The Rookery Creative Collective Opens on Kenmore Boulevard

Kenmore Boulevard was buzzing on November 1st with excitement as neighbors, artists, and community leaders gathered to celebrate the grand opening of **The Rookery Creative Collective** - a new home for art, recycling, and collaboration in the heart of the Boulevard.

The once-vacant storefront, now filled with color and creativity, marks another milestone in the ongoing revitalization of Kenmore's business district. Led by **Tansy Recycling**, the collective brings together local artists and makers who share a vision for sustainability, artistry, and community connection.

Tansy Recycling, founded by Ryan Carpenter and Wren Kohler, has been a familiar presence in Kenmore's creative scene, transforming post-consumer plastics into vibrant, functional works of art. From home studio beginnings to their new permanent space, Tansy's journey reflects the neighborhood's own story of renewal.

"In the wild, a rookery is a place where birds can gather for safety and community," Carpenter explained. "Our Rookery is the same, providing a space for artists to come together, create, and be inspired."

The new studio and gallery will also host workshops, exhibitions, and collaborations with local musicians and visual artists, further energizing Kenmore's growing arts district.

The project came to life with support from **Better Kenmore CDC**, whose partnerships with community members and property owners helped secure the space. It's the latest example of how placemaking, turning underused spaces into centers of creativity and connection, continues to reshape Kenmore Boulevard.

Councilperson's Corner

Since the 2014 EPA consent decree forced Akron to achieve an unrealistic 0% storm-sewer overflow, the city has been working hard to save residents money on this \$1.2 billion mandate. For example, by reducing the Northside Interceptor Tunnel's diameter by 7½ feet, Akron saved taxpayers about \$50 million. It is now pushing to eliminate a mandated \$209 million high-rate treatment facility. I want to thank both the Horrigan and Malik administrations for making a sewer rate hike a last resort.

Ward 9 Councilperson's Meetings

Councilperson Boyes holds a public meeting on a Tuesday of every month. This month's meeting will be at Allenside Presbyterian Church, 410 Rexford Avenue, where you can discuss your community and your city!

This meeting is Tuesday November 18th at 6 pm.

An important public hearing is coming up that will significantly impact Ward 9. On Monday, November 17th, Akron City Council will meet at 5:00 pm. Council will review the Akron Public Schools' \$78 million plan to build Pfeiffer Elementary and the Miller South School for the Visual & Performing Arts campus at the former Kenmore High School site. This project is more than about new schools—it's an economic driver aligned with Better Kenmore's revitalization work. Given the Akron Public School's financial challenges, strong community support is critical. Here's how you can help:

- 1) Attend the hearing at 166 S. High Street, 3rd Floor on November 17th at 5:00 pm
- 2) Email your support to sbiviano@akronohio.gov

Council is also considering a Conditional Use request for an Amazon Sub-Same Day Fulfillment Center at the former Akron Baptist Temple/The Word Church site. This \$30+ million investment would bring hundreds of good full- and part-time jobs and even more flex delivery opportunities for residents operating their own vehicles. That means very little additional truck traffic to Manchester Road.



Ward 9 Leaf Removal Program



The city of Akron has begun its annual Bulk Leaf Removal Program. Akron residents, within the posted area, will be permitted to place leaves in the street, not more than two feet from the curb on their Leaf Collection Day. For Ward 9, leaf removal is scheduled to begin Monday December 10th.

Residents may use any of their three (3) annual FREE Sanitation bulk pickups for leaves (which must be bagged to be picked up) if they don't want to wait for the scheduled pickup. You will need to schedule this thru the 3-1-1 call center.

To those taking advantage of this city program, please remember---

<u>DO NOT</u> place branches or other debris in the pile, they will not be picked up (leaves only).

<u>DO NOT</u> allow children to play in leaves on or near the street.

<u>DO NOT</u> bag leaves unless you have called 3-1-1 to arrange for one of your (3) three Sanitation bulk pickups.

DO NOT rake leaves into the street after leaves have been removed or you will be subject to a fine.

<u>DO NOT</u> park vehicles over leaves. The heat from the underside of the vehicle may cause a fire.

DO rake leaves into the street the day before the scheduled pickup day (December 10th) only.

DO rake leaves into the street no more than two feet from the curb or edge of street.

DO remove all vehicles off the street when crews are working in your area.

<u>Please Note:</u> Parked vehicles left on the street, while crews are working, are subject to be towed/fined.

Signs will be posted at intersections to remind residents when leaves will be removed. Signs will be posted in wards prior to pickup dates.

Please keep in mind that it takes multiple days to complete each ward. The schedule can change due to weather. Check for updates to the schedule on the Akron City's website at www.akronohio.gov/cms/LeafRemovalProgram/Index. All residents need to have the leaves out by the posted date. Do not wait until you see the equipment in your ward or you may be too late. For leaf removal information, please dial 3-1-1 or 330-375-2311, or check on the web at www.akronohio.gov. 



Hope Church Celebrates 170th Anniversary

The members and friends of Hope Church Akron (Global Methodist) met together for worship on Sunday October 19th to celebrate the 170th anniversary of the church's founding. Pastor Don Davies returned to bring the message of commemoration and celebration reminding the gathered church of God's faithful presence and guidance throughout its' history.

It was in March 1855, when there was no Barberton or Kenmore, eight families met in the home of Samuel and Suzanna Gaugleralong with two circuit pastors to begin what would become Hope Evangelical Church. Within a year they built a small meeting building on the corner of Cory and Waterloo Roads, followed by a stone building in 1902 that was enlarged in 1920. The church, located in Coventry Township, was centered in an area surrounded by farmland. It was because of this that in the early 1900's some members who lived in the area that would become Kenmore decided to start a second church on the boulevard. The reason for this - because traveling to the "rural area" was too far.

Over the next forty years Hope Church continued to grow as a community of homes popped up around it. This continued with the Castle Homes development and in 1958, a new building was constructed on its current site.

Throughout this time, sixty-seven pastors, two assistant pastors and their wives brought their own unique gifts that helped us navigate through the changes and challenges the church would face.

Hope Church also commemorated all the people on whose shoulders it stands, that without their faithfulness and dedication there would not be the church as it is today. The members were reminded that while it is important to celebrate its history, that grateful thanksgiving should be given for the ways in which God sustained it to serve as a beacon of Christ's love and salvation.

Looking ahead the church is challenged with this question: What is His call on us today? The same as it was in 1855. To build His kingdom in our corner of the world.

It is our prayer that God revive and renew us and the Kenmore Community in the spirit of Christ and give us the desire to go to work making Christ known to every part of His kingdom now until He returns.
