

## Kenmore Library Groundbreaking Attended By Many

The last groundbreaking ceremony for a Summit County Library was held on Friday, November 9th, 2007, and according to city officials it had the largest attendance by community residents of any of these events that began almost ten years ago! The new Kenmore Branch Library is being built on the spot of the original Kenmore City Hall, and will be based on a design reminiscent of that historic building.

The ceremony began with opening remarks by David Jennings, Summit Library Director. Next to speak were Scott Jaffe, President of the Library Board of Trustees; Russ Pry, Summit County Executive; and Jay Boone, the architect from Moody Nolan Inc which designed the new library. Our 9th Ward Councilman Mike Freeman spoke next, and then Akron City Mayor Don Plusquellic talked about his fond memories growing up with the current Kenmore Library.

The actual Kenmore Branch Library Groundbreaking Ceremony took some time, as many groups & organizations had their turn to have their pictures taken at the site. Photo ops included the Summit County Library Board, Friends of Kenmore Branch Library, Kenmore Board of Trade, the Kenmore Historical Society, and finally the Kenmore Library Staff themselves. Completion will be sometime this summer or early fall, depending on the weather and other factors. The Grand Opening of the new Kenmore Branch Library will be announced in a future edition of the Kenmore Connection.

### **Family Finds Volunteering Fulfilling**

When a family like the Wilkersons plays together, they stay together.

Bill, Mary, Paul and John Wilkerson, all natives of Kenmore, received the park district's "Star Volunteer" award, Wednesday, December 12, during the monthly meeting of the Board of Park Commissioners. The Wilkersons have racked up a combined 6,288 volunteer hours, many playing for the Metro Parks Ensemble, a volunteer group of talented musicians that performs at park district events and in the community.

Bill Wilkerson started the Ensemble in 2001 after recruiting his wife, Mary, their two adult sons, Paul and John, and nine other musicians. Initially, Bill bought a trombone and learned how to play, but decided on the role of manager instead. The Ensemble has been delighting crowds ever since. One event brought tears to Bill's eyes. "While playing at a nursing home, a man and woman, both in wheelchairs, managed to stand up, hold hands and tap their feet," he remarked.

Bill and Mary reside in Kenmore, where raised their four sons. One son still lives in Kenmore and the rest are in the Akron area. The kids all attended Kenmore High School in the 1970s, and each

played violin in the orchestra. Paul even worked as groundskeeper for the high school's football stadium during senior year and most of college. "This prepared me for my current job," said Paul, construction supervisor / engineer for Metro Parks. "It taught me to have a strong sense of pride and stewardship over the land."

# **Kenmore AARP Elects New President**

Dave Miller has been elected the new President of the Kenmore AARP #3592. Miller, 54, will begin his new term with the March meeting at the Kenmore Community Center. A 1973 graduate of Kenmore High, Miller joined the local AARP chapter the month he turned 50 in 2003. The second year he belonged, he was appointed to the Board of Directors, then moved up to Second Vice President in charge of Ways & Means before moving up to President this year.

Although no longer living in Kenmore, Miller has been in Kenmore activities since coming to Kenmore in 1961. While in school, he served as Equipment Manager of the football team and was on the team that won the championship in 1970 (as equipment manager). Miller is a past member of Kenmore Community Council, and attends Goss Memorial Church. Miller has long connections with the Kenmore Community. "My late grandparents (Ira and Muriel Kaser) first moved to Kenmore in 1911, and most of my relatives are graduates of Kenmore High School."

Miller hopes to build back up the AARP chapter, by bringing more "Baby Boomers" into the fold. "The first Boomers are turning 62 this year and a lot of them belong to National AARP, but are



unaware of the local chapter".

The local chapter began in Kenmore in 1983. A district AARP representative Mike Thomas contacted several seniors in the area to try to form a chapter. It was decided to have a meeting at the Iona Avenue home of Jessie Buckey.

