Kim Jacobs Cancer Resource Center Opens on Kenmore Boulevard

Lavar Jacobs made a promise to himself and on May 1st that promise came true, he opened the **Kim Jacobs Cancer Resource Center** at 946 Kenmore Boulevard. The **Kim Jacobs Cancer Resource Center** is the seventh business to open on Kenmore Boulevard during the pandemic.

During the May 1st Grand Opening, Lavar welcomed many visitors and supporters, including Akron Deputy Mayor Marco Somerville. The cancer center will serve as a support for women who are undergoing treatment for breast cancer. Some of the amenities include a food pantry, massage therapy, and hair styling. There is also a daycare.

"After my mother passed away I would go to the cancer walks, but I thought to myselfI could do more" says Lavar. So instead of going to an already established breast cancer nonprofit, he decided to start his own, and so Lavar, with a background in marketing and business savvy, found that the transition was seamless. After going through the proper steps to become a 501(c)(3), Not Just October became a certified nonprofit in Ohio in 2014.

Lavar struggled for the first couple of years getting the word out. That all changed when his publicist Aryel Bell of **The Prime Media Group** was able to get national attention by booking him a guest spot on the Steve Harvey Show. After appearing on the show, word quickly spread about **Not Just October**. Lavar also struggled financially in the early years, sometimes having to go in his own pockets to make sure women fighting breast cancer had what they needed.

"I have a really big heart when it comes to this and I will give them my last...I will make sure things are getting taken care of for these women" says Lavar.

Not Just October will be the premiere breast cancer organization in the whole United States!

Just a Dad From Akron Finds Home on the Boulevard

Growing up in Kenmore, Kenny Lambert knew the building at 937 Kenmore Boulevard well. Last year, he noticed the for rent sign on the window and typed the realtor's number into his phone. The contact saved itself as "New Home". "The words just appeared," Kenny said. It was a sign.

On March 6th, Kenny, along with Akron Mayor Dan Horrigan, cut the ribbon on **Just a Dad from Akron**, Kenny's apparel company with a purpose, which is to help youth in the city who are struggling, and to create mentoring relationships that model a healthy family, for all families throughout the area. **Just a Dad From Akron** became the fifth new business to open on Kenmore Boulevard in less than a year.

While speaking to more than 100 supporters, Kenny said some people encouraged him to put his new business elsewhere. But to Kenny, there was no question. "This is where I grew up," he said. "I want to help the families here to have a better environment to raise their children in."

And as a true Kenmore resident, Kenny walks the talk. He and his daughter live in an apartment above the shop, and the proceeds from his apparel sales go right back into the neighborhood. Products range in price from \$10 to \$40. Shirts, hoodies, and windbreakers include positive messages that promote youth and female empowerment, sobriety and mental health awareness.

And if he's not in the shop, Kenny is often sitting outside either talking to a neighbor or waiting for the next person he can encourage.

Councilman's Corner

The Spring Phenomenon

Spring brings us out of our houses and into the wide open spaces of our neighborhood. The need to be reminded of the "good neighbor rules" applies to all of us. I therefore submit to you, as a reminder, a few of the "good neighbor rules" from the City of Akron Code of Ordinances.

GRASS AND WEEDS

Grasses and weeds may not exceed eight (8) inches in height.

The City, as a last resort, will cut private property grass after proper notification has been given to the owner. When this is done the property owner is assessed for the cost of the cutting and a \$200 administrative fee for each cutting process. These costs vary depending on the size of the lot.

If you file a complaint with the City of Akron regarding high grass, from the time your complaint is received to when the grass is actually cut can vary from 10 days (if the owner complies) to upwards of 21 days or more when there is no compliance. The weather and the volume of complaints are a significant factor in this process. Finally, the City of Akron is under no obligation to cut high grass/weeds on private property and is the contractor of last resort.

PARKING ON LAWNS

Akron City Council passed legislation in 2012 authorizing the Department of Neighborhood Assistance to issue citations for violation of A.C.O. §76.31 parking on front lawns. The fine shall be \$50.00 for the first infraction and \$100.00 for each subsequent infraction.

TRASH COMPLAINTS

The City of Akron pursuant to §§95.06 - 95.14 allows for its authorized employees to inspect properties for litter. Litter can include, but isn't limited to, trash, tree debris, furniture designed for indoor use that is stored in any outdoor area susceptible to moisture from inclement weather, infestation by insect, rodent, or other pest, household debris, building debris (including construction and demolition debris), appliances, tires, carpeting, etc.

The Department of Neighborhood Assistance will serve an Order to Comply to the owner, lessee, occupant, agent, tenant, or other person in charge of the premises. It will be posted, whenever possible, and mailed to both owner and occupants. The owner will have seven (7) days to remedy the nuisance.

If the nuisance is not remedied, the City of Akron will have a contractor remove the items in question. The property owner will be charged for all costs associated with the clean-up plus an Administrative fee of \$200.

RODENT PROBLEMS

All rodent problems should be directed to the Summit County Health Department at 330-375- 2405 or they can be reached at www.co.summit.oh.us.

