

Public Comments Continue During Covid

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Akron City Council continues to hold virtual meetings, which are livestreamed on Council's YouTube channel. To ensure open access and opportunity for public engagement, Akron City Council has established a voicemail line where members of the public wishing to participate in the public comment period may leave a voice recording. The voicemail is accessible by dialing 330-375-2566.

In accordance with longstanding Council Rules, speakers are provided three minutes to address Council. Remarks should be kept respectful and germane to Council business. Any remarks containing profanity or breaching decorum will not be transmitted during the public comment period. The previous public comment email was retired effective Monday, February 8th, 2021.

We want to hear from our residents about the issues that matter to them and how Council can best serve their needs. Traditionally, members of the public would come to Council meetings on Monday nights and share their comments in person. Since that is not possible during this pandemic, the voicemail option is the best alternative. This gives residents an opportunity to still speak to Council in their own voice. Exercise Classes are in Full Swing at Kenmore Community This Summer

Exercise classes are better than ever at Kenmore Community Center. Exercise classes were one of the first programs that were brought back when the community center reopened (after being closed due to Covid-19) on September 21st, 2020. Exercise in its nature is socially-distanced and the community center staff have been doing an impeccable job of disinfecting the center, restrooms and any equipment that has been used by its patrons in order to keep everyone safe and healthy. We are finding that everyone is so excited to just get out of the house and see people again that they are coming to exercise not only to move and feel better, but to socialize as well (safely, of course). It was decided to unofficially call our morning 1 mile walk, "Walkers and Talkers", because they do both equally as well! Our Mind, Body & Balance (Qigong) class just resumed a couple weeks ago and more & more people are feeling confident to come back to exercise. All classes require participants to call ahead to the community center at 330-375-2812 to reserve your spot (no more than 10), wear a mask, have temperatures checked and hands sanitized upon arrival. Remote Learning Advice from a KGHS Grad

Got the "remote learning" blues? You're not alone. Akron Promise has had limited access to KGHS students, due to the unprecedented pandemic we are currently experiencing. Of the three programs they run at KGHS, only the Student Success Team has been affected. There is still an ACT Boot Camp available online and there are still scholarships to award. Akron Promise is still able to check in with scholarship students at Stark State College, and a few supported at the University of Akron. One such scholar, Leah Stanevich, received ACT support from Akron Promise, which helped her earn the Innovation Generation Scholarship, full tuition at The University of Akron.

Like many others, Leah has been struggling with remote learning. The UA junior is a Geology major, which means many of her classes are labs. Watching experiments online just isn't the same, and far from ideal. She felt a loss of community and disconnected from professors and peers. Certainly this sounds familiar to any student in today's pandemic world. Even with the advantage of less commute time and more sleep, Leah hasn't completely made peace with online learning. However, over the last few months, she's learned a few ways to be more successful in her classes.

The first change Leah made was to decide to just "keep pushing forward". While it's easy to get caught up in the difficulty of staring at a computer, Leah has been able to shift her focus from the difficult to the doable. Remembering that this pandemic is temporary can help lessen the challenge of this mindset.





Leah also recommends staying connected as much as possible. She works with her peers by texting, calling and meeting online. Feeling alone is pretty common for remote learners. Everyone benefits with more interactions, whether it's discussing assignments or just reaching out and checking in with others. Leah highly recommends a support system of friends, family, teachers, and peers.

School administrators often recommend a dedicated study space and Leah would agree. She thinks this has definitely worked to her advantage. United Way's Financial Empowerment Center is Offering Free Drive Through and Virtual Tax Preparation

United Way of Summit & Medina County is now in our fourth year of operating the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program at the Financial Empowerment Center. While the pandemic has created challenges for our program, it has also given us the opportunity to develop creative ways to operate.

If you've driven by the Financial Empowerment Center recently, you may have noticed more cars coming in and out of our parking lot off 17th Street and Kenmore Boulevard. The increase in traffic is a result of the "Drive Through" tax appointments we are now offering through the VITA program. Drive Through tax appointments allow you to make an appointment to bring your tax documents to the Financial Empowerment Center and wait in your vehicle while IRS certified tax preparers complete your return. This is just one of the ways we have modified our program to continue to safely offer free tax preparation services to eligible Summit County residents.

In addition to our Drive Through tax appointments, we also offer a completely remote option for tax preparation. This "Virtual VITA" method allows individuals to use their cell phone to upload their tax documents through a secure portal and schedule a time to talk to a certified tax preparer about their return. Our tax preparers can typically complete the return within the week, and the individual is able to review it electronically before we e-file it with the IRS. By offering a variety of tax preparation options, we hope to make tax time less stressful for working Summit County residents. Our tax services are targeted to individuals with a household income under \$60,000, but any Summit County resident who needs help navigating their finances can always access our free financial coaching services. 




Kenmore Historical Society News

Forever a Cardinal!

The first school in our community that was named Kenmore opened in 1903 on Virginia Avenue (now called 11th Street). All grades were taught in that school. The name of that school was later changed to Central School and eventually Heminger School. (Photo to the right).







In 1917 the high school students moved to attend a new school built on 13th Street (Photo to the left). An addition was added in the 50's that included a new auditorium, cafeteria, and gymnasium. Some offices and classrooms were also added. Those additions are still in use. Then in 1981, after demolishing the older part of the school, a new addition was dedicated (Photo below).

These wooden collectibles, along with several others, are available for purchase from the Kenmore Historical Society. Our address is P.O.Box 3707, Akron, OH 44314. Our website is www.kenmorehistorical.org. Our collectibles can also be purchased at Kenmore Komics & Games on the Boulevard.

Red and Black were chosen to be our school colors, and Pride in Achievement became our School Motto. The Cardinal was selected as our mascot. In the 60's, a student named Calvin Bloom created a new version of our mascot. It was called the Fighting Cardinal and was later nicknamed Tuffy.



Even though the school mascot is no longer the Cardinal, we members of this community will always be Kenmore Cardinals!




Kenmore Prayer Garden
