### Portrait of a Kenmore-Garfield High School Graduate: Dominic Black

On May 29th, the final graduating class of Kenmore-Garfield High School (KGHS) traversed the proverbial stage. Among the students experiencing this milestone, 17-year-old Dominic Black graced the crowd with his signature wit and style - including the elegant strand of pearls that he dons regularly - developed over the past four years. In August, Black will move to the Kent State University campus, where he will pursue an undergraduate degree in Interior Design.

If Black's academic prowess is evinced by his having made a noteworthy haul at KGHS's award ceremony, his lifelong record doesn't reflect steady success in school; rather, Black speaks of having struggled in his early years, mostly due to behavior issues he experienced while he and his mother bounced around northeast Ohio. By high school, however, Black learned to harness his intelligence and energy.

Perhaps the shift evolved as he discovered his passion for creating domestic spaces through watching home repair shows with his mother. Their collective inventiveness ignited, the two began to embark on their own projects, completely remodeling rooms in their home.

"Getting to use my creativity in my own house really helped me develop my passion for interior design," says Black.

As an upperclassman at KGHS, Black was able to further explore his interests as a product development intern at the luxury furniture retailer Arhaus, whose corporate headquarters is in Boston Heights. There, not only does Black assist in fulfilling customer swatch requests, but he also devised an innovative label printing system for orders, which had previously been sent out on hand-written envelopes.

A resident of Firestone Park, Black started his high school journey after Garfield and Kenmore High Schools had merged. Speaking positively of his four years attending KGHS, Black deems the institutions' union "a good thing that brought two communities together, putting them in a position to learn and embrace each other's differences." This vision for community-building carried over into his participation in Akron Promise's Student Success Team, where Black was instrumental in instilling a sense of solidarity in a group of diverse membership.

Black has traveled extensively throughout the East Coast, as well as in Ireland, the Dominican Republic, and Puerto Rico, the latter which he ranks high on his list of cool locales. Ultimately, he hopes to bring the multicultural lens to his work as a designer. Asked whom he'd primarily like to serve as a professional, Black underscored that while making a living enters into the equation, he's intent on not forgetting those who are less financially able, noting that "everyone should feel comfortable whom their living enters in their living enters."

### Scout Project Finds Home at American Legion Post #449

My name is Codey Mellinger, a recent Eagle Scout from Troop 74 located out of Firestone United Methodist Church. I have been in scouting since first grade as a Cub Scout and I am now a part of NYLT staff and Camp Manatoc Staff for the Great Trail Council.

My Eagle Project is a drop-off box for any American Flag that is worn out and tattered and in need of retirement. The drop-off box is made out of 14th gauge CRS (Cold-rolled steel) attached to a 6-foot 3-inch diameter steel pipe concreted into the ground. The purpose of the drop-off box is to give the community a place where they can take their American Flags to be given a proper retirement with honor and respect.

This was not my first choice but due to unforeseen circumstances my original idea fell through, so when it came to thinking of a new idea or where I could go to help out with an Eagle Project the idea was given to me to reach out to the American Legion close to me, Post #449, and of course, I did. The idea of a drop-off box for American Flags came about. I loved the idea for a few reasons, the biggest reason that kept me inspired about this project was the fact in my Scouting Unit, I often lead our Flag Retirement ceremonies as it is something I like to give the proper respect towards and I enjoy leading the other scouts through such a ceremony.

After the initial contact, quite a few exchanged emails and a couple of meetings, me and my dad started drawing and programming a blueprint idea, and with quite a few back and forths of ideas we figured it out. Went to the American Legion to get confirmation of the idea and they loved it. With that, we went to our scouting council to get the project approved, and without an issue, it was approved. I immediately started reaching out to S&B Metal Co for donations of steel and work including, programming, cutting, bending, etc. Once the metal was prepared I received the parts and went to my trade school, Portage Lakes Career Center where with the help of my Welding Instructor Mr. Kapas, we went to work. ### Pfeiffer Elementary to Receive Over \$1 million in Updates

