

For forty years, Kenmore has had the pleasure of tasting some of the finest baked goods in Akron. **Reeves Cake Shop**, currently located at 2770 Cory Avenue, started on East Avenue in 1976 by Dolores Reeves. She began by selling cake & candy supplies, and all the baked goods sold on East Avenue were baked in her home. In 1989 she purchased the building on Cory Avenue, and opened a full-time bakery business. Now known for a wide variety of birthday and wedding cakes, **Reeves Cake Shop** has a special "Cake of the Month" for any occasion.

For the month of August, **Reeves Cake Shop's** "Cake of the Month" is their delicious Bumblebee Cake. It is four layers of dark chocolate and orange cake filled with chocolate mousse and a sting of raspberry, all iced in buttercream. The September cake is "Death by Chocolate".

There are currently three generations of family working at **Reeves Cake Shop**. The full-time workers include Dolores, her daughter Terry, son Rick, granddaughter Amanda, son Ron (who works on the weekends), and many other family members who help out as well. Reeves Cake Shop has long enjoyed a tradition of fresh baked wedding and all occasion cakes. They are still using recipes from their parents and grandparents, Ada and Bill Bachtel, owners of **Bachtel's Bakery** (circa 1920s). 

Many times I am asked how a citizen can express their concerns before Akron city Council. There are several venues in which this can be done.

First, there is a Public Comment period at the conclusion of each regular Council meeting, and a Public Hearing period during Council meetings when rules require.

Akron citizens can address Council for three minutes on any matter that is within Council's authority during the Public Comment period. You will be asked to give your name and address and sign in for the record, and your remarks will be limited to three minutes.

Second, if Council advertises and holds a Public Hearing on proposed legislation during the regular Council meeting, you may speak only about the legislation being considered.

If you wish to address Council outside of the Public Comment period, you may submit a written request to the President of Council. Submit your request no later than Friday prior to the scheduled City Council meeting at which you would like to speak. Specify the topic you want to discuss. The Council President will consider your request and either instruct the Clerk of Council to notify you of your appointed time to address Council or refer you to your Ward Councilperson or the appropriate committee for action.

Lastly, any ward Council person, at-large Council person, President, Vice President, or President pro tem can be reached by calling 330-375-2256. You can be heard!

Park United Methodist Church Begins Building West Africa Clinic

Park United Methodist Church is building a clinic in West Africa. Zimbabwe is a landlocked state in southern Africa, between the Zambezi and Limpopo Rivers. It borders South Africa to the South, Botswana to the west, Zambia to the northwest, and Mozambique to the east and northeast. The capital and the largest city is Harare.

The two names that are connected with this project are Onias and Dianna Mabgwe, who were both born in Zimbabwe. The story of their education at Christian mission secondary schools and their travel to the USA for further education is a truly interesting and blessed one. After arriving in the USA, many challenges were met by their faith in God and arriving at Park Methodist Church for support and friendship.

Both Dianna and Onias are now RN's in the USA health system. They both have experiences of less than perfect health care in Zimbabwe. They both have lost loved ones to infections and health challenges that with a clinic and physicians nearby could have been prevented. They have begun to build a clinic (really a hospital) in Zimbabwe that will serve approximately 200,000 people who, at present, do not have easy access to health care.

The estimated cost of this clinic is \$100,000. Much of the needed equipment, beds and linens are already in Zimbabwe awaiting a building. The first shipment of bricks has already arrived to begin to build the caretakers house!
