Nazareth Housing Offers Lead Paint Removal by Nanci Self

Kenmore residents can take advantage of a special grant funded program and receive free work on our homes. The program may be able to replace windows, siding and other parts of the home that contain hazardous lead paint, if the home was built before 1978.

This free program is a partnership between Nazareth Housing Development Corporation and the City of Akron. The program is designed to make your home safe from hazardous lead paint. Nazareth Housing has improved many homes in Kenmore after being founded, in part, by Immaculate Conception Catholic Church.

Children under the age of 6 are most at risk of developmental problems and often experience future health problems from lead paint exposure. A child under 6 must visit or live in the home. Tenants may also qualify for this program.



You must have current homeowner's insurance and be current on your mortgage and property taxes or in a pre-payment plan. Landlords get a 3 to 1 match on the dollars they put into the home.

To see if your home qualifies, call Nazareth Housing soon, as clients should be enrolled by Summer 2018. Phone 330-374-1526 or email projects@nazarethhousing.org.



Better Block Brings a New Song to Kenmore Boulevard

"The night Kenmore Boulevard came back to life."

That's how lifelong Kenmore resident and Mr. Pink guitarist Dan Brewer referred to September 1st, the first night of Kenmore Better Block. The event's goal: help residents and the community at large to re-imagine what Kenmore Boulevard could be with active storefronts, family-friendly food, and entertainment.

The two-day event held over Labor Day weekend was organized by the Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance and brought thousands of people to Kenmore Boulevard. Among the pop-up retailers were Custom Audio Mutation, owned by Kenmore resident Curran Murphy, Buckeye Clothing Company, the brainchild of Kenmore resident Caleb Aronhalt, and Calhoun Recordshop, fronted by local DJ Forrest Webb.

Webb, who once operated a record store in New York City, sold current, vintage and rare vinyl records from his pop-up location at 1008 Kenmore Boulevard. "I never expected to sell this many records in Kenmore," Webb said. "It was a good weekend."

Mainstay Kenmore Boulevard businesses like Kenmore Komics & Games had their strongest sales in memory. Owner John Buntin extended his comic book displays to the sidewalk using birch plywood shelving cut and built by Kenmore Better Block volunteers.

In all, more than 60 community volunteers made the event possible. They did everything from landscape the boulevard median, paint stencils in extended sidewalk areas, and cut and assemble CNC-routed plywood furniture referred to as Wikiblock designs. Having relocated from Kenmore to Highland Square in 2016, John and Fran Thoricht volunteered to stencil the street and collect feedback at the event. The couple has since purchased a house and moved back to Kenmore.

Jacob and Alicia Ley volunteered to build Wikiblock furniture along with their 6- & 9-year-old sons and other members of their Kenmore Chapel Neighborhood Missional Community.

"I loved building the furniture with other people in our community and felt excited and proud when I saw people using it to eat and talk during Better Block," said 9-year-old Isaiah Ley. "I wish it was still out to use." One of the highlights of the event was the appearance of buskers, or street performers, who played acoustic music outside the Eastern Sports Bar and Kenmore Flash Wireless. Acts included Kenmore/Summit Lake resident Cory Grinder and former Kenmore resident Jonathon James Smith.

Goodwin Photography) Other performances included Rachel Brown and the Beatnik Playboys, who were joined by Kenmore resident Jim Ballard on the Jilly's Music Room stage performing the song he wrote and produced specifically for Kenmore Better Block, "Bones of the Boulevard." National touring act The Living Deads, who record their albums at Studio 1008, attracted a large crowd of fans to the event on Friday night, many of whom enjoyed their performance from an adjacent beer garden.

Residents Ryan Boyes and Matt Zeiner led an all-volunteer effort to build the 500-squarefoot beer garden in the vacant space between Kenmore Komics & Games and the former McCutcheon Building. It was constructed entirely of plywood and pallets, flanked in front by iron gates and enhanced by lights strung across the two adjacent buildings.

Jason Segedy, director of planning and urban development for the city of Akron, attended the event and was impressed with the creative reactivation of that space.

