

Home Seller Legislation- a Safeguard for Buyers and Neighborhoods

At the time of writing this article, City Council is discussing legislation requiring property owners to provide written notice of pending building and/ or housing code violations prior to the transfer or sale of property in Akron. The legislation comes in the midst of a case where a property buyer has accused a property seller of selling a property that had numerous pending housing code violations. In fact, the property was already scheduled for a Housing Appeals Board (HAB) hearing at the time of transfer. A property had a 9 ½ year housing history with the City. The paperwork on the property was extensive but this information was not passed on to the buyer. This legislation would squarely place, on the seller, the duty and obligation to notify a potential buyer of any active housing or building code violations prior to the transfer of property.

Current law clearly provides a purchaser with the ability to sue the seller for damages. This legislation would make it a duty of the seller to specifically notify a potential buyer of the full extent of housing and building code violations. Failure to do so could be met with criminal action.

Under Paula's leadership, KAB's staff and board have initiated many creative and effective programs, such as the annual Clean Up Akron Week throughout the City; the Beautification Watch Program, that recognizes homeowners, institutions and businesses for well-maintained, litter-free properties; the promotion of recycling programs in the Akron Public Schools; the Graffiti Wipeout Crew; and, and the Adopt-a-Site Flowerscape's beautiful gardens located in all ten City wards. Congratulations, Paula!

It has been a labor of love as we grew to a team in excess of sixty players and became very competitive. The Friday night bus rides back to our stadium were thrilling as we rode down 13th Street to see people standing on their porches and cheering for our kids. We have built a strong foundation that has led to Kenmore Football being considered a strong competitor in the City Series. 



Kenmore Historical Society News

Many businesses have come and gone in Kenmore over the years. At one time we had everything we needed right here locally. Several people have shared their memorabilia from the past with us revealing some of these businesses. Sometimes it is challenging to find much information about them. Many are gone, but not forgotten. Please let us know if you have any history or memorabilia you would like to share.

Steve Garritano, owner of Steve's Barber Shop at 977 Kenmore Boulevard, recently showed us a 1/2 pint bottle a customer gave him from the Kenmore Pure Milk Company. We found the Kenmore Pure Milk Company was located at 236 Wooster Road from 1922 to 1926. This was at the corner of what is now East Avenue and Carey Avenue. Around 1928 the name was changed to Kenmore-Barberton Milk Company. In 1931 it was at the same location, but the address was listed as 2296 East Avenue in the City Directory. In 1933 it became part of The Akron Pure Milk Company and is listed as such. There is also a listing for The Akron Pure Milk Company located on West Bowery. In 1934-35 the City Directory shows 2296 East Avenue as vacant. The W.P.A. office is listed at the site from 1938 thru 1940. That address is not listed in future directories. Mack's Auto Sales is listed in 1946 at 2289 East Avenue and at 2290 East Avenue in 1947-49.

Steve, a fourth generation barber, also has a history in Kenmore. He has been cutting hair 29 years and was located on Carnegie Avenue eleven years. This June will mark eighteen years at his present location. His building has housed a barbershop since 1930.





Immaculate Conception Celebrates 90 Years

Immaculate Conception of Mary Parish, Kenmore, established by The Most Reverend Joseph Schrembs, Archbishop, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland, on 23 March 1923, is celebrating the 90th Anniversary of its foundation. Archbishop Schrembs appointed The Reverend John L. Waldeisen (1887-1957) as first pastor, where he served for 34 years until his death. Services at the new parish were initially held (22 April 1923) at the Boulevard Theater on Kenmore Boulevard.

A combination church-school building on 16th Street SW was completed in September 1924, when classes began at Immaculate Conception School. A new elementary school building was completed in 1957, when classes moved from the original 1924 building. A convent to house religious sisters teaching in the school was constructed in 1961.

Due to declining enrollment, the elementary school closed in June 2001, after 77 years of service to the community. It was replaced in September of that year with the present Immaculate Conception Pre-School & Day Care Center. Parish K-8 students from Kenmore now attend St. Augustine School, Barberton, through a cooperative arrangement agreed upon in 2000.

The present church building, at the corner of Battles Avenue and 16th Street SW, opened for services with the first celebration of The Holy Eucharist on Christmas Eve, 24 December 1952. The original 1924 church-school building was demolished in 1983 under the direction of then-pastor Rev. Thomas W. McCann; the parishioners themselves renovated the convent building, connecting it to the new school building and creating an assembly hall on the first floor, a library for the elementary school on the second floor.

Jubilee celebrations marking the Anniversary have included a number of parishioner-centered social activities, and will conclude with the Anniversary Mass on Saturday, 23 March 2013, at 5:30 pm. At that time, a memorial plaque will be dedicated to the memory of The Reverend William A. Jurgens. Father Jurgens (1928-1982) was a son of the parish, ordained a priest for the Diocese of Cleveland on 18 December 1954. He held the degree of doctor of ecclesiastical history, was a professor at Borromeo Seminary in Wickliffe Ohio, and St. Mary Seminary in Cleveland.

A talented musician, he was renowned for his published works on Gregorian Chant; a gifted linguist, he mastered Latin, Greek, Coptic and Syriac, enabling him to translate the writings of the early Fathers of the Church. His three-volume The Faith of the Early Fathers has become a standard referential text for seminaries, divinity schools and universities throughout the English-speaking world.


Lawndale's 100 Year Anniversary Celebration Was a HUGE Success!
