



Lock 3 Events

For the seventh consecutive year, Downtown Akron will again be home to Ohio's largest seasonal ice skating rink at Lock 3. The City of Akron will host numerous Holiday events at Lock 3 in collaboration with the Downtown Akron Partnership.

The ice rink opens Saturday, November 20th, and will offer free skating through the end of January, 2011.

Kenmore Historical Society News

It won't be long before another piece of Kenmore's past will disappear. We know not everyone shares the same interest in preserving history, but we had hoped Young's Restaurant could be saved and incorporated into the Ohio & Erie Canal Tow Path project. Now we look forward to seeing the future of this site.

Young's was established in 1850. At one time it was credited with being the oldest restaurant in Summit County. Long ago John and Elizabeth Young served all-you-can-eat bluegill sandwiches free of charge to patrons who arrived by canal boats, horses, and carriage at their log cabin tavern. They later served fish and chicken dinners for 25 cents. When their son Lewis bought the business, he tore down the log cabin and built a new restaurant that was enlarged in 1905 to include a hotel with 100 rooms. Young's closed after an estimated 142 years of business and five generations of family ownership.

We can only read about that part of the history of Young's, but many of us still remember going there on Sunday or special occasions for dinner or a banquet with our family and friends. The present deterioration on the outside of the building has overshadowed those good memories. Some only look upon it with disdain. Others hate to see it demolished. Soon it will be gone and all we will have are our memories to pass on to future generations.




