Project Shine Completes 2008 Season by Kevin Burkholder

Project Shine began in the Summer of 2002. During the first year of its existence, approximately 40-50 volunteers came together to serve approximately a dozen of Kenmore's residents through basic home repair and maintenance. Each summer, Project Shine has developed a real and deeper passion for serving the residents of Kenmore.

Project Shine 2008 took place June 22-28. Enlisting a total of 150 volunteers, Project Shine was able to complete more than 30 total projects this summer. Several houses were painted from top to bottom. An entire crew of teenage boys spent their week completing yard work projects including digging out bushes, small tress, and stumps, trimming trees and shrubs, and pulling weeds. Other crews helped in various ways by painting foundations, steps, hand railings, staining decks and fences, washing windows, etc. One resident had a garage receive new siding. Some served through basic cleaning and debris removal. One crew spent several hours assisting with renovations at the new First Glance building. Adults served on work crews, contributed administrative support, provided child care for volunteers, provided photo and video presentations each evening, and assisted the kitchen crew.

Project Shine is about more than work! Each evening, volunteer workers feasted upon wonderful meals and then were challenged by the music of Divine Soldiers (Akron's own Christian rap artists) and guest speaker Craig Peters. Youth and adults alike received challenging messages to live an entire life of loving people through service and conduct in life's various relationships.

In all, 85 youth and over 60 adults gave up all or parts of their summer to serve the community of Kenmore and help us build positive relationships with the residents we served. These youth (each committing to a full week of work) represented at least seven churches from the Kenmore and greater Akron area.

Several churches gave volunteer and financial support. The Knight Foundation, the City of Akron (Neighborhood Partnership Grant), and the law firm of Buckingham, Doolittle, and Burroughs provided scholarship and grant support. Local business support came from A Gild Pizza, Kenmore Freeze, Sherwin Williams, McDonald's of Barberton, Lowe's, and Smuckers.

Thank you to the Kenmore Community for the ongoing support of Project Shine.

Council Passes Measures to Protect Property Owners and Renters from Methamphetamine Lab Health Risk

In the final meeting before the August recess Council passed a measure to protect property owners and renters from methamphetamine lab health risks. Residential property owners will be responsible for notifying new buyers or renters if the property was used as a methamphetamine lab.

The ordinance adds to the city code a new section entitled "Notice of Contamination from Methamphetamine Production," which requires anyone selling or renting real property to disclose the prior or current existence of an illegal methamphetamine production laboratory of which he or she has knowledge. Basically, the legislation requires anyone in the city to notify the individual purchasing or renting property affected by methamphetamine-related activities before the transfer. If the property is posted as a methamphetamine lab, the owner must disclose that fact or face a maximum \$1,500 fine or up to 180 days in jail."

Because the drug is often produced in small, home-based laboratories, measuring the levels of contaminants and their health effects has been difficult. Therefore an accompanying resolution urging the Ohio Legislature to support House Bill 92, which would set local standards and guidelines for meth lab clean up and remediation was offered as well. The bill, pending in the Ohio House, would establish guidelines for removal of methamphetamine residue and to determine whether an affected property is fit to inhabit.

The real issue is there is no means to measure what contamination is or what remediation is in situations like this. This bill would encourage the state Environmental Protection Agency to determine what contamination is and how we remediate it. In fairness to landlords, a standard needs to be in place to identify what the pollutants are.







Welcome to Akron Public Schools' Kindergarten!

One of the most difficult times as a parent is transitioning your child into kindergarten. The Akron Public Schools Kenmore Cluster principals are pleased to be able to offer a series of articles to help answer questions parents may have as your child enters kindergarten in the Akron Public Schools.

What do we expect of a child coming to kindergarten? Children come to school with very different backgrounds and personalities. Yet despite this diversity, they often share certain characteristics.

A child entering kindergarten will probably:

- -prefer a fairly routine schedule.
- -perform better under consistent guidance and discipline.
- -enjoy opportunities to show independence.
- -seek affection and security within their home.

