

Councilman's Corner

Quality Recycling- What Are You Feeding Your Blue Container?

Akron residents may be surprised to learn how much is actually recyclable in the blue carts within their city-run curbside program. In 2010 curbside collection went to single stream recycling. Single stream recycling means you can mix all recyclables together in a clear plastic bag. Recyclables are the leftover packaging from food and beverage products purchased at the grocery store.

What is recyclable? All types of paper (junk mail, magazines, and newspaper), broken down cardboard, metal cans, glass jars and bottles, rigid plastics (excluding plastic bags, lids to bottles, and Styrofoam), and cartons can be mixed together and placed in the blue carts on recycling day.

Akron residents are strongly urged to avoid placing the wrong items in the recycling bin. "It is very important in a single stream recycling program for safety of the workers at the materials recovery facility (MRF) and for the marketability of the recyclables to recycle right" states Yolanda Walker, Executive Director for ReWorks. ReWorks has partnered with the city to look for ways to reduce contamination starting with assessing recycling carts at the curb. "If Akron residents are placing incorrect items in their recycling carts they will be notified," states Paul Barnett, Akron Public Works Manager.

Cartons have been added to the program's material list this year. Milk cartons, juice boxes and soup cartons are packaged in a paper board material that is easy to recycle and is in high demand. Once cartons are placed at the curb along with the other recyclables they are taken to the Waste Management's GreenStar MRF in Akron, where they are bailed and shipped to paper mills to be made into new products such as tissue or recycled paper.



First Glance Expands Their Skate Park

First Glance recently expanded, adding a larger Skate Park to their facilities. They had an amazing turn out for their Grand Opening on October 11th. There were over thirty skateboarders from age eight to twenty five that came to skate the new indoor park. Everyone got in free, received free food, and joined in fun, highly competitive skateboard contests. Many prizes were given out including skateboards, shirts, and skate shoes. Sun Valley Skateshop and Acathla Clothing also supported the contest winners with prizes.

First Glance Skate Park is the only indoor park between Kenmore and Cleveland, and one of the only indoor parks of Northeast Ohio. In the summer, kids can skate and play outside. First Glance Skate Park gives kids a safe place to continue to practice, even when the weather isn't agreeable. At least once a week, the park is visited by skaters that drive an hour or more, because it's the closest place they have to go.



In addition to First Glance Skate Park being a place for kids to come skateboard, it's also a place for them to come to be mentored, find friends, and find God. All of the staff are volunteers. First Glance - Teen Moms and Beyond

When I first started Teen Moms, I never anticipated the girls in the programming getting older. I'm sure it's something I should have considered, but I just never did. Many times the girls would ask me how old they had to be before I kicked them out of Teen Moms. I would laugh and say, "oh, probably 40 or so." Little did I know that I would actually have to ask myself these same questions.

We are starting our 7th year of Teen Moms. It's hard to believe, but my girls have grown up during that time. Many of them have moved on with life, jobs, etc. But, some have chosen to stay, and some come to our programming as older girls. Their "growing up" forced me to think long and hard about what this would look like within First Glance.

A few years ago we began having "Young Moms." Young Moms is for those who are 21 and over. It seems as though moms in this age group really desire community. Our Young Moms program differs some from the Teen Moms but still functions similarly. The girls still come and eat dinner family style with their children and leaders. The girls still have a "lesson" time in which we do some sort of structured learning. The girls still have the opportunity to earn "baby dollars" to spend in the Boutique.

However, the difference is that the teen moms have grown up into young moms. Their attitudes change, they listen to advice more readily, and they are ready to make changes to improve the lives of themselves and their children. Their "growing up" allows them to have more responsibilities within the program in the way of lessons, cooking, attendance, working the boutique, etc. This is sometimes a slow, but encouraging process to watch happen.

When the girls "grow up," their children "grow up!" Unfortunately, I never thought too much about that either! Their kids outgrew the nursery and baby toys before we knew it. Programming has now expanded to include "Tiny Glancers." Tiny Glancers is for those that are potty-trained, age 3 and up. This group focuses on learning activities for the children and getting them ready for school.

We also found that when girls and children come to our programming, we have the occasional dad show up as well! Thankfully, we have several men who give their time to stay and "hang out" with these young dads. Young Dads meet with the mentors and are able to earn "baby dollars" as well to buy needed items for their children in the Boutique.

Seven years have gone by and we have gone from TWO teen moms to programming for Teen Moms, Young Moms, Young Dads, Nursery and Tiny Glancers. It's been a good seven years!

Kenmore Historical Society News

Radio Parts and Service Company

When my Dad (Robert J. Paradis) and Uncle (Arthur N. Paradis) were little boys, they got excited about electronics from their father (Arthur W. Paradis), a civil engineer working in the rubber industry. The three of them built radios that were powered by storage batteries (like car batteries). The boys toted those batteries between their house on Pfeiffer hill and the gas station at 12th & Kenmore Boulevard in their little wagon to keep them charged. I think Unkie said it cost a nickel to charge a battery. From this hobby, both of them had a lifetime interest in all things electronic.

Robert (with the help of Arthur W., who was too old for military duty) gathered broken radios and spare parts to cobble together working radios that Robert sold to people clamoring for news of the war. As you may recall, at that time many commodities were not sold to civilians. Radio Parts and Service Company was borne of this effort.

I'm not sure if my father built the Radio Parts and Service building at 1041 Kenmore Boulevard or bought it. I do know that he added on to it sometime in the early '50s, well before I was born in 1957.

When the war ended, Arthur N. returned to partner with Robert as the business grew.

As technology improved, televisions and appliances were added to their product offerings. Eventually, Radio Parts and Service Company came to specialize in the sale, support and service of RCA radios, televisions, stereos and tape players. Arthur N. did most of the house calls, climbing roofs to install antennas, carrying testers to check tubes and tools to fix malfunctioning circuits. RJP concentrated on sales and acquisitions.

Both Robert and Arthur N. were self-taught electronics engineers. With the success of Radio Parts and Service Company, they branched out into producing aircraft communication and navigation radios and parts. They incorporated as the U.S. Naviguide Corp at the same address. Their "AT-103" aircraft radio was very popular and sold around the world. Hundreds were produced in the '50s and '60s. The AT-103B had its own battery so it fit a niche market of airplanes that didn't have electrical systems, such as Aeronca Champ, Piper J3 Cub, etc. Up until the '60s most airports didn't have control towers. It was only the bigger ones that required voice communications with a tower. As airplanes evolved, the demand for the AT-103 diminished.

U.S. Naviguide Corp moved into producing custom electronics, primarily as a subcontractor for Babcock and Wilcox as they helped build nuclear power plants. This continued into the early '70s. My father (Robert J. Paradis) died on Christmas 1973 after a long illness. My mother sold the RPS/USN building to Mr. Cozzoli and it was torn down to expand their parking lot. U.S. Naviguide ceased operations immediately. Unkie (Arthur N.) continued servicing electronics as Radio Parts and Service, but did so from his home and word of mouth advertising. That business diminished as consumer electronics moved to solid state and became disposable, so Arthur retired as his clientele dried up.

As a child, I helped in the shop by testing and selling tubes. Mostly I think I was in the way (as any child would be!), but Kenmore was a friendly place to grow up. I don't recall ever meeting a surly customer. I have many warm memories of growing up in our apartment above RPS. Isaly's was of course my favorite, with the Kenmore Bakery a close second. Then there was buying candy at Metzger's and McDowell's and that candy shop near Shadyside. Exploring Kenmore Hardware with my Dad and Uncle was fun, too. So was taking tap dancing lessons from Helen Jeanette. Many happy memories.
