Paninoteca Now Open at The Rialto Theatre

There is just something about a really great sandwich. Even the bad ones are good. But an exceptional sandwich is special. It's greater than the sum of its parts. It's magical.

This is something that Michael McElroy innately understands. McElroy is the owner and creative mind behind **Paninoteca**, Kenmore's newest eatery. Nestled in the front room of **The Rialto Theatre**, **Paninoteca** boasts a menu of mouthwatering sandwiches designed by McElroy. "The secret to a good sandwich is quality bread and fresh ingredients," he reveals during a recent phone interview. "I try to keep it local. I go shopping every day for the items I use. You have to have tomatoes that are ripe. I use meats that are cut daily with no nitrates or MSG. I spend the extra money for good stuff."

Good ingredients alone, however, aren't quite enough. McElroy offers two extras that make his food exceptional: experience and passion. The Canton native has traveled the world. His work as a photographer has taken him from Cuba and Mexico to Italy and India. He has encountered firsthand what different pockets of the world have to offer in a culinary sense and distilled that information through his sensibility and taste.

But then there is the passion. That part can't be bought or faked. Whether he is talking about his devotion to social and environmental issues or his vision for the Boulevard District, passion seeps from him. And that, like with any talented artist, will show up in their work. In his case, the food. And speaking of the Boulevard District, why Kenmore?

"It was just a whim," McElroy recalled. A conversation with his editor in New York led him back to Ohio, where he found a building for rent in Kenmore. Sometime during the pandemic, he decided that he wanted to open an eatery. The nearby Rialto just happened to have a small kitchen space available. The rest, as they say, is history.

Though it's been open for the last month, **Paninoteca** will have its grand opening on November 26th from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm. Featuring samples off the menu (sandwiches, soups and a heralded homemade chai latte), the official launch might be your first visit to **Paninoteca**,

but it assuredly will not be your last.

Paninoteca is located in The Rialto Living Room at 1000 Kenmore Boulevard. It is open Wednesday through Saturday from 11:00 am to 4:00 pm, and again from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. To place a to-go order, call 330-510-1486.

"The 330 area has so much lifeblood of music and culture," said Brad Savage, Program Director for The Summit FM. "Our radio station supports independent and emerging hometown artists and is proud to have all this great music in our backyard. Kenmore Winter Break is a great way to showcase some of it heading into the Holiday season!"

The artists featured on The Rialto Living Room stage include musicians Rolling Boxcar International, Ray Flanagan, Katy Robinson, and Jeff and Thomas from Run Thomas Run, as well as poets Raja Belle Freeman and Danielle Nicole Nikki Dixon.

"Kenmore Winter Break was such a great time last year and we are thrilled that the Rialto is hosting it for a second year," said musician and **Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance** Promoter and Experience Manager Corey Jenkins, adding "as a musician it's a lot of fun to play, and as someone who loves catching live music on Kenmore Boulevard it's something I am excited to attend."

Performances begin at 6:00 pm both nights and run non-stop until the last band of the evening hits its final note in the theatre around 11:00 pm or so.

The Kenmore Winter Break Music Festival sponsors include Akron-based manufacturers **SIT Strings** and **EarthQuaker Devices**, as well as Kenmore guitar destinations **The Guitar Department** and **Lay's Guitar Shop**, and **Dave Burdge Recording** - an Akronbased video production company. FLOCK Camera Program to be Presented by APD at December Ward Meeting

You may have noticed new license-plate cameras being installed throughout the city. These cameras are designed to help authorities track down stolen vehicles as well as people sought for questioning in criminal investigations. The goal is to better protect Akron's residents.

The cameras will provide additional eyes for the APD and will serve to give a better understanding of what is taking place in communities throughout Akron. The camera system uses automated license plate reader technology, snapping images that are run through a national crime database. Police can be immediately alerted if a stolen car passes a camera. A general description of a vehicle can also be provided by the system.

