Kenmore Historical Society News

by Dan Brewer

A piece of rock-n-roll history made its way thru Kenmore in the late 1960's. A 1959, cherry sunburst in color, Les Paul standard guitar was modified by having its neck shaved to an elliptical profile by Virgil Lay of Lay's Guitar.

In 1967, Virgil owned and operated a guitar repair shop on the boulevard located between what was the Bank Lounge and the American Legion, in a house that has since been demolished.

The guitar at the time was owned by Joe Walsh of the James Gang and the Eagles. Joe revealed in a Guitar World May 2012 interview that he had a friend that was looking to switch from a Fender Telecaster to a Les Paul but couldn't find one he liked. That friend was Jimmy Page of Led Zeppelin. In April of 1969 Joe sold the guitar to Jimmy for \$1,200. That guitar was used in Led Zeppelin's body of work. The guitar is known as Page's "Number One" and is used on stage to this day.

In 1969 Lay's Guitar Shop moved to 2211 Thirteenth Street SW. The shop was in the basement of the building on the corner of Thirteenth Street and Kenmore Boulevard under the Coffee Shop. Virgil started SIT Guitar Strings and Dan Shinn bought the business in 1988. Dan now runs his shop at 974 Kenmore Boulevard. Dan's shop still continues to contribute to music today. Some of Dan's customers include Jimmy Buffet, Joe Bonamassa and Richard Marx.



Mike Conley Receives Ohio PTA Lifetime Achievement Award

When the 2011-12 Pfeiffer Elementary PTA Board had its first meeting in August 2011 to discuss its agenda for the year, a variety of important discussions occurred. Due to a lack of consensus, many were tabled for a later time. Only one came with little discussion and a unanimous agreement. Formerly known as the Ohio PTA Honorary State Life Membership, the Ohio PTA Lifetime Achievement Award is the highest honor given at the state level of the PTA. It is reserved for someone who goes above and beyond in their dedication to the service to children and youth in the school and the community at large. Pfeiffer had not given this award to anyone since 2005, but when Mike Conley's name was put forth, it was clear this honor was long overdue.

When Mike first volunteered as an Akron Reads tutor ten years ago, no one could imagine the impact that he would have on the Pfeiffer community. However, teacher Pam Toppin saw something special in Mike and requested he become a tutor exclusively for her class. Since the, Pam and Mike have become inseparable. At 73, Mike has remained an active PTA member, chaperoned field trips, and spent everyday possible working with Mrs. Toppin's students for 45 minutes or more each day, honing their reading and writing skills. His presence in the hallway outside Room 1 has warranted a permanent desk, where he is frequently greeted as "Grandpa" by the current students and those past students who make time just to visit him.

Mike's quick wit brings smiles everyday and his easy nature sets the most anxious student at ease. When Mrs. Toppin moved from teaching second to first grade, Mike asked if he'd been demoted. He can often be overheard jesting with the first graders, "Pack your suitcase. It looks like you are going to be awhile!" or teasing the girls with pigtails about the "things growing out of their head".

Mike's commitment to the students, staff, and PTA at Pfeiffer is unwavering. He frequently walks to school, cane in hand, stopping to hold the door for the ladies. When he's unable to be at school on a Friday, Mike calls Mrs. Toppin at home to find out how his "kiddos" did on their reading and spelling tests. When the PTA had a vacancy, Mike did not hesitate to step up and serve as the Voting Delegate and attends every meeting he is able for both the Akron Council PTA and the Pfeiffer PTA. There are times when his wife of 37 years, Mary Lou, has to "strongly suggest" he stay home, to ensure that his health is a priority. Mike has guided so many PTA members through stressful situations, always reminding them that their efforts should always remain student focused and turning tears into laughter. The special father-daughter bond that he and Mrs. Toppin have developed helped her through the death of her own father and is so strong that students often ask if Mike is her dad. Mike teases the kids that Mrs. Toppin is "way to old" to be his daughter.

Both of Mike's parents were educators, his dad a History and English teacher and his mother a second grade teacher. Mike served in the US Coast Guard and drove truck for Roadway, but Mike always wanted to be a teacher. He had even considered going back to school to fulfill that

dream. What Mike humbly neglects to realize is that he has become a teacher. He may not have a degree in education from a big name university, but his dedication to Pfeiffer has taught so many lessons which cannot be found in any books. Mike Conley has exemplified commitment, shown that actions speak louder than words, taught us to laugh at ourselves, shown us what young at heart really means and that chivalry does still exist. He has tutored children and mentored adults, and made everyone who has had the pleasure of knowing him a better person for the experience.

On February 28th, the Pfeiffer PTA held its 93rd Annual Founders Day Luncheon. Joining the PTA were former PTA presidents, principals, and award winners. Among them were Harold E. Stroll, Tom and Lori Prentice, Sam Salem, and Robert Dangler. The Harold E. Stroll/Pfeiffer PTA Scholarships were presented to senior Kahlib Painter and Akron Early College student Kimmy Lamson, the Outstanding Award was presented to Mrs. Barbara Sharnsky, who has been teaching at Pfeiffer for 25 years, and the Helping Hand Award was presented to former Pfeiffer Secretary, Mrs. Jackie Cox. Surrounded by his wife Mary Lou, his daughter-in-law Kathy Delany, and his son and daughter-in-law Tim and Lynn Delaney, Mike graciously accepted the award he so greatly deserves. Unable to hold back the tears, Mrs. Toppin presented the award to her "Dad". In his true nature, Mike once again turned tears into Laughter.
