Summit Lake Clean-Up

On April 21st, volunteers from all over the Akron area joined together to participate in a large-scale cleanup at Summit Lake. Over 300 volunteers helped collect 3.74 tons of litter, as well as 20 tires in just 3 hours. Families, groups of friends, neighbors and community groups like Mr. Dunbar's honors class from The University of Akron's William's Honors College joined the cleanup effort on Saturday. We had great support from the City of Akron with their sanitation crew working "overtime" to gather the collected trash, through Keep Akron Beautiful trailers and sign up support, and the Ohio Erie Canal Coalition. We covered the entire lake, with volunteers working in their assigned zones and making sure each area was litter free.

The cleanup is one of the largest projects that takes place during Keep Akron Beautiful Clean Up Akron Month. With the help of Ohio Erie Canal Way Coalition, Keep Akron Beautiful, and many Kenmore residents, a plan was created to effectively distribute volunteers around the entirety of the lake, identifying zones which were highly littered and in need of a higher volume of volunteers.

Keep Akron Beautiful were able to be on site with their two community improvement trailers to man the volunteers with the tools they would need to get the job done: gloves, rakes, litter grabbers and GLAD trash bags, as well as recycling bags.

Safety was one of the top concerns during the planning process of the cleanup. The Akron Police Department were on site biking around the lake to assist with the disposal of portable meth labs, needles and other hazardous materials found during the cleanup. Akron City Sanitation supported the cleanup efforts Saturday morning as well, taking the 3.74 tons of litter collected by all the volunteers. An extra big thank you to the City of Akron Sanitation crew for their hard work loading railroad ties, 9-foot branches and all the trash that was pulled from the water.

Volunteers were provided breakfast and lunch thanks to the generous support of our local sponsors: Jubilee Donuts (2126 S. Main Street), Reeves Cake Shop (2770 Corey Avenue), the Ohio Erie Canal Way Coalition, and the Kiwanis Club of Kenmore.

"Great Streets" - Kenmore Boulevard Gets Boost in Form of Protective Zoning, Fresh Pavement, and New Community Center Roof

Kenmore Boulevard is one of ten neighborhood business districts the City of Akron is targeting for its new "Great Streets" initiative, designed to support commercial and social revitalization in neighborhoods across the city. Mayor Dan Horrigan is pleased to highlight some early, key investments in one of these Great Streets—Kenmore Boulevard. In the coming months, the City will be seeking to resurface Kenmore Boulevard, install a new roof at the Kenmore Community Center, and enact special zoning to preserve its urban character.

"Through Great Streets, we will be making strategic, impactful, long-term investments in our neighborhood business districts and better focusing our current community and financial capital to generate greater impact," said James Hardy, Deputy Mayor for Integrated Development.

Last month, the City announced plans to repave and remodel Kenmore Boulevard, using community input, as part of the City's extensive Issue 4-funded resurfacing program. City Council will consider legislation to authorize a new roof for the Kenmore Community Center, replacing the original roof installed in 1988. Finally, this month, the City is presenting City Council with a plan to establish form-based zoning along Kenmore Boulevard to preserve and enhance its urban character.

"As we work with our community partners to breathe new life into Kenmore Boulevard and our other Great Streets, we must preserve the valuable urban form of these historic corridors," Jason Segedy, Director of Planning and Urban Development said.

Current business development guidelines in the City's Zoning Code, developed in the 1960s, require new development to have a "suburban" feel with an over-abundance of street-facing parking and buildings set far back from the sidewalk. While this style of development is well-suited to some areas of Akron, it is incompatible with the design of older, urban neighborhood districts, like Kenmore.

"Kenmore Boulevard is a great, historic business district and probably the most intact in the city," Segedy continued. "Business districts like this were largely developed in the early 20th Century, with buildings right along the street front. These neighborhood business districts originally thrived on local, pedestrian traffic—and while retail habits have evolved, we are seeing a return to community-based economic and social activity that is stimulating the revitalization of these corridors."

The proposed zoning designation will require any new construction or renovation in the corridor to match this historic form. Kenmore Boulevard will be the first of hopefully many Great Streets in the city to receive this unique zoning designation. A public hearing on the proposal will be held before the Planning Commission of City Council on May 14th.

Financial Empowerment Center Comes to Kenmore

The Kenmore community has a proud history and identity shaped by its solid working class citizenry. Economic changes over the past 40 years have hit Kenmore hard, but its residents are resilient, and they continue to work together to grow and improve their community in the face of new challenges and opportunities.