Mrs. Buckey, a 1931 Kenmore High Graduate, had been active in many Kenmore organizations over the years including the Pfeiffer, Innes and Kenmore High PTAs. The initial meeting was held and the organization was formed. (Of those charter members at the original meeting, it is believed only Ruth Faix of Portage Lakes is still alive). Faix now serves as Membership Chairman.

The first meetings of the Kenmore AARP were held at the then Boulevard Evangelical Church (now The Church on the Boulevard). After a few meetings at that location at the corner of Seventh Street and Kenmore Boulevard, they moved to the Hibernian Hall on Kenmore Boulevard, where they had monthly luncheon meetings. Each meeting featured a guest, entertainment, or a speaker on some topic related to Seniors.

At one time in the late 80s, it was the largest AARP chapter in the state and had a closedout membership at 300 people, with a waiting list. The membership has dwindled over the years due to death and other things. "Originally the major part of the membership was between the ages of 50-75 and over the course of 25 years, they have become 75-100, with not a lot of new joining among the 50-65 age group, to replace the older ones" according to Miller. Miller went on to say "In all organizations that I'm involved in, it is really hard to get the Boomers to join."

# **Casa Mimi Italian Restaurant Remodels - Twice!**

It started with the June 2007 hail storm. The roof at Casa Mimi suffered damage like all the rest, but before it could be repaired the next rain leaked through most of the building. All the rooms had to be remodeled with new drywall, carpets, and ceilings. Just as the restaurant was about to reopen, the heavy August rainstorm found the one spot on the roof not repaired - the vents for the furnace & air conditioners, which suffered hail damage INSIDE the vents. The rainstorm flooded so much water through the holes caused by the hail in the vents that most of the rooms at Casa Mimi were again flooded out. So again, most of the walls, ceilings, and floors had to be repaired. Although the inside of Casa Mimi is now totally remodeled, due to conditions outside the restaurant only the dinner service is back on schedule. The part of Manchester Road in front of Casa Mimi (from about Waterloo Road to Wilbeth Road) will itself be remodeled with new roads & sidewalks this spring & summer, so the daily lunch menu will not be served during the construction to keep the dust out of Casa Mimi.

Casa Mimi, located at 2214 Manchester Road, is open for dinner every day except Monday. The hours are Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday 4:00 to 10:00 pm, Friday & Saturday 4:00 to 11:00 pm, and Sunday 4:00 to 8:00 pm. The dining room features exclusive Italian meals. 

# **Councilman's Corner**

### **Local Government-Impacting Our Daily Lives**

How much does local government matter? It is important to remember that as citizens of Akron, local government decisions often affect our day to day lives much more than the activity that takes place in Washington or Columbus. I am frequently surprised at the limited input that citizens choose to have into local government. This is often seen in lack of participation in public hearings or committee meetings at City Hall. Can a citizen effectively communicate to their local governing body? Absolutely yes!

City Council meetings are primarily for acting on legislation which has already been discussed and deliberated in committee and public input occurs best at the committee level. You may, however request permission to address Council on an issue by submitting a written request specifying the topic to be discussed to the President of Council no later than the Friday prior to the next scheduled City Council meeting. The President will consider each request and will either refer you to your Ward Councilperson or the appropriate committee for action. Presentations are limited to three minutes.

#### When you speak:

- -Give your name and address for the record.
- -Limit your remarks to the time allotted.

-Clearly state your point, and then present any factual evidence to back up your point.

-Avoid repetition. If a point has been made by a previous speaker, simply indicate your support or disagreement, unless you have new information.

### How can you participate in a public hearing?

City Council will listen to your arguments for or against proposed legislation at scheduled public hearings. Prior notices of all public hearings are published in the Akron Beacon Journal classified section and listed in the Council calendar online. If you wish to be heard, you need only attend the Council meeting at which the public hearing is scheduled. Citizens in favor of and those opposing legislation will be sworn in and allowed three minutes to voice their opinions. The Clerk of Council also can provide information on public hearings that are scheduled. Agendas are prepared by the Clerk of Council and can be obtained after 1:00 p.m. on the Friday prior to a Monday evening City Council meeting.

