Meet the Chief, March 1st

MARCH WARD MEETING - On Tuesday, March 1st we will have an opportunity to meet Chief Stephen Mylett, our new Akron Police Chief. The meeting will be at 7:00 pm at the Kenmore Community Center, 880 Kenmore Boulevard. Coffee will be provided. One of our topics will be gun violence.

ARPA - As a result of the financial devastation that COVID has had on cities across the country, the federal government has created the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). In Akron the major issues that will be addressed with these dollars are housing, public utilities, small business assistance, violence prevention, IT broadband, and parks and public spaces. The city is developing and fielding specific plans to fall within those six buckets. All ARPA funds must be allocated by the end of 2024 and spent by the end of 2026. Two public sessions have already been held informing citizens as to how the \$145 million dollars will affect Akron over the coming years. If you were not able to attend these virtual meetings, they can be seen on Akron City Council's YouTube channel.

SNOW - At this time we have already had 3 significant snow events. Please remember that all City snow plows have predetermined routes that they must follow. Main arteries and feeder streets will always receive attention before residential streets. Requests for service to our 3-1-1 line can be used to report your particular street. Please know however that 3-1-1 calls will not divert snowplows from their assigned routes.

Distribution of the meals was in the Goss Memorial Church parking lot. The temperature was in the low 20s by the end of the evening, so those who directed traffic or passed out dinners all night had to be warmed by layers of clothing and the gratitude of those who came for a meal.

As the sun went down, bringing even colder temperatures and darkness, we lost our foot traffic. But we still had about 50 meals left. So Kevin Burkholder, pastor at Goss Church, loaded up a box of meals and walked out to the bus stop on Kenmore Boulevard. And Jen, from his congregation, loaded up some meals in her van and drove to the Circle K and the Dollar Store to catch people as they left who could use a meal. All 600 meals were given out.

Our free dinner from the KMA churches is always the Tuesday before Thanksgiving. So mark your calendars and plan on enjoying a great meal next November!


"I'm ready to be done with this day." - Kenny Aronson

For Aronson and Poin—both the first college graduates in their respective families—the pathway to pursuing their dreams has been neither straightforward nor simple.

A native Akronite, Aronson was forced to assume many adult responsibilities at a young age due to his mother's severe medical condition. His household's lack of reliable transportation culminated in hours-long bus rides to and from Stark's downtown and North Canton campuses to attend classes. When Covid hit, Aronson's world turned upside-down and he had to drop out for a semester. Thanks to his pure grit and perseverance - as well as a ride-share program rolled out by Akron Promise - Aronson followed through in earning a culinary degree despite the ongoing exhaustion he experienced working late nights, attending to his mother, and completing assignments before waking up early to get to class on time. He expressed his desire that the day's tasks be over with so many times to Roy on mornings she fetched him to drive North Canton that the above-cited phrase became a laugh-out-loud joke between the two. Aronson was recently promoted in his current chef role and aspires to open his own restaurant after garnering management experience.

"I was so scared throughout the journey (from Myanmar to Malaysia) because I had to live in the jungle for three days...then I had to cross a river at midnight without light." – Mi-LyehPoin

Poin's journey to achievement is first a literal one spanning the distance traversed from her native Myanmar to a refugee camp in Malaysia to Akron. Given her family's daily struggle to procure food and lodging in her early years, the notion of her pursuing any education - let alone college studies - wasn't on the horizon. And yet, through diligence and determination, Poin, who knew no English when she began as a sophomore at Kenmore Garfield, graduated seventh in her class before starting her Stark degree in Early Childhood Education. Resolute to make a difference in young children's lives, Poin now attends the University of Akron, where she studies Child and Family Development. Upon completing her bachelor's degree, she hopes to earn a master's.



Akron Promise is grateful to have been afforded the opportunity to steward Aronson and Poin in their pursuit of leading fulfilling adult lives. Together as a community, we can all contribute towards ensuring that our city's youth flourish; together, we can make Akron shine!



The first Lawndale School is still standing, barely, on Wilbeth Road. It was named after the Lawndale Allotment, one of our neighborhoods when we were part of the Coventry Township District. It served kindergartners through 8th graders.

In 1912 a four-room brick school was built on 25th Street in the Village of Kenmore. Due to increases in enrollments, additions were added in 1916, 1922, and 1982.


A 100 year anniversary celebration took place on October 13th, 2012. The program included various speakers, student performances, displays, tours, crafts, and a DVD slide show.

The Akron School Board decided to close the school in 2016 due to a decline in enrollment, and the students were transferred to Sam Salem Community Learning Center.
