Welcome to Kenmore

The Church on the Boulevard opened its doors for service in September. The building has been in Kenmore since June of 1921 and has had many people in it. It was a church, and it is a church again.

Who are the new residents at 754 Kenmore Boulevard? They are not new faces, we have seen them before. The church family in the building has been active in Kenmore for quite some time. You might have eaten a cookie, or had a cup of Hot Chocolate from their tent in front of the Library during the Kenmore Holiday Celebration. You or your child might have had their face painted in the library by one of them. If you were at the Gazebo for the Tree lighting you heard them sing. They even held a service at the Gazebo this past cold Easter. Your child might even have attended Vacation Bible School (VBS) at the Kenmore Stadium with them.

They were Green Baptist Church, but they felt a need to come and join Kenmore. They put their building up for sale in Green and bought the building on the Blvd. The old church has been many things, but now it is a church again and its doors are open for people who want to experience worship. When you come to visit don't be surprised when you see someone you already know: a local librarian, teacher, mom who volunteered with your child, or a dad who helped coach a team your child was on. You can come to Sunday School at 9:30 or worship service at 11:00, then stay for coffee or a real cappuccino after service. You can come in jeans and a t-shirt or a three piece suit. The old hymn "Just As I Am" is like a motto for them, just come as you are.

They say their services are down to earth, challenging, and focused on being who God wants you to be, not who the world says you should be. They say that everyone has a place at The Church on the Boulevard. Men are called to step up and be challenged. Women are challenged to move forward with the men. Children have their own worship service that mirrors the adult services.

Something that is different from other churches is the deaf ministries. These are not run by hearing people for deaf, but run by deaf who are a part of the church, not something separate. The church has a large number of hearing members who sign and more are learning all the time. They even have several interpreters.

They say that if you think this is just another church then come and explore the difference with them. They have men's assaults, not retreats. The women do afternoon teas, then go on mission trips to Katrina ravaged areas. The kids worship, play, then put together gifts for nursing homes. The Pastor preaches then gets sweaty with other men in the church helping someone move to a new house.

We hope to see people at services but we know we'll see them for Christmas in Kenmore, when the doors open all day for a wide variety of activities, food, music, and fun.

One last note, the members of The Church on the Boulevard want to invite any member of the church that was there before to come by and visit and look around if they want. We know that some have not been in the building for years and might like to just spend some time. We welcome our brothers and sisters to come back and visit and let us know of the proud history and work that God has done before here.

Kenmore Boulevard to Partner with Keep Akron Beautiful

Anyone who has recently driven down Kenmore Boulevard has noticed some significant upgrades along the business district. The city recently invested 1.3 million dollars to provide new street, sidewalks, illumination, and sundry improvements. One "unseen" improvement along the center strip of the boulevard is a new irrigation system running several blocks in length.

I am pleased to announce a new boulevard project in cooperation with Keep Akron Beautiful (KAB.) KAB is a local organization. Established in 1981 to implement a comprehensive litter prevention, recycling promotion, and beautification program for the City of Akron, KAB operates as a nonprofit 501c(3) organization. Ward 9 Leaf Removal Program

The City of Akron has begun its annual Bulk Leaf Removal Program. Akron residents, within the posted area, will be permitted to place leaves in the street, not more than two feet from the curb on their Leaf Collection Day. For Ward 9, the second round of leaf removal is scheduled for Wednesday November 15th.

To those taking advantage of this city program, please remember---

DO NOT BAG LEAVES.

DO NOT allow children to play in leaves on or near the street.

DO NOT place branches or other debris in the street (Leaves only).

DO NOT rake leaves into the street after leaves have been removed from your street or you will be subject to a fine.

DO NOT park vehicles on the street the day before the scheduled pick-up until your leaves have been removed.

DO NOT park vehicles over leaves. The heat from the underside of the vehicle may cause a fire.

DO rake leaves into the street no more than two feet from the curb or street edge.

DO rake leaves into the street the day before the scheduled pick up day (November 15th).

Signs will be posted at intersections to remind residents when leaves will be removed. Leaves will be picked up, 24 hours a day, two collections per ward. The November 15th scheduled date is the second leaf removal for the Ward 9 area.

Please note that each ward takes more than one day to pick up autumn leaves. All residents need to have the leaves out by the posted date. Do not wait until you see the equipment in our ward or you may be too late. For leaf removal information, please dial 311 or 330-375-2311, or check on the web at www.ci.akron.oh.us. 

