

Amazingly GRACE'D Akron Salon to Employ Impoverished Teen and Young Moms

Nails, eyebrow threading, hair, and a whole lotta grace! For Karen Lile, a retired small business owner, it's a recipe for empowering young, underprivileged women to build a better future for themselves and their children.

Lile, who provides job skills training to teen and young moms, purchased Zoe Ann's Salon at 975 Kenmore Boulevard in December of 2016. The new name is GRACE'D Salon. Its name is synonymous with its mission: GRACE'D both given and received. (Those beauticians who worked at the former Zoe Ann's Salon will still be located at GRACE'D, offering excellent service to their customers).

"God shows grace to us," Lile said, "and the least we can do is show these young women that Jesus loves them no matter their background or current life circumstances."

Lile requires her prospective employees to be mentored and to take job skills training classes through Jump On Board For Success (JOBS), a non-profit she started in 2014. The JOBS program instructs young women in life skills, including parenting, budgeting, filling out job applications, and proper work attire and conduct

"My philosophy is to give a hand up, not a handout," she added, stressing that her goal is for the young women to eventually become self-sufficient and free from government assistance.

Lile, who has a history of micro economic development with her late husband John, said her "desire is to help those who are marginalized, to help them break the cycle of generational poverty." Breaking that cycle, Lile added, begins with offering these young women an opportunity to change the trajectory of their future.

It begins with offering them hope - it begins, she said, with grace.



Summit Lake Community Clean-Up

On April 22nd, volunteers from all over the Akron area joined together to participate in a large-scale cleanup at Summit Lake. Over 260 volunteers helped collect 5.71 tons of litter, as well as 18 tires and 12 concrete construction blocks in just 3 hours. Families, groups of friends, neighbors and community groups like Mr. Dunbar's honors class from The University of Akron's William's Honors College, along with the Summit Corp kids, joined the cleanup effort on Saturday. We had great support from the City of Akron with their sanitation crew working "overtime" to gather the collected trash, through Keep Akron Beautiful trailers and sign up support, and the Ohio Erie Canal Coalition. We covered the entire lake, with volunteers working in their assigned zones and making sure each area was litter free.

The cleanup is one of the largest projects that takes place during Keep Akron Beautiful Clean Up Akron Month. With the help of Ohio Erie Canal Way Coalition, Keep Akron Beautiful, and many Kenmore residents, a plan was created to effectively distribute volunteers around the entirety of the lake, identifying zones which were highly littered and in need of a higher volume of volunteers.

Keep Akron Beautiful was able to be on site with their two community improvement trailers to man the volunteers with the tools they would need to get the job done: gloves, rakes, litter grabbers and Glad trash bags, as well as recycling bags. Thanks to a grant funding from the Ohio EPA, volunteers also had waders, large water skimming rakes, and floating trashcans to collect the trash and to ensure the safety of volunteers as they embarked to collect litter from the lake.

Safety was one of the top concerns during the planning process of the clean-up. The Akron Police Department were on site to assist with the disposal of portable meth labs, needles and other hazardous materials found during the cleanup. City Sanitation supported the clean-up efforts Saturday morning as well, and with the help of their Packard truck, the 5.71 tons of litter collected by volunteers was able to be quickly disposed of. An extra big "Thank You" to Anton, Larry and Kent for their hard work loading railroad ties, 9 foot branches and all the concrete blocks that were pulled from the water. (See photo at right)







The Free Store is always in need of household items such as toasters, dishes, pots & pans, utensils, towels, sheets & blankets.