Physically, most kindergarteners will be:

- -extremely active for short periods, separated by longer periods of calm and quiet.
 -maturing in large and small muscle control.
 -susceptible to childhood diseases.
 -somewhat farsighted as their eyes are not yet fully mature.
 -lacking full development of eye-hand coordination.
- -learning to snap fingers, hop on one foot, skip, whistle, and wink.

Socially and emotionally, a kindergartener will probably:

- -have a creative a vivid imagination.
- -show pride and concern about his or her possessions.
- -argue with peers frequently.
- -Like immediate results, not long-term goals.
- -have difficulty understanding and remembering rules.
- -change their mind often.
- -be very curious.

Do You Know Where Our Kids Are? By Jan Williams

With so many changes lately involving school construction in Kenmore, do you know where your neighborhood children are going to school now? When Heminger closed in 2007, most of those students were scheduled to attend Rimer, but Rimer has been torn down to make room for a brand new school building that is under construction at this time. So those students are temporarily attending the old Voris School on Glenmount Avenue in Firestone Park.

Since Innes is also under remodeling construction, the sixth grade students are going to Heminger until Innes is finished, and the seventh and eighth grade students are using Margaret Park. Innes Middle School temporarily now has two names - Innes on the Boulevard and Innes on the Lake.

Margaret Park closed in 2007, and those students are now attending the new Helen Arnold Community Learning Center (West Olden Boulevard), Pfeiffer, Lawndale, or Crouse (Diagonal Road) depending on where they live.

Highland Park changed its name to Sam Salem School in 2000, and they have a new school built next to the old one. Students will move into their new school this school year.

Eventually Smith Elementary School will close, and Pfeiffer and Lawndale will be replaced, but exact dates haven't been set yet.

Two other Kenmore grade schools closed years ago. Colonial (5th Street) closed in 1964 and is now a union hall for sheet metal workers. Guinther (Carnegie Avenue) closed in 1993 and is now an administration building for Akron Public Schools.

As you can see, there have been many changes in our community's schools over the years with more to come in the future. We hope all our students have a good school year in 2008!

We were very pleased to see over 200 people at our open house on May 17th. It turned out to be a very enjoyable day meeting so many of you and sharing your memories.

In the last issue of The Connection we asked that you write about your good memories of Kenmore. We thank everyone who contributed memories. Following are a few we received.

I remember when.....

Jack Scruby wrote: "In the 30's funeral directors provided ambulance service. To this day I can see that yellow Prentice ambulance coming down the boulevard with siren wailing on its mission of mercy. The Prentice boys, Nat and Bob, were the attendants."

Ilene Keith shared: (1940s) "My most memorable times of Kenmore were when my brother & I came from West Virginia to visit our older brother. Every summer we would go to Summit Beach on the streetcar. When coming home from Summit Beach, we knew when we saw Daggett's market's big orange sign to ring the bell and it stopped at Shadyside Park." (Historical Society note: Daggett's Super Market was located on the corner of 18th Street and Kenmore Boulevard 1948-59)

"One memorable experience at Summit Beach was when my brother wanted to ride the motor boats. He asked me what I wanted to ride, and I said I wanted to ride the bumper cars. He told the bumper car operator to keep punching the ticket and he would pay for it when he got back from the motor boats. Fortunately for me, my brother broke down on the water and was unable to come get me right away. Needless to say, I got my fill of bumper car rides that day!

I enjoyed visiting Kenmore so much, that I moved here".

We were looking forward to our first 'Beggars night' in Kenmore. We were prepared with what we saw as an abundance of treats neatly wrapped up in little bags with a ribbon tie in a bushel basket.

My next-door neighbor busted our balloon and brought us to reality when she kindly informed us that our bushel basket of treats would be gone in about 20 minutes. Needless to say, she was right!" 'Beggars night' then and now consists of about 400 beggars.

(1960s) - "One of my favorite places to shop was The Miracle Mart on W. Wilbeth Road and Kenmore Boulevard. I never missed the once a week sale.

Every day was bargain day at Miracle Mart. Only in Kenmore, you would find a store that offered a table of mismatched socks, where you could match them for 9 cents a pair! It was a thrifty way to spend your spare time."

