



Councilman's Corner

Could Your Neighborhood Group Use a Grant??

Over the past several years, the ninth ward has benefited from the Neighborhood Partnership Program. The NPP is a neighborhood-based program designed to encourage new, creative neighborhood efforts. The Neighborhood Partnership Program provides matching grants to neighborhood organizations for small, innovative neighborhood-based projects.

The program was created to strengthen and provide resources to neighborhood-based groups wanting to improve their neighborhoods. Additionally, it was developed to stimulate partnerships between the City of Akron, the Akron Community Foundation, neighborhood residents and business associations for new creative neighborhood efforts such as safety programs, education initiatives, cleanup projects, and vacant lot improvements.

Neighborhood groups and organizations will compete for grants and must match funds awarded by the City of Akron and the Akron Community Foundation with contributions of volunteer time, cash, or in-kind donations of goods and services. Grants ranging from \$500 to \$7,500 will be awarded annually. The match requirement is \$1 for \$1 and must be secured before beginning the project.

To be eligible, projects must:

- -Provide a public, neighborhood benefit to a defined area.
- -Have neighborhood involvement in all phases of the project.
- -Have matching resources (cash, donated goods and services, volunteer time) to cover the funds requested through Neighborhood Partnership. The matching requirement is \$1 for \$1 match up to \$7,500.
- -Specify a time frame for completion of the program up to 12 months. Funds are not payable on invoices dated before or after the contract dates.

I would strongly encourage your block watch or neighborhood organization to consider the 2012 NPP. For more information feel free to contact the Department of Planning and Urban Development at 330-375-2090.

Kenmore Historical Society News

This has to be one of my favorite "Remember When" photographs of Kenmore High School. There are a lot of memories for many people in this overview and the surrounding area back before 1975 when the original building and subsequent addition were demolished.

Several homes were purchased in order to build the new high school and parking lot. The old City Hall can also be seen on the Boulevard. A section of 15th Street running diagonal in the lower right corner is no longer here. Likewise Vermont Avenue that ran along the north side of the school is gone. Battles Avenue is the small portion shown in the lower left corner.


The original section of KHS was built in 1916 (shown below). The rapid increase of students made it necessary to add the north wing to the building the next year (see bottom photo). This section housed elementary students for a few years until the completion of Smith and Pfeiffer Elementary Schools.




In 1956 the Akron Board of Education dedicated the new addition of a double gymnasium, cafeteria, music room band room, shops, science rooms and offices. This addition is shown in the overview photo above. An almost entirely new school was built around 1980.

I think that sometimes they just expect me to say, "no, we just do this for kicks." And, as discouraging as things can be sometimes, I still have to answer with a resounding, "YES!"

Yes, I feel we do. We do make a difference. We may not make a difference that changes the face of teen parenthood, but we do see good things happen in the lives of these young parents.

First, in keeping with our mission statement, we offer a hope in Christ. A hope that there is a God that sees their need, offers forgiveness, and changes lives.

Weekly there are volunteers willing to invest in the lives of these young parents. We stand by them through their difficult times, their struggles, and sometimes repeated bad judgment. But we also get the pleasure of sometimes seeing them listen to what we say, realizing that their child's well-being is in their hands, and making efforts to be good parents and raise responsible children.

So, when I see a girl hurry home to put her child to bed on time, worry about not having sunblock her baby during the heat of day, concerned if her baby is dressed adequately or if they are progressing quickly enough, I have to stop and pause. Pause and think that, "yes, yes they are learning." They are learning slowly how to parent. They are learning how to discipline, how to maybe do things differently that what their parents did, how to think through actions and consequences, and how to have their child not make the same mistakes that they have.

Fortunately, the girls like coming to Teen Moms. It's a fun and welcoming environment. It's a setting that is home to all of them. It's a non-threatening place where they can relax, enjoy each other, and learn. Learn about themselves and how to parent.

In fact, they like coming so much that they don't really leave. I guess that when we started this program I never anticipated them getting older. But, they have. As a result of that "young moms" has started. Young Moms not only have their own meeting time, but step up and begin to assume leadership roles.

These leadership roles were evident when the "1,000" year flood hit Teen Moms this past summer. After I sent out a plea for help, almost all of our young moms showed up to help us slosh out water, carry out items, and sift through many messes. This alone thrilled my soul. However, when they had finished cleaning our mess, they went out into the community and took food to some of the most flooded streets. As I watched them wade through the waters carrying food to the residents, I realized that my girls were growing up, and that on that day, I was proud.

Are we doing everything right? Are they doing everything right? No, of course not. Are we making a difference? Of course.
