Towpath Trail Completed on Summit Lake

The Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail, the 101 mile trail connecting Cleveland to New Philadelphia, finished it's section through Summit Lake this year. And unique to this trail is the fact that nearly one third of a mile on Summit Lake is a 14 foot wide floating bridge which runs under Kenmore Boulevard. A large observation deck is located along the trail at the southern end of the lake, and it was at this spot that the dedication ceremony was held on Friday September 4th.

The highlight of the dedication ceremony was when the Rimer CLC third grade class of Mrs. Sotak helped Akron Mayor Donald Plusquellic with the ribbon cutting ceremony. Mayor Plusquellic talked about his memories of Kenmore and Summit Lake, and remarked that these Rimer third grade students would have a special memory of their own decades later, when they will remember this as the start of the first of many special projects & activities planned for Summit Lake. The trail is expected to have over 2 million walkers, hikers, and bicyclists a year, and Summit Lake could be one of the centerpieces of this new attraction.



The 11th Annual Kenmore Holiday Celebration will be Saturday December 5th this year, starting at 11:00 am. This community event includes a performance by the Kenmore High School Jazz band, costumed characters, Santa, Children's Treasure Hunt, children's craft projects, Teen Scavenger Hunt, Adult Raffle, food events, business open houses, Library Open House, a juggler, clowns, and free trolley transportation along Kenmore Boulevard from 6th Street to Shadyside Park.

The day's events will continue with the tree lighting ceremony at Shadyside Park starting at 6:00 pm, which is under the sponsorship of the Kenmore Community Council, Inc. The evening events will then culminate with the Children's Party with Santa Claus at Park United Methodist Church. Watch for flyers and posters for further information.



This event is made possible through the volunteer efforts of Kenmore businesses, schools, churches, residents, and service organizations under the co-ordination of the Kenmore Board of Trade Events Committee. Event sponsors are the Kenmore Board of Trade, Kenmore Kiwanis, Kenmore Community Council Inc., Kenmore Senior/Community Center, Kenmore Cluster PTA's, Kenmore High School, and the sponsors and youth volunteers from First Glance. 

After you have enjoyed the Holidays on our own Kenmore Boulevard, don't forget that the holiday celebrations will continue in downtown Akron. Understandably, activities will be slimmed down from prior years due to the recession, but as full of life and energy as ever.

A central feature is the largest seasonal ice skating rink in Ohio (10,000 square feet), with free admission to everyone. Skaters may rent skates for just \$2, the same as in previous years. With support from the Akron Community Foundation and other local foundations and businesses, most of the costs of the Lock 3 ice rink will be paid from private contributions. The rink will open Saturday, November 21st and remain in operation through January 31st, 2010. It will be attended Thursdays - Sundays, which represents a reduction in staffing from 2008 when the rink was open every day during December and January except Mondays and the holidays. At other times, during daylight hours, skaters may use the rink at their own risk.

The city has eliminated \$200,000 from the budget for Lock 3 this winter. In addition to eliminating support for its sister-city vendors at the Christkindl Market, Lock 3 is eliminating the giant outdoor tent from the footprint this year, and reducing marketing expenses.

This year's official lighting ceremony of the city's Christmas Tree will take place Friday, November 27th at 7:00 pm and will be sponsored by the Downtown Akron Partnership. However, the city will not pay for the elaborate light and fireworks show the night after Thanksgiving.

Akron's Chriskindl Market will be open for the sixth year, but this year we will not be hosting our sister-city vendors from Chemnitz. Instead, we are looking for local ethnic groups to share the goods and products that represent their special holidays with everyone. The city is still actively seeking groups willing to sell hand-crafted items representing diverse cultures in the Chriskindl cottages, between November 27th and December 31st, Thursdays-Sundays. Inquiries regarding Lock 3 cottage sales should be directed to the Lock 3 staff at 330-375-2877, or lock3@ci.akron.oh.us. Approved vendors will be required to share some of their sales proceeds with Akron charities - especially those who are serving the neediest during the holidays.





Park Church Angel Food Ministry - It's Both a Bargain and a B

Park United Methodist Church continues to reach out to the community through Angel Food Ministries, which provides high quality food at low cost to everyone. Angel Food Ministries is a non-profit, non-denominational organization that purchases large quantities of high quality food and is able to distribute the food at low cost to 500,000 families in over 35 states nationwide.

Angel Food is available in a quantity that can fit into a medium-sized box at \$30 per unit. Each month's menu is different than the previous month and consists of both fresh and frozen items, with an average retail value of approximately \$60. Comparison shopping has been done across the country in various communities using a wide range of retail grocery stores and has resulted in the same food items costing from between \$42 and \$78.

Generally, one unit of food assists in feeding a family of four for about one week, or a single senior citizen for almost a month. The food is all the same high quality one could purchase at a grocery store. There are no second-hand items, no damaged or out-dated goods, no dented cans without labels, no day-old breads, and no produce that is almost too ripe.

Also offered are specialty boxes such as steaks, chicken, pork, and a fresh fruit and veggie box. Many participants in this bonus program appreciate the expanded choices. Additionally, there is no limit to the number of units or bonus foods an individual can receive, and there are no applications to complete or qualifications to which participants must adhere. Park Angel Food Ministries also participates in the U.S. Food Stamp program, using the Off-Line Food Stamp Voucher system. Park Church has online order capability for credit & debit cards through www.angelfoodministries.com.

Monthly menus are available at the Kenmore Library, Kenmore Senior/Community Center, or at Park United Methodist Church (weekdays 9 am-2 pm). For more information please call Park Church at 330-745-3714.



Reflections of 50 Years of Pee Wee Football for the Kenmore Pee by Joe Francis

As the 2009 football season began for the Kenmore Pee Wee players, I could not help but think of my Kenmore Pee Wee football team 50 years ago in 1959. Although we had Little League baseball, I believe there was no youth football program until that season.

Now as I look back to that time I can only imagine what the coaches went through to put this team together. My father Joe Francis, Lloyd Miller (not pictured), Lou Sabatini, and others dedicated all their spare time to recruiting us, raising funds for equipment and uniforms, conducting practices at Prentice field, finding us opponents to play, and organizing transportation for us to away games. I mention finding us opponents to play because there were no other Pee Wee teams in Akron, we were the first not only in Kenmore but the first in all of Akron.

They were able to put together a schedule for us against CYO teams who did have youth football. Our weight limit was 110 pounds, all our CYO opponents had a weight limit of 130 pounds (St. Sebastian, St. Martha, St. Peters, St. Paul's) and a CYO team in the Cleveland area.

Even in that first year and despite the weight difference we had a winning season and as it turned out some excellent players, like Ron Miller, who went on to become high school All-American. Again I attribute that success to the wonderful men who dedicated their time and efforts to establishing the Kenmore Pee Wee football program.
