New Record Store Offers Musical, Creative Discovery

For the first time in Kenmore's recorded history, vinyl aficionados, crate diggers, and lovers of music on physical media have a shopping destination on Kenmore Boulevard. But **Juju Bonz Records** — which will celebrate its official grand opening on Saturday February 18th, is much more than just a record store. It's a place for community music makers and creatives to come together to network, make plans, and learn from one another.

In addition to selling new and used records, tapes, CDs and even 8-track tapes, **Juju Bonz Records** offers clothing, jewelry, magazines, rock and roll memorabilia and more. Visual artists can also consign their work there. "Juju Bonz will be whatever the Kenmore community needs it to be beyond just a record store," co-owner Julia Bentley explained. "Our last shop changed over time. Music and art are alive and can change, and so will this."

Formerly known as Frankenstein Records, the business is the 16th to find a home in the Kenmore Boulevard business district in the past two years, said Tina Boyes, Executive Director of Kenmore Neighborhood Alliance. Another, Buzzbin Art & Music Shop, relocated to Kenmore from downtown Canton, where it served as a temporary home for the record store. Gradually, the record store became a place where musicians and concert goers would hang out and network during COVID-19 when alcohol sales ended at 10 pm.

"So much of the revitalization of Kenmore Boulevard centers on celebrating and building on our assets," Boyes said. "Our musicians, our music businesses: those are assets. What's missing are the additional gathering spaces: welcoming places where art and ideas can be exchanged. **Juju Bonz Records** is exactly the right place at the right time."

The store will serve as a place for musical discovery, whether it's by sitting on one of their couches and listening to music you've never heard or by spending some time in "The Wreck Room" – a DIY recording studio located in the back of the store where artists can experiment with the recording process. "I want this to be an engaging space for the community to try something they've never tried before, whether it's art or music," Julia said.

Julia hopes to host alcohol-free or "dry" shows at **Juju Bonz Records** to give music lovers of all ages a safe and comfortable place to enjoy live music without alcohol. It's a fitting use for a building once home to Alcoholics Anonymous meetings. "Or, if someone just wants to hang out and play a game or read a book or talk music, this is the space."

Juju Bonz Records is located at 989 Kenmore Boulevard. It is open 12:00 noon to 9:00 pm Tuesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday, and 12:00 noon to 7:00 pm on Wednesday and Sunday. Extended hours will be available after Buzzbin and The Rialto Theatre shows also. For an up to date information, visit buzzbinkenmore.com/juju-bonz-store.





Councilman's Corner

Akron Police Now Accepting Applications

The Akron Police Department is now accepting applications for the position of Police Officer through March 9th, 2023. The exam is planned for March 18th and 23rd, 2023. Once established, the eligible list generated from the test will remain in place for 18 months. Historically, the City has hired multiple classes of officers from an eligibility list over that period.

Candidates must meet several baseline qualifications to be eligible, including:

- * 20.5 to 45 years old by the application closing date (March 9th)
- * High school diploma or GED
- * Valid driver's license

Candidates must pass written tests, a physical fitness test, a background investigation and a polygraph examination. Final selection is contingent upon passage of a medical and psychological evaluation after receiving a conditional job offer. The City of Akron also awards bonus points to those candidates who pass the written test and meet a residency requirement, have served in active duty in the armed forces of the United States for more than 180 days and were honorably discharged, and/or completed accredited college course work.

Positive Behavior Intervention Systems at Pfeiffer by Aa'Riyah Haskins Al-Qaadir

At Pfeiffer we live by three pillars in our PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions System). Those pillars are to be respectful, be responsible, and be safe. At Pfeiffer we have common area expectations in the lunchroom, hallways, bathrooms, and any other place that we share across the school. The teachers and principals at Pfeiffer taught us about these expectations at the beginning of the year in a positive behavior fair where we rotated around to each area and learned about the expectations. Every day teachers remind us about the positive expectations and our principal tells us about them on the announcements, too.

If we are caught doing the right things in the hallways or other common areas, we are given a Pirate Ticket. Students save up their Pirate Tickets to earn prizes. Some prizes include Croc charms, pens, school supplies, fidgets, chips, using the Dean of Student's chair for the day, being Principal for the day, or a karaoke session with 5 of your friends. Over the past two years, we have been able to save 30 tickets to gain entrance to our PBIS Winter Dance. Last year, The Grinch joined us at the dance. This year, we did not have any special visitors, but Student Council members did a great job decorating and helping to choose music for the dance.

