Kenmore Connection Begins 10th Year of Publication

Former Ward 9 Councilman John Conte wrote the first column in the first issue of the Kenmore Connection, starting with "Hey everybody, we have a community newspaper again...the *Kenmore Connection! A GOOD look at the community.*"

To continue from Councilman Conte's article -

"However, bringing this new publication to life did not happen over night. It began over two years ago, when members of the Kenmore Board of Trade (KBOT) Neighborhood Business District Development Committee began exloring how we could bring back a community newspaper. Walt Heeney, who owns a direct mail business, calculated what it would cost to print and mail the proposed newspaper. Beth Kurchak and Mary Hensley, determined what it would cost in dollars and manpower to produce the paper."

"Unfortunately, the total cost was more than the Development Committee could afford at the time." Then "...KHS Principal Paul Wetshtein said the Kenmore Cluster had received funds through the Network for Systemic Improvement (NSI) grant that could help fund the paper and he was sure the students would help produce it. We now had the manpower and half of the funding. In the spring of this year (1999) Jeff Scott wrote a Neighborhood Partnership grant (a City of Akron program that began here in Ward Nine) for the Kenmore Board of Trade, it was approved and we had the balance of the funding"

This first issue was 8 pages in length on letter size paper. It had no advertisers. Over 10,000 copies were mailed to every resident in the 44314 zip code area. Thanks to Mary Hensley & Beth Kurchak, Jeff Scott & Susie Adaska, Kenmore High School Principal Paul Wetsthein & educators Mary Dean & Jeff Kline, and the students of KHS, this community newspaper got its start

at providing news about community groups & events, business happenings, and just good stories about the residents of the Kenmore/Ward 9 area.

Now we enter our 10th year of publication, with just recently the addition of some color pages. All grants have long since gone away, and the Kenmore Board of Trade (still the publisher of this newspaper) now relies on local advertisers to continue to publish at a break-even scale. The Kenmore Board of Trade sincerely thanks all those who have advertised in the last ten years (205 different businesses, groups, & residents!) And to honor those who have consistantly advertised at least once a year for six years or more, a new logo was designed to be placed in the ads of those who qualify.

Please remember to thank all the advertisers you see in this and future issues of the Kenmore Connection. It is with the support of the local community that our area businesses can survive & grow in today's economy. Please always remember to shop locally if the items or services you need are available. The Kenmore Community will always be healthy if it has a healthy business district to draw upon.





Councilman's Corner Snow Bans & Towpath Trails by Councilman Mike Freeman

Hopefully by the time this article arrives at your home, any information regarding snow issues will be outdated. Please be reminded that when significant snowfall occurs, Akron does issue snow parking bans. The police department or the service director will implement snow parking bans in a couple of different ways---

---Parking bans are immediately effective when two inches of snow has fallen on streets marked with red signs indicating they are considered to be Snow Parking Ban streets.

--- The City also issues snow parking bans that will include other streets, as needed, and makes those announcements through its web site and local news outlets.

When a snow parking ban is announced, it is best that all cars be removed from parking spots on city streets, regardless of whether city crews are plowing main roads or residential side streets.

Cars not moved from street parking spots are subject to being towed. Akron snow removal teams appreciate adherence to the snow parking bans. Streets free of parked cars are critical if we are to get them plowed in a timely manner.

For those of you who use Manchester Road, between Wilbeth and Waterloo, get ready for the orange barrels to be rolled out soon. A major project, similar to the Manchester Road project recently completed south of Waterloo, is slated to begin this year. While no one enjoys the disruptions caused by construction, the alternative is not an option. Good roads promote business and strengthen neighborhoods.

Council recently approved legislation providing the funding for the completion of the towpath trail from Young's Restaurant north to the northern end of Summit Lake. Residents of Ward 9 have been able to enjoy a point of entry to the Towpath at the trailhead at Manchester/Carnegie. This however only allowed travelers to proceed south. This new section will now extend the path north toward downtown. An additional trailhead will be established at the canal and Wilbeth Road. One of the outstanding features of this new addition of trail will be a floating path in proximity to the canal at Summit Lake.

Please remember that we continue to hold monthly ward meetings every first Tuesday of the month at the Kenmore Senior/Community Center at 7:00 p.m. Thank you again for allowing me to serve our community.







Kenmore Historical Society - Neighborhood Stores

While growing up in the 40's and 50's, there were several small stores around Kenmore. One of my favorites was Adams located at 16th and Chester, which is now called Showcase Meats. I would stop on my way to school or going home and get candy. I remember collecting pop bottles and getting two cents each when you turned them in. Then I would buy myself some candy.

Close to Smith School there was a little store (Clark's) on the right side, in the back of a house, located a few houses up the hill on Chester Avenue. We went there to buy milk and candy at lunchtime. In those days you went home for lunch. Very few kids would stay at school for lunch.

Another favorite of mine was the Williamson's Confectionery located on 12th Street in the building where Dr. J. E. Baker, Chiropractor, is now located. My mother knew the people who owned it and in the evening I would walk over to it with her, and while there she would buy me ice cream. In the front they had a counter and tables and toward the back was where they had groceries and things.

Most little neighborhood stores are gone now. Let's keep their memories alive. The Kenmore Historical Society would like to hear about your favorite stores as you grew up in Kenmore. 

Every Thursday and Friday night hundreds of local students attend First Glance. Many of these students have been attending programming at the student center for several years. In November of last year First Glance invited all interested high school students to consider joining their team of volunteers as Student Leaders. The students answered the call. Currently there are 15 students participating in the program. Each week these students learn about leadership through personal mentoring, group discussion, and experience. Students lead in several ways, they are asked to act according to a higher standard and to lead quietly by example. They also lead by attending on Thursday or Friday nights. On these nights Student Leaders are given small tasks to complete as they mingle with their friends as they normally would.