In January, the Financial Empowerment Center (FEC) – created through a partnership between the City of Akron and United Way – opened in the heart of Kenmore. Since then, United Way VITA volunteers have helped local residents prepare over 600 income tax returns, at no cost. More than \$700,000 in federal refunds have been distributed back to the Kenmore and Akron communities.

Beginning this month, the FEC will offer personalized financial coaching year-round. These valuable services are offered free of charge to anyone in the greater Akron/Summit County area. Empowerment services focus on increased savings and asset building, safe banking access, debt reduction, and credit score improvement.

As a lifelong Kenmore resident and KHS graduate, I am delighted to have these services available and grateful for the opportunity to give back to our community as one of United Way's full-time financial coaches at the FEC.

As its Bold Goal 3, United Way has committed to financially empowering 11,000 individuals by 2025. Due to its demographics, central location and accessibility, Kenmore is the front line for these financial empowerment efforts.

Recent United Way research has shined a light on the number of local residents earning incomes above the Federal Poverty Level, but below the basic cost of living. These ALICE (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed) families make up 40 percent of Ohio households and 50 percent of Akron and Barberton households.

These hardworking families – including the working class families that have given Kenmore its identity - are the economic heart of our city. The success of Akron and Kenmore depends on their financial wellbeing.



Councilman's Corner

A reduction in Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) in sewers necessary to prevent harmful overflows

The City of Akron is asking its residents and businesses to follow simple steps to help prevent costly and unhealthy sewer overflows. Grease is a major cause of sewer line blockages. When a blockage occurs, it can result in sewer backups and overflows into local waterways. During a time when the City is heavily investing in its sewer infrastructure, FOG control is vital to maintain the proper operation of wastewater collection and treatment systems.

Currently, the Water Reclamation Facility is experiencing problems due to illegal mass dumping of FOG into the sewer system. The large volume of FOG appearing at the wastewater plant indicates these amounts are likely from professional grease haulers and not from individual restaurants. Residents can assist in identifying those responsible for the illegal dumping by reporting unusual activity, for instance a tanker truck in a remote area or parked over a manhole, by calling 311 or visiting akronohio.gov/311.

Beyond reporting illegal dumping, there are protocols that Akron area businesses and residents can follow to further alleviate sewer blockages. As a directive of the US EPA Consent Decree, the City has developed and implemented a FOG control program, specifically for Food Service Establishments (FSEs). A brochure on the FOG program for FSEs can be found on akronwaterwaysrenewed.com. To help enforce this necessary program, the City has entered into an agreement with Summit County Public Health to coordinate inspections of FSEs suspected of violating the FOG control requirements.

Residential households can also do their part to keep sewers clear. Individuals can take a few simple steps, such as:





Second Annual Portage 'n Paddle Canoe Competition

Akron is once again offering a new and unique, one-of-a-kind special sporting and cultural event that no other city in the world can claim:

It's the Akron Portage 'n Paddle!

Celebrating Akron's 8-mile, 3-mile and 1-mile expanses of Native American holy ground between the U.S. continent's two river systems, the Portage 'n Paddle canoe race is once again being held on May 19th featuring canoes and kayaks in and out of the water racing through Akron's urban lakes, canals, downtown streets and recreation trails along the Ohio & Erie Canal.

At the endpoint of the competition where participants are laying down their canoes or kayaks at the finish line after portaging, is the new prehistoric canoe encampment. Located at the new Trailhead Events Center of Cascade Lofts at North and Howard streets, the encampment will feature a dugout canoe, wigwam, firepit and canoe stand. A formal dedication will be made at the site on May 19th as part of the Akron Portage 'n Paddle awards ceremony.

Akronites have always taken pride in the Portage Path. Signage and sculptures touting its virtues are found everywhere in city parks. Even some of Akron's roads, schools and organizations are named after it. The Portage Path legend, focusing on the sacred ground between America's two major waterways, the Tuscawaras (Tusc) flowing south to the Gulf of Mexico and the Little Cuyahoga flowing north to Lake Erie, is now coming alive with a brand new endurance race and community festival heralding the sacred ground.

The Akron Portage 'n Paddle canoe race will first take place on the water with paddling from Nesmith Lake to Summit Lake to downtown's Lock 1 near the Spaghetti Warehouse. Competitors will then leave the water, carrying their boats up a stair step dock along the towpath to Lock 3, along the Innerbelt/Highway 59 then on to the new Cascade Valley Lofts and Mustill Store.