Pfeiffer Elementary School was built in 1919 and has withstood the test of time for more than 100 years. The building stands strong and is a pillar at the top of 9th Street in Kenmore. Students at Pfeiffer come in each school day to an environment that is full of history, family, and memories. Over the past several years, Pfeiffer students have not been able to attend school on several days due to the overwhelming heat in the late spring and late summer, as the school does not currently have air conditioning in the classrooms. There have also been times when the furnace has gone out and students could not attend school due to a lack of heat in the frigid winter. Roof leaks have plagued Pfeiffer for many years as well, and have required repair after repair to ensure the safety of students. Thanks to the Akron Public Schools Board of Education and the Facilities Department Leaders at APS, Pfeiffer is receiving an upgrade to address all of the issues mentioned above. The Akron School Board of Education has approved a roof upgrade with a budget of \$400,000, air conditioning for classrooms and across other areas of the building budgeted at \$500,000, and an upgrade to the existing furnace with a budget of \$100,000. Along with these, earlier in the summer the Akron Board of Education approved a \$78,000 upgrade to the school cafeteria/gymnasium including a fresh coat of paint and new space saving cafeteria tables.

Students and faculty at Pfeiffer Elementary, and the community members who visit the building will have a more comfortable environment upon the completion of the proposed projects this school year. The new cafeteria tables will allow for a larger usable area for our students during physical education classes, more room for our families when attending family engagement nights, and an overall safer environment for our students. The roof will prevent leaks throughout the top floor classrooms, stairwells, and hallways, and the air conditioning units throughout the building will allow our students to learn in a more comfortable environment. The Pfeiffer Team is grateful for the opportunity to receive these upgrades and keep Pfeiffer running, hopefully, for years to come.

### **#BeKind330 - Pfeiffer Students Take Kindness Seriously**

The students at Pfeiffer Elementary School participated in the Be Kind 330 Campaign during the 2021-2022 school year. The #BeKind330 Campaign is an Akron Public Schools district wide initiative to promote kindness in classrooms and the community. Students worked hard to be as kind as possible to their classmates and the team at Pfeiffer, as well as taking their kind attitudes outside of the building to the Kenmore community.

Students at Pfeiffer started the Kindness Campaign by taking part in "Be Kind 330 - Do Kind Week" in February. During this week, students were encouraged to participate in random acts of kindness that would make the days of those around them just little bit better. Students participated in kindness activities during this week and had a random act of kindness challenge to complete every day.

In March, students took part in the #BeKind330 Campaign by taking a Kindness Pledge. Students learned about how acts of kindness, even on the smallest scale, can trigger and inspire larger acts of kindness throughout the school. Every student at Pfeiffer took a pledge to show kindness throughout the building, and many classes adopted different team members throughout the building to thank them for their kindness. Students read aloud the book "Be Kind" and completed a kindness reflection about what kindness looks like, feels like, and sounds like throughout the building. They then created a kindness butterfly for the "Kindness Gives Us Wings" wall outside of the main office, and signed their name on a piece of Duct Tape for the "Stick Together Against Bullying" wall in the cafeteria.

Students ended the year by participating in a Kindness Chalk Party in the parent parking lot. Students were given the directive to draw anything that showed kindness. From kindness dragons to hearts and kindness advice, students used their art skills to beautify the parking lot.

#### Something New in Kenmore


Many of you reading this article live on a numbered street in Kenmore like 14th Street or 16th Street. But did you know they were once named after states like so many other streets in our neighborhood? 13th Street was once Indiana Avenue and 9th Street was Pennsylvania Avenue.

Now we have a name for the alley on the south side of Kenmore Boulevard - Virgil Lay Way. Virgil was a "guitar repair genius." He was born in 1927 in Alabama and moved to Akron in 1946. He was an Army veteran and a steel guitar player who started fixing guitars in 1964. In 1969 Lay opened a shop on the corner of Kenmore Boulevard and 13th Street under the Coffee Shop and later moved to 974 Kenmore Boulevard.

Many well-known musicians became his customers including Joe Walsh of the James Gang and the Eagles, Jack Bruce from Cream, and Meatloaf. One of his most famous customizations was for Led Zeppelin's Jimmy Page now known as Page's "Number One."

Virgil was a hard worker who thrived on coming up with new ways to do things, including creating a way to keep guitar strings from stretching - S.I.T. Strings (Stay in Tune).

Virgil passed way in 2009 at the age of 82. Chances are we music fans have Virgil Lay to thank for some of our favorite songs.


