level of response for minor frost/freeze events that may cause icing on bridges or typically for pre-treatment of the main routes in advance of a minor event as forecast.

Anyone may enter a request to have their street serviced at any time by entering a Service Request with the 311 either online at www.AkronOhio.gov/311 or by calling the City's 3-1-1 line.

Akron Promise - Kenmore-Garfield High School Update

You may have seen the folks from Akron Promise at a couple of First Fridays this summer. Residents and visitors helped create a "Dreamboard" one week where they shared personal dreams, as well as dreams for their community. The next month, "Super Heroes" of all sorts shared their "Superpowers"! Or maybe Akron Promise founder, Tom Ghinder, helped your child tie a knot in their balloon. First Fridays were a fun and wonderful way for the community to get to know one another. Now that fall is in full swing, activities have been taken from Kenmore Boulevard back to Kenmore-Garfield High School.

ACT Scores are up! Just like last year, the KGHS students that were able to attend at least half of the Akron Promise ACT Score Improvement sessions improved their test scores the most! An average of two points were gained, which can make a difference in getting scholarships and/or getting into the college of choice. The program was offered again this fall to seniors and will be offered again in January to KGHS juniors.

To continue the work of helping students with post-high school success, a new KGHS student team has been formed. Just like the football team, choir, basketball team, Drama Club, and others, KGHS now has an Academic Achievement Team. Students volunteer to participate, and recruit others, in a team setting, with the opportunity to improve academic and life skills. The team meets every Thursday, during their lunch period. The students are in the process of naming their team. These lunchtime sessions include a curriculum of academics, job hunting skills, life lessons, and other skills or practice sessions. The curriculum has been developed by University of Akron students, through the ExL Center. Funding for this program is from generous grants by Akron's Neighborhood Partnership Program and The Akron Community Foundation's "Beyond the Table" grants, as well as some private donations. Akron Promise continues to lay the groundwork for a universal program in Akron where all students have access to required wraparound supports and a tuition free path to post-secondary certificates and degrees.

Making Strides on the Boulevard: 2019 Year in Review

This year has been one of history, creativity and fun on Kenmore Boulevard, and we have the donors and volunteers of Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance to thank. From cleanups and beautification efforts to street festivals and district marketing, this diverse group of residents is working hard to create an enjoyable, engaging Boulevard experience. Here are a few of the highlights.

HISTORIC DISTRICT & URBAN OVERLAY

On September 6th, Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance achieved a major goal: the National Park Service added the Kenmore Boulevard Historic District to the National Register of Historic Places. It was the result of a yearlong effort by KNA with support from the Kenmore Historical Society, City of Akron, State Historic Preservation Office and architects Chambers Murphy & Burge. The goal: to instill pride of place among residents and Boulevard property owners, encourage investment and improve people's perceptions of our community.

KNA's volunteer Design & Beautification Committee also partnered with the City of Akron Department of Comprehensive Planning to create special zoning that will preserve the historic scale and charm of the Boulevard. This Urban Overlay also prevents new empty street-fronting spaces like new open-air car lots and out-of-character construction that can detract from the district. We are grateful for their hard work.

"KENMORE OHIO" MURAL

In July, Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance commissioned a mural by Kenmore resident Caleb Aronhalt called "Kenmore Ohio," which brought color and community pride to the side of 998 Kenmore Boulevard. The mural was created in partnership with the University of Akron Art Bomb Brigade, including Kenmore residents Arlie & Paula Sandusky Holman and dozens of local art students. It has quickly become a point of pride and de facto selfie spot for residents and visitors alike. KENMORE CLEAN TEAM




Kenmore Kiwanis News



Innes CLC has started implementing PBIS (Positive Behavioral Intervention and Support) into the school day. PBIS is a system of positive ways to encourage good behavior within the school setting. Akron Public Schools has a universal slogan to "Be Safe, Be Responsible, Be Respectful". Innes CLC has put those three things into a "motto" for their school. The purpose of this acknowledgement system is to foster a welcoming and positive environment, focus staff and students attention on desired behaviors, increase the likelihood that desired behaviors will be increased, and reduce the amount of time spent correcting student misbehavior. Students are given tickets for showing safe, responsible and respectful behavior and given a prize when their names are chosen. Students are given a special ticket called a "Jagtastic ticket" when they go above and beyond the expectations and then given a dress down day. Student and Teacher of the month are among some of the other positive things happening at Innes CLC also.