### Ward 9 Councilman's Meetings

Councilman Freeman holds a public meeting on the first Tuesday every month at the Kenmore Senior/Community Center, starting at 7:00 pm.

Please join him at 880 Kenmore Boulevard to discuss your community & your city!

How can you voice your opinion at a committee meeting? If you wish to be heard at a committee meeting, you need only appear at the meeting and request to speak. It is advisable, however, that you contact the committee chairperson prior to the committee meeting or notify the office of the Clerk of Council in writing that you wish to be heard. Committees meet on Mondays prior to the full Council meeting. A schedule of committee meetings is posted on the home page of this Web site. A schedule also can be obtained from the Clerk of Council.

As always, thank you for allowing me to serve.




Hollywood Comes to the DeBord's 12th Annual Halloween Party by Claude DeBord



In addition to new programs, First Glance has a new ID system. The GAR foundation awarded First Glance a grant, which provided money for this new system. This means every student receives a plastic ID card with their name and picture. Then as they come into First Glance, we scan their card, which allows us to know who is there and if they should not be there. We are excited about this system. It also gives the students more ownership in First Glance and it allows us to keep better attendance records. So what have we learned so far? Since September we have given out over 400 IDs (with over 100 who haven't gotten one yet). The students are split between guys (52%) and girls (48%). Every student receives a card for free upon returning the parental consent form. We don't allow this new system to keep students from coming if they forget their card, we simply look them up by name. Overall it has been a great system and has allowed us to keep First Glance safer.





# **Kenmore Historical Society News**

Did you know that a part of Kenmore as it is today was once considered "The Garden of Eden" to the Indians, and was supposed to have some of the best hunting and fishing in the state at Summit and Nesmith lakes? The Delaware Indians lived in this area

It is not known where the first settlements in Kenmore were, but it is believed to have been in the east and north sections near Nesmith Lake and on the Ohio Canal in the early 1800's. There were sawmills, gristmills and a glass factory in this area.

The beginning of the Village of Kenmore was toward the end of the 1800's. The Tom Walsh street railway was built from Akron to Barberton in 1893-94. William Johnson bought 45 acres of land between the Erie Railroad and Foust Road (now Wilbeth Rd.) from George R. Foust and Jacob T. Miller in about 1898 for development. He also bought more land along the railroad later from Austin Triplett and William Sours.

The settlement at Halo was where the Colonial Salt Company started on 23 acres of land purchased from John Proehl at Wingerter's crossing, where the railroad tracks crossed Manchester Road. Colonial Salt (now AKZO NOBEL SALT, INC.) was incorporated in 1901 and is the oldest business in Kenmore. Halo eventually became a part of Kenmore.

The Sours and Watters families lived on farms where Kenmore now stands. Shadyside Park area was laid out on what had been the Foust, Weiser, Sours and Witner farms.

After the town was laid out, M. C. Heminger, an Akron real estate dealer, was the first to move on the Boulevard. He moved his family here from Clinton. His household goods arrived by canal boat and landed near where Colonial Salt Company stood.

Other early settlers were: D. M. Settle, J. H. Heckler, J. C. Enders, E. F. Crites, Walter Baughman, Joe Royer, Leman Baughman, H. G. Laudenslager, Sylvester Bolander and others.

Kenmore was incorporated as a village in 1908. Charles M. Smith was the first mayor of the Village of Kenmore. The population of Kenmore increased 300 percent between 1910 and 1920. As the village grew more land was annexed. The population was around 18,000.

Kenmore became a city in 1922. Soon it became difficult to support the public services needed for its growing population. In an effort to solve these problems they decided the solution was to annex to Akron. It was not an easy decision. After a bitter battle, residents of Kenmore voted on November 6, 1928 to annex. The vote was 3,854 for annexation and 2,225 against.


