This Year's Summit Lake Clean-Up Another Success!

On April 23rd, 2016, volunteers from all over the Akron area joined together to participate in a large scale cleanup at Summit Lake. Over 160 volunteers helped collected 5.07 tons of litter, as well as 14 tires, 4 propane tanks, and one scooter, all in just 4 hours. Families, groups of friends, neighbors and community groups like The University of Akron's William's Honors College students, Circles and Kent State University's Super Service Saturday Students, Rare Divas Social Club, Starbucks, G. Stephens and Bridget Drill Team, joined the cleanup effort. We had great support from the City of Akron with their sanitation crew working "overtime" to gather the collected trash, Keep Akron Beautiful trailers & sign up support, and the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition. We covered the entire lake, with volunteers working in their assigned zones and making sure each area was litter free.

The cleanup is one of the largest projects that takes place during Keep Akron Beautiful's Clean Up Akron Month. With the help of the Ohio & Erie Canalway Coalition, Keep Akron Beautiful, and many Kenmore residents, a plan was created to effectively distribute volunteers around the entirety of the lake, identifying zones which were highly littered and in need of a higher volume of volunteers.

Keep Akron Beautiful was able to be on site with their two community improvement trailers to help the volunteers with the tools they would need to get the job done: gloves, rakes, litter grabbers and GLAD trash bags, as well as recycling bags. Thanks to grant funding from the Ohio EPA, volunteers also received neon green tee-shirts helping to ensure the safety of volunteers as they embarked to collect litter from the lake.

Safety was one of the top concerns during the planning process of the cleanup. The Akron Police Department was on site to assist with the disposal of portable meth labs, needles and other hazardous materials found during the cleanup.



Helping Ward 9 Look Its Best

You may not have noticed or you may have missed it in the paper but recently Akron City Council passed two ordinances that will assist neighborhoods from a blighted appearance.

Every year the city of Akron will demolish over 500 blighted properties. This, obviously is a good thing for neighborhoods. The issue that we have noticed however is that sometimes these empty lots can become a parking lot for neighboring cars. Recently Akron City Council passed an ordinance prohibiting any parking whatsoever of vehicles on these lots. For any of you that would have such properties in their neighborhood, please know that you can call 3-1-1 and report when vehicles are attempting to use these vacated lots as residential parking lots.

Another recent ordinance which was passed by Akron City Council has to do with the use of storage containers or dumpsters in residential neighborhoods. Sometimes individuals will place dumpsters or storage containers, (also known as PODS) on their lots. Per a recently passed ordinance, these units are now limited to a 90 day period. Again, please call 3-1-1 to report such an incidence on your street.

On another note, I sadly attended the recent funeral of one of Kenmore's long-standing members, Mr. Jack Warington. Jack was a constant advocate for his street and neighborhood. In thinking about Mr. Warrington I was keenly aware of the need for conscientious citizens in the 9th Ward who will do their part to report violations on their street and strive for strong and clean community. Condolences to the Warrington family.

I am looking forward to seeing many folks at the upcoming Kenmore Community Days Festival.

Thank you for allowing me to serve our community these past 14 years. Most importantly, thank you for the part that you have played in striving to preserve the neighborhoods of the 9th Ward. It is a joy to serve the community that I have always called my home.

Student Chef: Lemons to Lemonade

As I finish high school at Kenmore, where I partake in Culinary Arts program, I recently was accepted to The Culinary Institute of America in Hyde Park, New York. This is a huge accomplishment for me being the first APS student (to my knowledge) accepted to what's considered the Harvard of culinary schools. Attending the college of my dreams has now become a near reality.

In my short 18 years of life I have faced many trials and tribulations. As a adolescent I found myself succumbing to my situation: a life filled with good intentions and consequential unfortunate events. Due to my parents mistakes I spent most of my high school career homeless or in the care of family members who felt me & mine were less than worthless. In their eyes I was destined to become a statistic as a black girl who never made it anywhere because of her upbringing and for sometime they had me convinced.

I believe my story has been written before: a tale of loss and overcoming it. Sophomore year I was determined to make my parents and myself proud. I learned to block out the chaos around me and dedicate my time to my studies. From that point on and most of my junior year I maintained a 3.0 grade point average. This I felt was a turning point in my life until life dealt me something I till this day can't seem to fathom. December 1st, 2014 my mother passed away suddenly due to a heart attack. Though my mother made it her mission to teach each of her children how to live without her, nothing can truly prepare you on how to live without your parent. Losing my mom caused me and my family a lot of pain, but I am happy to say it also added fuel to the fire representing my ambition.



The moral of my story is as complex as it is simple. You and only you can shape your destiny. I feel I am a prime example that this stands true. I've learned nothing in life comes without a price, hard work and dedication. You can try your best and still lose, but if you're willing to get back up and try again, then you stand a chance at achieving greatness. Wake up every morning and tell yourself "The situation I was born into does not define who I am and what I'm capable of, nor does the present situation I find myself in now. Ultimate failure does not exist in the form of one try not working out, these are opportunities to learn and do better. To promote the idea that anything could stop me gives the odds playing against me power, and in the end, if I should fail it will be at my own hands." We grow up thinking our greatest enemy are the people who tell us "we can't" when in reality the greatest enemy we face is the part of ourselves who believe them.






