Just about everyone knows Habitat for Humanity builds homes for those in need. What most people do not know, however, is that these homes are sold at a greatly reduced price to the families who move into them. The sale of these homes helps provide some of the funds for the next home to be built. Habitat for Humanity has been active in Summit County for the past 23 years, and launched the "A Home of Our Own" campaign in 2009 to purchase and renovate the old Handy Andy facility across from Rolling Acres Mall. This allowed them to consolidate and move all operations for Summit County under one roof, greatly improving their efficiency.

On July 6th, 9th Ward Councilman Mike Freeman held the July Councilman's meeting at the new Habitat for Humanity's ReStore building. Completed in December 2009 in the former Handy Andy building at 2301 Romig Road, ReStore is "The Store where you shop for yourself and help build homes for others."

So on the first Tuesday in July at the Councilman's Ward Meeting, about 60 Kenmore residents listened to Program Manager Danielle Hupp talk about the missions of Habitat for Humanity, the new ReStore facility, and about a new home being built right here in Kenmore on McIntosh Avenue the third week of August (we hope to have an article & pictures in the next Kenmore Connection). After the meeting everyone got to tour both the ReStore building and the work area for Habitat for Humanity, where many parts of the new homes to be built are pre-constructed.

The ReStore is open Thursday, Friday, and Saturday 8:00 am to 4:00 pm. It contains many of the items you would need in the way of furniture, appliances, and building materials for your home, both in brand new and gently used condition. Donations of these types of items would be gladly welcome on those days. Those items & materials not used directly in the construction of Habitat homes are sold in the ReStore, with all proceeds funding the building of new Habitat homes in the Summit County area. No pre-registration is required, just show up at 12:00 noon for a fun afternoon of racing, food & refreshments.





The 15th Annual DeBord Halloween Party Will Soon Be Here!






At present we are working on a new 2011 Kenmore Historical Society calendar. We have also just added another wooden miniature to our Kenmore collectibles. The "Kenmore Standpipe" is now available along with our other miniatures at Kenmore Komics & Games, 1020 Kenmore Boulevard. Two more miniatures are in the works: The Kenmore Boulevard Signs and the original Highland Park School.

Highland Park was built in 1922 shortly after the residential allotment called Highland Park was opened largely through the efforts of A. R. Ritzman of the Heminger-Ritzman Realty Company. The new school had fourteen rooms. Before the school was built, children in the area attended school in portable buildings and the old Tamarack School near Nesmith Lake. The school is located in an area that was originally part of Coventry Township. This area, also referred to as Oakwood, was annexed



by the city of Kenmore in 1920. Additions were made to Highland Park in 1956 and 1963. On January 12, 2000, the name was changed to Sam Salem Elementary in honor of Sam Salem, the longest serving member of the Akron School Board. The old building was demolished in July 2008. The new school, named Sam Salem Community Learning Center, was dedicated September 18, 2008.








Sam Salem Community Learning Center

On the occasion of the 65th anniversary of the end of World War II, the Class of 1945 will mark our 65th graduation anniversary by inviting the classes of the 1930's through 2010 to join us in honoring those sons and daughters of Kenmore High who have served in our country's Armed Forces in all the wars since Kenmore's founding in 1908 and our Alma Mater's founding in 1916 and continuing to the present.

We will and especially remember those who gave their lives for our liberty!