Cindy Keith who is from the Kenmore High School Class of 1974 reminisced: (1960s) "Every year, Prentiss Park had a summer recreational program for kids. It was a great time! Prentiss Park used to be partially wooded.

Remember the game Caroms? It was a tabletop game similar to billiards and table shuffleboard. When I was very young, I was a pretty good Caroms player. I had my own Caroms game, but I also enjoyed going to Prentiss Park in the summer and playing Caroms on the more commercialized type of Caroms table that the Parks and Recreational Department had.

I can remember when I was about 9 years old or so, going to Prentiss Park and this tough talking young boy who was older than me, asking me if I knew how to play Caroms. I didn't know him and I was quite shy around him. I told him I knew how, and he made me play Caroms with him whether I wanted to or not. I was actually flattered at the time, that a boy who was a bit older than me would think that I was a tough enough challenger to play against him. I always wondered if he knew of my image of being a 'sharpshooter' on the Caroms board?"

Cindy also remembered "When your mother got tired of you having the summer off, she would send you packing with a packed lunch and Kool-Aid. Off you would go with your friends walking up East Avenue to Chestnut Ridge. What a good time it would be eating and talking to a few friends."

From **Lillian Jolly**: "I remember when the Little League Baseball Field at Prentiss Park (along side 21st Street, now the expressway exit) was flooded in the winter for ice skating. That was a fun time for everyone!"

So What is First Glance?

Chances are you have heard bits and pieces of some of the things that happen at First Glance, but it's hard to know exactly what the organization does. Well, it's time to clear the air with exactly what First Glance is and the different programs held each week.

First Glance was started on September 14, 2000. It originally started through The Chapel in Akron, but then branched off as its own organization in 2004. Originally it met in the community center every other Thursday until 2003 when it moved to 949-B Kenmore Blvd, where it currently resides. Weekly First Glance offers seven different programs for teenagers in the area. Here are a description of each.

Recreational Nights. Thursdays and Fridays 7:00–9:00 p.m. The goal of this program is to provide youth with an alternative to the streets by giving them a safe, supervised environment to enjoy. Activities such as skateboarding, video games, basketball, internet, billiards and more are all offered to the students at no cost.


Skateboarding Nights. Tuesdays 7:30-9:00 p.m. This program is for the skateboarding students in our community. They come to practice, learn new tricks, and enjoy uninterrupted access to the ramps and equipment. We also offer an optional pre-skate bible study from 7:00 pm-7:30 pm on these nights.

Teen Moms. Tuesdays 4:00-6:00 p.m. This program is designed to reach out to the teen moms

in our community, and teach them the basics of being a mom. We accomplish this through mentor/student relationships with older mothers. Students receive a healthy meal while participating in discussion topics from budgeting and healthy eating habits to child development and health and safety iss ues. Incentives are provided for active participation. Points are awarded for school, church, and program attendance, completion of homework assignments, and regular check-ins with leaders among other things. Students can use earned points toward the purchase of needed baby items.

Stop Having Sex Club (SHS). Tuesdays 6:00-8:00 p.m. This club is an abstinence-based program designed to teach the young women in our community about the consequences of sex and the benefits of abstaining. A special emphasis is placed on the role self-esteem plays in the decision making process. Incentives are provided in this program for attendance, completion of assignments, and recruitment of new members. Participating members are required to sign a commitment to abstain.

Second Look. 1st Wednesday of each month 7:00-8:30 p.m. Second Look is a youth service designed to connect students to local churches. Students gather at First Glance, along with youth and leaders from the local churches for a time of teaching, worship, food and more. The goal of this program is to continue building community and sharing resources with the local church body.

Donuts. Wednesday 7:30-8:00 a.m. during the school year. Located conveniently just one block from Kenmore High School, First Glance offers donuts, juice, coffee & more to hungry students on their way to school. This service is geared towards introducing First Glance to students who might not normally come to First Glance.

First Glance could not operate without the support of the community or the support of the 70+ volunteers who help each week. Thanks to everyone who has been part and continues to be.
