I'M RETIRING!!! (Part 2)



December 2025

I am now two months into my Retirement Sale at Kenmore Komics, and the store is starting to look bare. My buddy up in Cleveland, who retired back in March, liquidated his stock over a one month period, but could not sell all he had. I took what he had left and sold it for him in my store between April and October. Seeing how long it sometimes takes to liquidate hobby merchandise, I started my sale in October at 50% off everything, and every two weeks dropped it another 10%. This worked out well, as it gave my customers many weeks to budget their purchases over this longer time. With the start of December, I am now at 90% off all inventory, and expect to go through the rest at a very fast pace, until another store or convention dealer makes me an offer on all that is left.

It was too bad I could not find a buyer for my very niche hobby store, but it looks like by the method I am using to sell everything that I will net about 75% of my asking price (I guess I had more value in my collectible stock than I originally thought). A very happy outcome for the last amount to be put in my retirement fund. If you have a retail store that must liquidate, take as much time as you can, your customers will spend more on you than in a shorter period.
