The following Saturday all the flags must be picked up, so again the Post invites all to help on this day.

On May 25th the Post will have it's annual Memorial Day Ceremony. Again, the Kenmore High School JROTC and Kenmore High School Band will be there with the Garfield High School JROTC program. The guest speaker will be Summit County Executive Russell M. Pry, and Akron Mayor Donald Plusquellic has been known to show up and give a small speech. 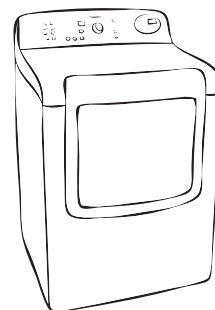

Councilman's Corner

Spring Home Issues by Councilman Mike Freeman

By the time this edition of the Kenmore Connection arrives on your doorstep, spring will be in high gear, and grass will be growing at full speed. The City of Akron prides itself on being responsive to its citizens needs. If an empty or unattended property on your street has an "out of control" lawn, please report these high grass complaints to Akron's 3-1-1 Customer Service line. Be sure to have the address ready for the call taker. For those of you who use a cell phone, the Customer Service staff can be reached by dialing 330-375-2311.

Having problems with a vacant or rundown house on your street? The Akron Health Department 330-375-2366 enforces the Environmental Health Housing code. This sets minimum standards for safe and decent housing. Inspectors visit properties, identify violations, and work with owners to correct problems. If properties are so bad they can't be repaired, the city offers to tear them down at no cost through the Waiver Demolition Program. Garages, too, can be torn down at no cost. Call 330-375-2696 for program information.

"Why did my neighbors street get repaired and mine didn't?" I hear that question a lot. Property owners can circulate a petition for public improvements in the block or blocks in front of their property. Contact the Akron Engineering Bureau Administrative Services Division at 330-375-2355 regarding the petition program.

Finally, special thanks to Larry Givens who has recently retired from the City of Akron. Larry has served our law enforcement community faithfully for decades and has been very responsive to the needs of our community. Thanks Larry, enjoy your grandkids!
