City of Akron Mayor Jeff Fusco, Councilman Mike Freeman, developers Terry Hanson, Steve Boone and Fred Zumpano, Nick Browning of FirstMerit, Grady Appleton of EANDC, and John Kircher from the Ohio Housing Finance Agency gathered at a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the grand opening of Kenmore Place. The forty unit senior citizens housing complex is now completely occupied. The building is owned and operated by RLJ Management of Columbus. Builders Zumpano + Hanson report that the project took fourteen months to complete and features energy efficient heating and cooling systems, upgraded insulation, and was built to Enterprise Green standards. A community room for joint programming with the Kenmore Senior/Community Center was included as one of the tenant amenities.

Grassroots Organization Helps "Connect the Dots" for Individuals and Organizations in Kenmore by Nolan James

Many of us in Kenmore believe that our community has a lot of untapped potential. Kenmore United was formed to help transform the kinetic energy in the form of untapped potential into something that we can all be proud of. We had an initial "Kickoff" meeting in which we conducted a community needs assessment and visioning project. This project identified five key areas in which we needed to pay special attention to as a community:

1) Environmental Issues, 2) Safety and Community Policing, 3) Economic Development, 4) Arts and Culture, 5) Children and Families

Our organization knows that Rome was not built in a day, and we recognize that we cannot completely rebuild Kenmore overnight. However, we are encouraged by the support of one another, the Kenmore Community, and our strategic community partners.

Since our initial meeting in October 2015, Kenmore United has received the following accolades:

1) Selected as a top 130 finalist for the Knight Cities Challenge. Out of over 4,500 grant proposals submitted to the Knight Cities Challenge, an idea from our group, which will benefit the Kenmore community, was selected. We are in the process of refining our proposal to submit for final consideration.

2) Selected as a Community Partner with the Akron Art Museum for the Inside|Out Art project. Inside|Out is a community-activated art project that brings high quality art reproductions from the Art Museum's collection into neighborhoods across the Greater Akron Area. Our community will have 10 outdoor art displays this Spring and Summer as a result of this partnership.


Two Kenmore Schools To Close

Lawndale and Smith Elementary Schools are scheduled to close at the end of the 2015-2016 school year. Both schools have a low enrollment. Students who now attend Lawndale will be assigned to Sam Salem Community Learning Center, formerly called Highland Park, and Smith students will be assigned to Pfeiffer Elementary for the school year beginning in the fall of 2016.

The original Lawndale School was a one-room frame building on Wilbeth Road. True Life Church is located there now. Originally part of the Coventry Township District, the K-8 school was named after the Lawndale Allotment. In 1912, a four-room brick school was erected on 25th Street and opened the following year. Due to increased enrollment, additions were added, and in 1929 Lawndale became part of the Akron Public Schools when Kenmore was annexed to the City of Akron. Lawndale celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2012.

When Smith School was constructed in 1918, it was also part of the Coventry School District and later annexed to Akron. The school was named in honor of Fred E. Smith (1857-1940), a real estate dealer who donated the site where the school was built. The school opened in the fall of 1921. The stone wall around the playground was a WPA project. Eighth graders left Smith in 1953, and seventh graders left in 1954 to go to Kenmore. Innes was built in 1959.

Several other Kenmore elementary schools have closed over the years. The first was Colonial on 4th Street. It was built in 1915 and closed in 1964. The building later housed a sheet metal

Guinther opened in 1958 on Carnegie Avenue. The school was named after Robert Guinther (1890-1955), an Akron attorney and board member. The school closed in1993. Before its demolition, it served as an administration building for the Akron system.

Margaret Park on Manchester Road was constructed in 1917 and opened in the spring of 1918. The school was named in honor of Margaret Barnhart (1874-1913) who was a leader in establishing public playgrounds. Margaret Park closed in 2007 and is scheduled for demolition.

Our most recent school to close was Heminger on 11th Street. Heminger was the first school built in Kenmore. It originally housed all grades. In May of 1907, the first class of students graduated from Heminger. Other elementary schools were built, along with our high school and junior high. Heminger closed in 2008 and was demolished in 2013 to be replaced by Kenmore Place, a new apartment complex.

All of the Kenmore Historical Society's Miniature Wooden Blocks of Historical Buildings (including their newest at right - Chestnut Ridge Park) can be purchased at Kenmore Komics & Games, 1020 Kenmore Boulevard.



The next Kenmore Historical Society meeting is scheduled for February 29th at the Kenmore Library on Kenmore Boulevard at 6:30 pm. Our program that evening will feature Reeves Cake Shop on Cory Avenue. The bakery is celebrating its 25th anniversary. Their family operated a shop on Kenmore Boulevard called Bachtel Bakery. Presently, Pierre's Deli is located there. Plan to attend our February meeting and learn more about this Kenmore business and sample some of their bake goods.