The system has already been used to track down stolen vehicles in the city. Eventually, 145 cameras will be used in the system. Please join us on Tuesday December 6th, for the presentation. Our meeting will be at the Kenmore Community Center, 880 Kenmore Boulevard at 7:00 pm.







Kenmore's JOBS Program Still Active

After experiencing a decline in student enrollment during the pandemic, the JOBS program (Jump On Board for Success) is seeing increasing participation in its job training programs for girls and women. JOBS, a nonprofit organization, offers mentoring and hands-on employment training in five in-demand employment fields to at-risk young women and mothers aged 13-35.

"We're so excited to finally be getting back on track to keep building the program," said executive director Jennifer Herrick.

According to the most recent U.S. Census Bureau statistics, women age 18-34 are the largest demographic living in poverty in Summit County, illustrating just how badly programs like JOBS are needed.

The program originally began in 2014 and only offered Cosmetology. Culinary Arts (along with one-on-one mentoring) was added in 2018. But in 2021, Herrick added Information Technology and an Entrepreneurship group, and in 2022 two more programs including Early Childhood Education and Business Administration.

"We work with girls and women who face significant barriers to stable employment," said Herrick.

One of the largest barriers is affordable childcare, and the JOBS program has created an innovative solution: students in the Early Childhood Education program provide childcare to other participants' children while they're in class. "It's killing two birds with one stone."

The program isn't just about job skills. Young women and mothers also learn improved parenting skills, budgeting, and other important life skills. Participants are matched one-on-one with a mentor who helps them stay motivated and accountable.

"Our mission is to equip each young woman with the professional proficiency and motivation to financially support herself and her family. We're all about empowering young women," Herrick added. At the end of the courses, participants receive help creating their resumes, honing interview skills and with employment placement.

Also new in 2022, JOBS hosted its first major fundraising event in June, Akron's "330 Flavor Throw-Down," a Chopped style cooking competition between two local chefs. "It was a lot of fun and our guests definitely want to come back next year," Herrick said. Working with community partners, JOBS takes referrals from The Well CDC, Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance, First Glance, RAHAB Ministries and others. "We're always looking for referrals and seeking to build partnerships with anyone who works with our demographic," said Herrick.

The program is offered free to participants. Funding comes from Akron Community Foundation as well as several other donors. Most JOBS program participants come from the Kenmore area and classes are held at Goss Memorial Church and Park United Methodist Church in Kenmore.

Kenmore Historical Society News

This article contains information about our elementary schools in alphabetical order.

Colonial School was built in 1915, and when it closed children attended Pfeiffer or Heminger. For many years the building was used by the Sheet Metal Workers Association. Now it's a charter school.

Guinther School, which opened in 1958, was built to handle an overflow of students from Highland Park. It closed in 1993 and later became an administration building. It was demolished.

Heminger closed in 2008. After it was demolished, an apartment building called Kenmore Place, was built on its site.

Highland Park was built in 1922. In 2000, the name was changed to Sam Salem in honor of the longest serving member of the Akron School Board. A new school was built on that site as part of an \$800 million program to renovate or reconstruct Akron schools.

The first Lawndale School, which still stands, was replaced by a new building on 25th Street. After Lawndale closed, it was purchased by a private company at an auction in 2019. The building was demolished after a multi-alarm fire.

Margaret Park School, opened in 1918, was named in honor of Margaret Barnhart who was a leader in establishing public playgrounds. The school was closed in 2008 and later demolished.

Rimer School was constructed in 1918. It was also replaced as part of the same program that built the new Sam Salem.

Smith School opened in 1921. After the school was closed in 2021, it was purchased by the same company that purchased Lawndale. A fire damaged part of the building, but it still stands vacant.

In summary, the Kenmore community once had eight elementary schools. three are still used as Akron schools: Pfeiffer, Rimer, and Sam Salem. Margaret Park, Lawndale and Guinther were demolished. Smith is now vacant. Colonial is still in operation, but it is not an Akron Public School.