Kenmore Historical Society News

In 1901 the Akron Realty Company and W. A. Johnson planned the layout of Kenmore. This was at the time the Akron-Barberton street car lines were being laid out. Akron Realty (N. R. Steiner) bought up farmland between Akron and Barberton to develop an allotment. Lots were put on sale and 1,500 were sold that year. Kenmore grew rapidly.

In 2008 we will be celebrating the 100th anniversary of when Kenmore officially became a village. The Village of Kenmore was incorporated on January 9, 1908. Many groups are planning events throughout the year for our community as we remember Kenmore's history. We invite you to share your memories of Kenmore with us. Portage Path Pioneer William Yeck Dies

Can you imagine traveling from Cleveland to Cincinnati without using a car, plane, train or any form of modern transportation?

Years ago, Native American Indians traveled that distance using canoes on Ohio's rivers. When necessary, they carried their canoes and supplies over land between waterways. That was called portaging. The Portage Lakes and Portage Trails in our area were a part of this traveling done by Ohio Indians.

An 8 1/2-mile section of that trail in the Akron area has been marked with fifty bronze markers patterned after an actual flint arrowhead found locally. Also, two large statues of an American Indian carrying a canoe have been placed on the path. One of those statues is located in a small park near Nesmith Lake.

One of the people responsible for these tributes, William Yeck, passed away in September at the age of 92. William's ancestors lived in the Cuyahoga and Tuscarawas watershed when they arrived from Europe in the mid-1800's. Then during the 1990's, members of the Yeck family started a program to research the Portage Path, and William donated hundreds of thousands of dollars to mark that trail.

William first proposed the "Marking of the Trail of the Portage Path" project in 1991, and for the next decade worked tirelessly to make the project happen. Most of the cost of the project was in the creation of the markers, with the two 8-foot tall statues alone weighing 4,200 pounds each. The original trail connected the Tuscarawas River to the Cuyahoga River, and most now lies under Manchester Road.

The past few months have been very exciting at the First Glance Teen Mom's program. After many months of waiting, planning, and learning...we welcomed the newest babies to the group...Nonna, Faith, Emily, Jake, and Ashawn. By the time this paper is delivered, we'll have at least two more babies! Casey and Emily turned one, and Skyler, Nickolis, and Hope will all be celebrating their first birthdays by the end of the year.

This summer, we had the opportunity to take the girls and babies swimming every week. This provided not only a great time of community, but also much needed exercise for our Moms. We also recently had a cooking night at Goss Memorial Church. The girls planned, shopped, and prepared the meal. They also prepared a sugar-free snack for the babies that they took home and froze for future use. Leaders were allowed to give lots of advice, but the girls had to do the cooking!

We have had the great opportunity to have many speakers come to talk to the girls about baby care and child rearing. Those who have donated their time include a representative from Children's Hospital talking about shaken baby syndrome; Dr. Hackenberg, a local pediatrician; Mrs. Flaker with Help me Grow, Project Learn, & AMHA; and Mary Jo Molmaster from the Church on the Boulevard. We also have had our leaders speak on topics such as childcare, respect, the impact of reading to babies, and the consequences of smoking around babies – both born and unborn.



Knowing that it is difficult for the girls to get to their childbirth classes, we also offer these for the girls at our meeting place, the Prentice Building on Kenmore Blvd.

Our "Baby Boutique" of donated items is coming along very nicely. Triple T Funding has donated space in their building for this boutique...and we keep expanding! We now have separate rooms for boys and girls clothing and then an entire area of all the baby necessities. The girls earn their "baby dollars" by attending the program, checking in with leaders, doing their designated reading and questions, bringing other teen moms, going on job interviews, and attending church. The girls work on their budgeting and math skills by keeping a "baby register" which is actually a checkbook register where they enter their deposits and withdrawals. For those who have donated to this boutique we thank you for making a difference for these girls and their babies.

The Teen Mom Program currently has 12 adult leaders, 4 boutique volunteers, and a shower/ birthday ministry consisting of ladies from the community and local churches. We are so grateful for their dedication of time and energy to these girls. Their belief in these girls makes such a difference in their daily lives. We also are most appreciative to Tom and Lori Prentice for their donation of space to hold our weekly programs, meetings, baby showers and birthday parties for the girls and their babies.

All Teen Moms and their babies are welcome to attend our meetings.