Every other week, the Dean of Students runs a PBIS Pop Up Shop. At these Pop Up Shops, students can buy snacks, mini-pop its, or fun school supplies for 10 PBIS tickets. All of the students at Pfeiffer know the common area expectations and try to earn as

many PBIS tickets as they can every day.

Immaculate Conception Catholic Church Celebrates 100 Years in Kenmore




On March 23rd, 2023, Immaculate Conception of Mary Parish will celebrate 100 years of Worship, Charity, Christian Formation and Stewardship. The parish was established on March 23rd, 1923, by founding pastor Fr. John Waldeisen, on 13 lots at the corner of 16th Street and Battles Avenue. The parish property was originally an apple orchard.

Before the original building was completed, Mass was held in the old Boulevard Theater on Kenmore Boulevard. The first Mass in the current church building was celebrated at the Christmas Midnight Mass in 1952.

In partnership with Park United Methodist Church, the property houses the Kenmore Free Store, St. Vincent de Paul Food Pantry, and the Kenmore Community Garden, and is host to the monthly Kenmore Community Meal. During the past year the 100th Anniversary Committee planned and hosted fun activities monthly, and parishioners are currently observing 100 days of prayer as they count down to March 23rd. One of the biggest events of the past year was the retirement on June 7th of Fr. Michael B. Smith, pastor for 24 years. On that day Melissa Keegan, Pastoral Associate for 40 years, was named Parish Life Coordinator by Edward Malesic, Bishop of the Diocese of Cleveland. The parish is blessed to have Fr. Mike as it's Sacrament Priest to continue to say Mass and hear Confessions.

The big day will be marked with a special Mass and a dinner. The parish is proud of it's legacy and looks forward to serving the people of Kenmore, witnessing to the faith and fulfilling God's will as individuals and as a community of faith for many more years to come.







Kenmore Historical Society News

We had two unusual guests that accompanied wildlife rehab specialist Fran Kitchen at our meeting in November. One was a great horned owl named Sassie, and the other was an Eastern box turtle named Helmet. Fran's career with animals began when she helped an orphaned robin found by a neighbor. After researching at the library about how to care for the bird, she raised it to adulthood, then released it. Since then she has devoted 60 years of her life to caring for thousands of wild animals, earning her membership in the Ohio Natural Resources Hall of Fame.


Fran claims to take in from 600 to 1,000 animals a year which she cares for in walk-in cages in her backyard. She has cared for animals from Summit, Stark and Wayne counties and has received a Lifetime Achievement award from the Ohio Wildlife Rehabilitation Association.

Fran warns that human intervention is not always necessary. The mother animal often returns to take care of her babies. Fran tries to educate people about methods to prevent potential problems with wildlife. She reminds people who complain about wild animals walking through their yard, "That animal is not in your backyard. You are in its front yard."

Fran has lived in Kenmore since she was one year old. She attended Rimer Elementary then Kenmore High School where she graduated in 1963. Her three sons attended Kenmore also.

Fran's organization, the non-profit Operation Orphan Wildlife Rehabilitation Inc does not receive government funding. It is supported entirely through private donations. 

The Kenmore Free Store is a cooperative effort of the Immaculate Conception Catholic Church and Park United Methodist Church, both located in the Kenmore area.

To register at our store, you just need to come and give us your name, your age, your zip code of where you are staying, and the names and ages of the other people who are dependent upon you.



These are the items we have available:

- * Clothing of all sizes
- * Household items kitchen items and decorative items for the home
- * Foot wear
- Small appliances such as toasters, toaster ovens, coffeemakers, blenders and etc (We DO NOT have stoves or refrigerators)
- * Linens and bedding such as sheets, pillowcases and blankets
- * Books and toys
- * Furniture we do not have mattresses or upholstered furniture







Since this is a new year, I thought you might like to know some of the numbers that tells us the people we are reaching. Last year we added 2409 new households to make our total of registered households 8037. We provided 33,851 pieces of clothing, 2003 pairs of shoes, 7611 pairs of socks, and 647 coats to registered households.

Our volunteers continue to grow. The volunteers provided 3385 hours of service. We are so thankful for those who continue to volunteer. They are the workers you see accepting your donations, sorting and cleaning your donations, registering you at check in and those who check you out. God is so good to provide what we need, when we need it.

Donations are accepted at the 16th Street SW entrance. There is a RED cart provided at the door for your donations. We accept donations ONLY during open hours which are Tuesdays from 4:00 to 7:00 pm and Saturdays from 9:00 am to 12:00 noon. If you need help with your donations please knock on the door and someone will come to help you.
