Councilman's Corner

Akron City Council recently held their annual retreat. As a cost saving measure the venue was held locally in downtown Akron. One of the main topics for the weekend was the City's operating budget. As we move in to 2011, we will continue to be faced with budgetary challenges. It was brought to our attention that the Public Service Department alone has decreased their staff from 1100 in 1998 to the current number of 600. This decrease in numbers is through attrition. You may also recall that last year nearly 170 City employees took a voluntary separation agreement which was offered. The cost savings was significant but the economy continues to bring significant challenges.

Some City Departments are making their services available to other government entities throughout the county on a fee basis. Currently some of these cost saving and revenue producing activities are as follows--

- -- The Summit County Engineer and ODOT now uses the city truck wash facility.
- --University of Akron auto maintenance is now performed by the City of Akron.
- -- The County Health district now uses Akron for auto maintenance.
- -- The City is now the point of fuel purchase for the Akron University Roo Express.

If you have access to the internet, the City of Akron's financial books are open to the public at http:// www.ci.akron.oh.us/Finance. To see a full accounting of last year's city income tax revenue as compared to 2009 visit http://www.ci.akron.oh.us/FinanceReports/2010_all_tax.pdf.

Our topic for our March Ward meeting on Tuesday March 1st, will be the combined sewers in Akron and the ongoing negotiation with the State and Federal EPA. This issue, while somewhat difficult to grasp, is of extreme importance to the citizens of Akron. Please be with us at 7:00 pm at the Kenmore Senior/Community Center.