"The most exciting thing about the Kenmore Better Block was the way that it drew people out onto the boulevard," Segedy said. "At the Beer Garden, I had the opportunity to meet a lot of new people - many of whom were from the neighborhood, and many of whom were from outside of Kenmore, and had not been to Kenmore Boulevard for some time. This is exactly the type of thing that the City of Akron is interested in catalyzing in the business district," he said.

Food trucks lined the north block of Kenmore Boulevard between 15th and 16th Streets including Flamingo Jack's and King Bubba's II Barbeque, which sold smoked meat dishes prepared atop the repurposed rear end of a classic car. Three other food and beverage vendors were represented at the Alto Coffee Company pop-up at 998 Kenmore Boulevard - Pav's Frozen Custard, Summit Croissants (owned by Kenmore resident Sally Ohle), and Akron Coffee Roasters.

The coffee shop was the creation of Kenmore residents Jeremy and Helaina DePace, who said they have dreamed of starting a coffee shop on Kenmore Boulevard for years. "We knew this was the perfect way to introduce our idea to the community. The response from everyone was overwhelmingly positive," Jeremy said. "We'll be working on the details for a permanent location for Alto Coffee Company in the near future."


While the DePaces have always had a heart for Kenmore, Stray Dog Carts owner Charly Murphy was not as familiar with the neighborhood's assets. He said the Better Block experience changed his perception of the community. "Kenmore Better Block was wonderful," he said. "Actually, it affected my view of Kenmore in a very positive way."

Jamie Fuller, a longtime Kenmore resident now living in Green, attended the event Friday night with her husband and children. She said it literally brought her to tears. "When we got out of our van and saw all that was happening, my first thought was, 'Life!'" she said. "I saw it in people's faces, heard it in the music filling the air, and smelled it in the food trucks and coffee shop. A community that has been depressed had life breathed into it by people with a mission to love and not settle for the status quo. It filled my heart with joy and hope for the future of Kenmore."

A number of key sponsors made the event possible, including the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, which funded the materials and planning work of Team Better Block. Other sponsors included Evolve Creative Group, 427 Design, City of Akron and the Cargill Salt Fund, Jilly's Music Room, Keep Akron Beautiful, Lowes, Summit County Public Health, Francesca Thoricht, the Hoppe Family, an anonymous fund of Akron Community Foundation, Kenmore Chamber of Commerce, the Summit County Land Bank, and a variety of individual and small business sponsors. Team Better Block helped to create the temporary street plans for the ground volunteers to execute. Its founder Jason Roberts pioneered the Better Block concept in his Dallas, Texas neighborhood of Oak Cliff in 2010. Since then, the concept has helped more than 100 neighborhoods reshape and reactivate their built environment. The Kenmore Better Block was the third such event in Akron.

"Kenmore Better Block was one of the most ambitious projects we've ever collaborated on with a community. It exceeded my expectations, largely because of the heart that the community put into it," Roberts said. "So many areas are missing a soul. This effort was just trying to create space for the soul hidden inside the buildings to manifest onto the street. It was so rewarding to walk up and down the block and hear people say things like, 'This is how it used to be,' and 'We can't stop now.'"

Thanks to the success of the Better Block event, the Knight Foundation announced a two-year, \$240,000 grant to help Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance further execute on branding, place-making, beautification and economic development aspects of Better Block. Jeff Vujevich, the Alliance's president, said the group will first hire an executive director to lead the organization full time, in addition to putting on more pop-up style events and continuing to beautify Kenmore Boulevard. "In any conversation I've had with the city, Kenmore is the neighborhood that consistently comes up in conversation," he said. "We are in a great position, and this funding will help us execute and keep the momentum going."




Kenmore Historical Society News


The Kenmore Historical Society was founded in 2001. Our logo, designed by member Ken Dague, shows important symbols from Kenmore's past.

The first is a canal boat.



The canal system was routed through our area because of its location near key rivers. The water from Summit Lake was used to fill the canal. If you were traveling far or shipping goods, the canal boat on the Ohio & Erie Canal was the main transportation.