Ward 9 Councilman's Meetings

Councilman Freeman holds a public meeting on the first Tuesday of every month at the Kenmore Community Center, starting at 7:00 pm.

Until further notice, the Ward 9 Councilman's Meetings are cancelled until such a time as it is considered safe to hold a public meeting!

YARD/GARAGE SALES

A permit is not required for garage sales. Each address is limited to three (3) garage sales per calendar year. Each garage sale may not last for more than three (3) consecutive days.

Any of these offenses can be reported to the City of Akron by calling 3-1-1 or 330-375-2311.



Akron Promise's Student Success Team Steers Kenmore-Garfield Students Towards Bright Outcomes

"No significant learning occurs without a significant relationship."

--Dr. James Comey, Child Psychiatrist and Education Specialist, Yale University

Dr. James Comey's simple, declarative sentence - delivered during a 1995 lecture = speaks mountains of truth in K-12 education, where often a strong connection with an adult will inspire students of opportunity to succeed after high school and into adulthood. For Stephanie Martin, a Nursing and Patient Care instructor at Kenmore-Garfield High School, Comey's words hit home over the course of a discussion with Tom Ghinder, Founder of Akron Promise, an educational non-profit launched in 2015. In 2017, Akron Promise established a direct working relationship with Kenmore-Garfield High School, and two years later the non-profit announced the Kenmore-Garfield Stark State Scholarship.

The Student Success Team

Since the implementation of its scholarship program, Akron Promise also inaugurated the Student Success Team (SST), a mentoring group available to assist the entirety of Kenmore-Garfield's 786 students. Staffed by Mike DiFalco, the school's Academic Achievement Coordinator, and Margaret Tulay, an Education major at the University of Akron, the crew welcomed Akron Promise's new Executive Director Dr. Jeanne-Hélène (Néna) Roy last week; since the SST's inception Ghinder served as the group's third member.

On bi-monthly SST meeting days, learners arrive with their APS-issued Chromebooks in tow, ready to participate in goal-setting activities while relishing sandwiches provided by the team. Skills taught range from time-management to ACT prep and résumé-writing. Seniors learn to complete FAFSA forms as well as to compose college application essays and apply for jobs. The SST continues to monitor seniors after graduation as they segue into the workforce and/or enroll in college programs.

Flexibility: Celebrating the Individual

Ghinder attributes the program's success to its underlying flexibility. Rather than approach mentoring with a one-size-fits-all mindset, the SST practices a version of "radical hospitality," which in this context entails meeting students where they are to address their own expressed needs.

By considering each student's unique circumstances and goals, the SST not only provides directional assistance to learners, but also cultivates qualities that can't be found in a manual: respect and empathy. When met with direct eye contact and supportive words, humans tend to respond in kind. Part of the SST's philosophy, then, is to transcend mentoring models that adhere to a rigid structure, as well as to bring a "human touch" into the equation.

It Takes a Village

We all know that nobody can brave it alone in the world, and this aphorism certainly holds true in the case of the SST's efforts. Without the help of invited guest speakers who periodically hold lunchtime Q&A sessions and parents/community members who assist in transporting students to field-trip destinations, the SST wouldn't be able to extend as many options for enrichment as it does to learners. The relationships Kenmore-Garfield students form with engaged adults in their midst are ultimately bonds for life, bonds passed down from one generation to the next.

Kenmore Historical Society News

Kenmore Boulevard Historic District

Have you ever wondered what kind of businesses were in our historic district in the early days?

The photo to the right shows the Kenmore Business Section about 1914. The camera was near the NW corner of Kenmore Boulevard and Minnesota Avenue (now 17th Street). The building with an awning, at Wisconsin Avenue (16th Street) was the Thomas Griffith Store and was later torn down. The next building at Michigan Avenue (15th Street) was, at one time, Allen & Schlegel Store, later John's Grocery. The dark building near the right-hand margin was Central School (later Heminger Elementary). Shown below is a small section of four of these buildings listing what they were and what they are today.





More Pandemic Relief is Here

This has been quite a difficult year for so many, but there is help available from Summit County for those who have suffered financially due to the COVID-19 pandemic. If you are behind on your rent, mortgage or utilities, Summit County Cares can help. This is a partnership of local government and community organizations. The county created a similar program last year but this current program opened in March of 2021 and will continue on more of an ongoing basis, and is not designed to be a first come, first serve program. Payments for rent and utilities will be made directly to the landlord and utility company and may cover past due balances for up to 12 months beginning in March of 2020 as long as Summit County Cares assistance has not been received previously for the same time period.

You may apply for assistance with past due balances for your primary residence for rent or mortgage as well as electric, gas, water, sewer, trash and internet services.

QUALIFICATION CRITERIA

- Resident of Summit County
- Member of a household that has been financially impacted by COVID-19
- Gross income at or below 80% of the Area Median Income Guidelines

Priority will be given to households that are or below 30% of AMI, households with pregnant women, households with occupants over the age of 62, and households with a court eviction notice. This program is not designed to be a first-come, first-serve program.

The application process will take 10 to 15 minutes. It is important that applicants gather household income, landlord, and utility information, including account numbers PRIOR to starting the application online at www.SummitCountyCares.org or calling 2-1-1 to apply.


