

Special thanks to APD for informative methamphetamine meetings

Akron Passes Charter Amendment

All Council members will serve four-year terms, saving the city an estimated \$200,000 for each election eliminated. 

Kenmore Cardinals Football

The 2012 football season concluded for the Kenmore Cardinals Team on a drizzly, cold night at Infocision Stadium on the University of Akron campus. Our Cardinals played a strong game allowing the coaching staff to play just about everyone from late in the third quarter until the final second ticked off the clock.

Kenmore finished the season with a 5-5 record overall and 3-3 in City Series play which put them in fourth place. This marked the first time in over 20 years that the Fighting Cardinals had consecutive seasons of .500 or better records. Remarkably this was accomplished with a team that played numerous underclassmen, even giving many freshmen a taste of varsity football by playing on special teams. It goes without saying the Kenmore Football Team has a strong foundation and the program is built to be competitive for the long haul.

The coaching staff has built a bridge between the highly successful Kenmore Youth Program and the high school that had been missing for years. The high school players and coaches are often seen at youth games, practices and have a very open line of communication between each. This season the high school has what has been characterized as one of the most talented and biggest turn out of freshmen players seen in a long time.

The coaches at Kenmore have built the program and put it on solid footing by following the plan Coach Ed Peltz laid out upon being named head coach three years ago. The program stresses academics, being good citizens, leadership and doing the right thing all the time. Although some have found it uncomfortable to be confronted when they fall short players have bought in to what this program stands for. The coaches inherited a squad, that the year before they arrived, finished the season 0-10 and had 16 players on the team. Coach Peltz has seen the numbers rise each year he has been in charge going from 45 to 52 to this year having 61 players.

Numerous success stories have come out over the 3 years too. The Cardinals have beaten Garfield for the first time in over 20 years; they have beaten Buchtel for the first time in over 21 years, started 2 seasons in a row 2-0 and have defended their home stadium over the past two seasons by going 5-1 in the Cardinal Cage. Our team has had numerous positive articles written about them and the program proudly has placed a number of players in college to continue their academic and athletic careers. Kenmore High School is a MUST STOP for college recruiters as our program is continuing to gain steam.

We are thankful to sponsors who support us, fans that cheer for us and the community that embraces us. We will continue to work hard and we will continue to do our best to make Kenmore proud of our accomplishments on the field, in the classroom and in the community. Ward 9 Leaf Removal Program

The city of Akron has begun its annual Bulk Leaf Removal Program. Akron residents, within the posted area, will be permitted to place leaves in the street, not more than two feet from the curb on their Leaf Collection Day. For Ward 9, leaf removal is scheduled to begin Saturday December 1st.

Residents may use any of their three (3) annual FREE Sanitation bulk pickups for leaves if they don't want to wait for the scheduled pickup. You will need to schedule this thru the 3-1-3 call center.

To those taking advantage of this city program, please remember---

DO NOT BAG LEAVES unless you have arranged for a Sanitation bulk trash pickup through the 3-1-1 center. DO NOT allow children to play in leaves on or near the street.

DO NOT place branches or other debris in the street (leaves only).

DO NOT rake leaves into the street after leaves have been removed from your street or you will be subject to a fine.

DO NOT park vehicles on the street the day before your scheduled pickup until your leaves have been removed.

DO NOT park vehicles over leaves. The heat from the underside of the vehicle may cause a fire.

DO rake leaves into the street no more than two feet from the curb or street edge.

DO rake leaves into the street the day before the scheduled pickup day (December 1st).

Signs will be posted at intersections to remind residents when leaves will be removed.

Signs will be posted in wards prior to pickup dates.

Please note that each ward takes more than one day to pick up autumn leaves. All residents need to have the leaves out by the posted date. Do not wait until you see the equipment in our ward or you may be too late. For leaf removal information, please dial 3-1-1 or 330-375-2311, or check on the web at www.akronohio.gov. This information provided by the 2012 City of Akron / Street Cleaning Division.






DeBord's 17th Annual Community Halloween Festival

Kenmore Historical Society News

Kenmore High School Celebrates a Special Anniversary

Kenmore's 2013 seniors will be the 95th class to graduate from Kenmore High. Over the years, the school has seen many changes. It all began in the fall of 1916 when Drummond and Miller Construction Company began building a new Kenmore school. The following fall, high school classes moved into the new building. Due to the rapid growth of the village of Kenmore, an addition was begun in February of 1917. In the fall of 1918, the new addition was occupied, but not by high school students since space was needed for grade school children.

In 1918, the first class graduated from the new school. The class was composed of four students, but only three were present. The fourth received his diploma early, prior to leaving for the Armed Forces. The graduates were Mildred Reffner, Cleon Deselms, Jay Prentiss, and James Stuver.

The village of Kenmore became a city in 1922. Kenmore High became an Akron Public School when Kenmore was annexed to the city of Akron in 1929. The school began to expand again in response to the postwar boom. This 50's expansion included the present cafeteria, auditorium, and what is now considered our old gymnasium. Music rooms, science labs and vocational rooms in the basement were also part of this addition.


In the early 70's, a group of Kenmore citizens began discussing with school officials the possibility of construction of a new Kenmore High. Thirty parcels of land in the Kenmore area were purchased and cleared, and in January of 1979, construction contracts were awarded. The original 1916 building was demolished and the 1950s additions were remodeled. During the 1980-81 school year, students attended classes while the remodeling was completed and a new gymnasium was built. By the time the seniors graduated in June 1981, the construction was completed. Despite some setbacks and some minor inconveniences, the Kenmore students and staff survived major construction going on around them. Not a day of school had been lost due to the construction of the 10.5 million dollar project. The new building was dedicated during an Open House held on October 1, 1981.

Many Kenmore residents remember watching Kenmore High School grow and change over the years. The Kenmore Historical Society has three miniature collectibles depicting some of the stages in the life of our school: the original Kenmore School (now known as Heminger) that housed all grades, the 1918 Kenmore High School and the present school.