In June of 1900, Mr. M. C. Heminger was hired as Secretary-Manager of the Akron Realty Company (developer of the Kenmore Allotment). He moved his family from Clinton, Ohio, to the new allotment of Kenmore. Their household furnishings arrived by canal boat and were taken by a wagon and four horses to their new home at Ohio Avenue (now 12th Street) and Kenmore Boulevard. They were the first family to move in and live on Kenmore Boulevard. Heminger School was named after him.




The next item in our logo is a streetcar (also called a trolley).

Streetcars ran on a double track down the middle of Kenmore Boulevard connecting Akron and Barberton. Many people rode them to and from work or shopping in downtown Akron. The Northern Ohio Traction & Light Company had 300 miles of track.

For the last time on Sunday, March 23rd, 1947, a procession of three streetcars traveled slowly from the Kenmore car barns to downtown Akron and back to Stop 97, the loop at Kenmore Boulevard and East Avenue.

A salt derrick is the next item depicted in our logo.



Colonial Salt (now Cargill) opened in 1901 in Halo. It is now one of the oldest businesses in Kenmore. Set on five acres of land with five salt wells in operation to supply fourteen grainer pans and a double-effect vacuum pan, the plant employed between 200 and 225 employees. With each of the wells drilled to a depth of approximately 3,000 feet, brine was pumped by means of compressed air into settling tanks above ground that had a capacity of one million gallons. In the tanks, the brine was treated, purified and whitened.

The last item in our logo is our old City Hall.

Kenmore was incorporated as a village in 1908. City Hall was built in 1916 on the northeast corner of Kenmore Boulevard and Illinois Avenue (now 14th Street). Our present library is there now.

In the early years city hall housed our government, police station, jail, fire department, Board of Election, Family Service Society, Kenmore Water Works, Kenmore A Charities, Kenmore S & L Co., a barber shop and a jeweler.

After Kenmore was annexed to Akron in 1929 the old city hall became the Kenmore district community and welfare center. The old council chamber became a branch library. Some of us can also remember the City Health Department, well-baby clinic, First National Bank, Dr. Woods, florist, shoe shiner, barber, beauty shop, and the Kenmore Senior Citizens Center being in the building when we grew up. City Hall was demolished in 1974.

First Glance News - "Leaving a Legacy"

Leaving a legacy is an important idea that means something different to everyone, but to a group of former Kenmore High School alumni, it means investing their time and money back into the community they came from. "We owe so much (to Kenmore), this is where we got our start" said Jim Creed, 1967 graduate of KHS. Jim, alongside a group of close friends & fellow graduates, recently started the "Leave Your Year" campaign designed to encourage KHS alumni to donate their graduating year in a dollar amount (i.e. 1967 - \$67) to First Glance Student Center in Kenmore as part of the non-profit's continued work in the community.

First Glance has been on Kenmore Boulevard for over 17 years, empowering the youth of Kenmore and surrounding communities through almost a dozen different programs. With memories of playing sports at KHS, parades down Kenmore Boulevard, and an overall "family atmosphere", Duane Rector, also a 1967 graduate of KHS & advocate for "Leave Your Year", describes the campaign as giving "everyone a chance to do something good for the community." One of the core values of First Glance is "Becoming Family" and the volunteers work hard to foster that atmosphere, based on a strong belief in the power of positive relationships.

The specific goal of "Leave Your Year" in addition to raising awareness is to raise \$100k for First Glance and the campaign has already seen incredibly positive momentum. "It's a debt that we owe to Kenmore" said Creed. "Leave Your Year is a rallying point for those of us that have benefited from what Kenmore gave us and it can bring us all together again." The respective ideas of leaving a legacy and rallying people together have been accomplished so far, as is evidenced by 3 different generations of one local family that have each given toward the campaign.

Why was First Glance chosen as the vehicle for KHS alumni who want to leave a legacy in Kenmore? According to Dan Auker, a 1967 graduate of KHS, "Kenmore has gone through some rough times. First Glance is making a tremendous effort to bring the Kenmore spirit back, to bring the community back to the closeness and concern it had when we grew up." Auker credits his experiences in the Kenmore community as playing a pivotal role in his life. "Growing up in Kenmore when we did shaped us and helped us to reach whatever level of success we did. We feel a need to give back, even some of us that don't live in Kenmore anymore."
