Summit Lake Community Clean-Up Planned for Saturday April 22nd

On April 22nd, we will hold our 3rd Annual Grand Summit Lake Clean-Up from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. Volunteers from all over the Akron area will join together to participate in a large-scale cleanup at Summit Lake. This year has brought a more special focus on our clean-up as the Knight Foundation and the Northeast Ohio Four County Regional Planning & Development Organization (NEFCO) have provided grants to check the condition of Summit Lake and the surrounding land, and The Trust for Public Land in Cleveland has begun to organize community meetings to determine how to best enjoy this treasure in our neighborhood.

Last year over 160 volunteers helped collected 5.07 tons of litter, as well as 14 tires, 4 propane tanks, and one scooter, all in just 4 hours! We covered the entire lake, with volunteers working in their assigned zones on both sides of the lake and making sure each area was litter free.





The clean-up is sure to be one of the largest projects that takes place during Keep Akron Beautiful Clean-Up Akron Month. With the help of the Ohio & Erie Canal-Way Coalition, Keep Akron Beautiful, and The Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance (who has joined the clean-up this year for the first time), all will help us promote Kenmore and the asset we have here in our ward. We will clean the entirety of the lake, identifying zones which were highly littered and in need of a higher volume of volunteers. We invite any organization to become involved, and all residents are welcome to participate. Councilman's Corner

Helping Neighborhoods and Seeking Lost Income

Legislation that will require Akron landlords to pay a yearly \$15 per rental unit registration fee was recently approved by Council. The legislation capped the maximum a landlord would have to pay at \$1,500. The increase is the first since the city started charging a registration fee in 1996. These fees fund The City's Mandatory Inspection Program.

Thinking ahead to spring, an ordinance that will allow the city to create a mowing list of unkempt, high-weed lots was approved. Owners of the lots placed on the list will be notified that the city has put the property on a regular mowing schedule and the cost will be added to the property tax bill. Previously, lot owners had to be notified in advance and given the opportunity to mow their own grass every time they were in violation of the city's high-weed ordinance. This ordinance should prove effective in expediting the process.

Finally, we are aware that revenue is lost each year in income taxes in the building trade. Council has therefore passed legislation requiring all construction contractors to register with the city before they can pull a building permit. The legislation aims to ensure that contractors and their workers' pay city income taxes.



Kenmore Historical Society News

Kenmore started out with a four room school in 1903 with 84 students and two teachers. This school later became Heminger. The first graduating class of four in 1907 adopted the motto "We will find a way or make one." They were Vesta Heminger, Maggie Henry, Elsie Wagoner and Floyd Wagoner. Colonial School was built in 1912 and the first unit of Lawndale in 1914. By 1915, the Kenmore school system had 960 pupils with 32 teachers and made state news for being the fastest growing system in Ohio.





Kenmore High School in 1917

Construction on the original Kenmore High School was started in 1916 and finished the next year. High school classes moved to the new building the fall of 1917. Kenmore was growing so rapidly that in February of 1917 work was started on a twenty-room annex to the new building. There was a total of fifty teachers and four schools in Kenmore. Enrollment included 100 in Senior High, 175 in Junior High and 1,300 in first through sixth grade. Grade school children moved into the addition in the fall of 1918 because Pfeiffer and Smith elementary schools were not built until 1919 and 1920.

Kenmore High School is 100 years old this year! Cleon Deselms, Jay Prentiss, Mildred Reffner and James Stuver were the first graduating class of 1918. From there the graduation classes grew and grew. Kenmore Ohio was mentioned in an article in The New York Times on May 10th, 1920 as a city of 12,683 showing an increase of 712.5 percent within the previous ten years.

Kenmore High continued to expand. An office, cafeteria, gymnasium and music room were added in 1950 and an auditorium in 1952. Beginning the summer of 1980, the original 1916 building was demolished and the 1952 addition remodeled. During the 1980-1981 school year, students attended classes while remodeling was completed and a new gymnasium was built. By the time seniors graduated in June 1981, the construction was finished.

The Historical Society is trying to preserve memories and memorabilia of Kenmore High thru all the years. We need to gather more information especially from the 1960's and forward. We invite you to join us in this endeavor. We can scan your photos and return them to you. You can contact us on our website or come to a meeting. Our next meeting will be February 27th, 6:30 pm, at the Kenmore Library. We are planning to have a speaker. Check our website in February for an update.



Kenmore High School Wins Recycle Bowl Competition

In honor of America Recycles Day, the Akron Public Schools, Keep Akron Beautiful, and the River Valley Paper Company held their annual mixed paper recycling competition between high schools, middle schools and elementary schools in 2016. The competition took place between October 17th and November 11th. And we are proud to report that Kenmore High School won 1st Place for High Schools!

During the competition, Kenmore High School recycled 7.16 pounds per student, or 1.52 tons total, and earned a \$500 cash prize, courtesy of the River Valley Paper. Overall, 21.52 tons or 47,460 pounds of paper was recycled citywide, which is 1,310 pounds more than in 2015.

Currently in the Kenmore/Ward 9 area, bins are located at Innes CLC, Kenmore High School, and Sam-Salem CLC. This paper drive is designed to give our trash a second life and help save our trees, which purge the atmosphere of greenhouse gases. The receptacles are still in place and are accessible 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Filling up the collection bins helps our schools raise money for their clubs or team uniforms.

Project Shine Plans for Silent Auction

Project Shine is looking for help with their Annual Silent Auction, which will he held on Friday April 7th. This is their primary fundraiser and usually has approximately 200 people in attendance. They are looking for donations of themed gift baskets, admission tickets, gift certificates or other items that can be auctioned or raffled.

Project Shine is a 501c3 non-profit organization that serves the Kenmore & Ellet communities in Akron. Project Shine has one core work week during the summer and various other work weekends throughout the year. During these times, many youth and adults spend time going out into our community performing many tasks and serving residents in these areas. These tasks include painting houses (both interior and exterior), garages, decks & fences, yard clean ups including brush/shrub removal, branches trimmed, leaves raked, flowers planted, and all around sprucing up. They also clean windows, walls & floors, and do general home maintenance. These services are provided for residents who are financially or physically unable to complete the projects themselves.

Park United Methodist Church Update on the West Africa Clinic in Zimbabwe

The sides (walls) and a portion of the roof have been completed for the clinic. The next big step is the windows and doors placement. The connecting wall to the clinic has been completed, since it shares a wall with the living quarters.

Onias and Diana Mabgwe are in Gweru, Zimbabwe at this moment assisting with building the clinic. If you remember, this clinic is a vision of the Mabgwe's who grew up in Zimbabwe and are familiar with the lack of medical care available to the people in this area for Africa. The nearest clinic, at present, is more than 30 miles away. The clinic we are building is more like a small hospital. It will provide medical care and health education for over 200,000 people in this area of Africa. The cost to build this clinic is estimated at \$100,000 which Park Church is working on raising. To date we have raised \$9,737.50.

Our next fund raiser is Dining to Donate at Applebee's at Chapel Hill (508 Howe Avenue in Cuyahoga Falls) on February 9th. A flyer is needed to be presented at Applebee's so that the West Africa Clinic will receive 15% of your check when you dine at Applebee's at Chapel Hill—only. 

We will end the day with a time of shared prayer and blessing from 6:00 pm to 6:30 pm.




