Kenmore High Graduate Wins Award

by Coleen Curry, Director, Academic Achievement Programs, The University of Akron

In 1965 former President Lyndon B. Johnson began the "War on Poverty" with TRiO programs, Upward Bound, Student Support Services and Educational Opportunities Centers in an effort to "level the playing field" by providing increased access and support for success in higher education for low income and potential first generation college students.

The University of Akron has been hosting TRiO programs for 28 years and successfully sending first generation and low-income students to colleges throughout the country. In fact, annual reports to the U.S. Department of Education indicate that UA programs exceed their objectives for high school graduation, college entry immediately following high school, and 6 year college degree attainment. National statistics for the same population hovers around 20-22% for completion of higher education. However, U.A. TRiO alums that participate in Upward Bound, Upward Bound Math and Science and Educational Talent Search have a high school graduation rate of more that 96%, college entry of 99% and baccalaureate degree attainment for both Upward Bounds at 53% in 6 years. (Educational Talent Search programs were not required to track college graduation before 2011).

TRiO professionals belong to Ohio TRiO and are also members of the Mid American Association of Educational Opportunity Program Personnel (MAEOPP) under the auspices of the national organization known as the Council for Opportunities in Education (COE) located in Washington D.C. Each year at the MAEOPP annual conference a TRiO Achiever is selected through nominations which come in from the regional programs (8 states). Ohio TRiO alone serves over 25,000 participants. For the past 3 years Akron alums have been recipients of this honor. In 2011, Kim Fields who participated in our Upward Bound Math and Science program was chosen, and in 2012 Derrick Hall (Upward Bound). For 2013, it is Kenmore High School 1998 graduate James Christopher Ford (Upward Bound).

"Chris" has attained a Ph.D. in Mechanical Engineering from Georgia Tech but he is most proud of his beginnings with Akron Public Schools, the Strive Toward Excellence Program (endowed through the Firestone Trust in 1988 for middle school students) and Upward Bound. Strong family support and a willingness to take advantage of opportunities provided through the community all helped to establish the foundation which made him a stand-out amongst his peers. He now serves as a consultant for the Deputy Director, Department of Energy, is involved in many new and exciting STEM education initiatives, and diverse economic activities for the Obama administration.

Academic Achievement Programs, which consists of Educational Talent Search, Strive Toward Excellence Program, Upward Bound Classic, Upward Bound Math and Science and the Pre-Engineering Program celebrate National TRiO Day each year on the last Thursday in February. Dr. Ford has agreed to be our keynote speaker for the day. At the Ohio TRiO conference, his poise and eloquence combined with a preacher's passion brought the audience to their feet with tears in their eyes. Above the thunderous applause you could hear the chant of nearly a thousand professionals, "TRiO works!"





Councilman's Corner

APD Establishes New Alarm Response Policy

As many of you are aware, the Akron Police Department is implementing a "verified response" policy when responding to electronic alarm systems. Please find below some commonly asked questions and the rationale for this recent decision.

1) Why did Akron decide to move to this verified alarm response policy?

On average, Akron police officers respond to over 9,000 alarm calls per year. Over 98% of those calls are false. This translates into approximately \$200,000 worth of police officer time being used responding to false alarms. This time could be used more efficiently in proactive policing activities.

2) Are there any additional costs to alarm owners?

No. The City of Akron will be suspending licensing fees for a one year period. Additionally, it is likely alarm users will incur less costs, as the number of false alarms fees assessed should be drastically reduced.

3) When will an officer respond to an alarm?

There will be no change as to how officers currently respond to panic, duress, and hold-up alarms. Intrusion alarms will have to be verified before officers will be dispatched. Additionally, all alarm drops, whether verified or not, will be transmitted to officers working in their cruisers. If an officer is not on a call at the time, they will be expected to respond.

4) What will qualify as a verified alarm?

So far, the basic criteria that will need to be satisfied are:

- -Confirmation of an intrusion/attempted intrusion by a licensed security agency representative.
- -An actual visual account that an intrusion is occurring (Neighbor, owner, etc).
- -Live video depicting an intrusion.
- -Live reliable audio confirming that an intrusion is occurring.

5) Can we expect an increase in burglaries with implementation of this new policy?

No. When we examined all of the agencies that have moved to a verified response policy, none have seen any significant increase in the rate of burglaries.

6) Why should I even purchase an alarm system?

Is it worth it considering APD's new policy? APD believes alarms are a deterrent to crime. If you have an alarm system, statistics have shown that you are significantly less likely to be a burglary victim. APD suggests you shop around to secure the best deal you can to adequately meet your security needs. Those needs may include the value you place on your alarm company's ability to meet alarm new verification standards in order to generate a police response.

7) Will I still need to register my alarm with the City?

Yes. Even though licensing fees will be suspended for at least one year, you will still need to register your alarm with the City.

WHAT APD WILL CONSIDER AS A VERIFIED ALARM

- 1. Confirmation of an intrusion/attempted intrusion by a licensed security agency representative i.e. Guard service.
- 2. An actual visual account that an intrusion is occurring (Neighbor, Owner, etc).
- 3. Live video depicting an intrusion.
- 4. Live reliable audio confirming that an intrusion is occurring. Example Reliable system accurately detecting the sound of breaking glass.
- 5. A perimeter alarm breech in conjunction with an internal motion detector breech.

 (This particular parameter will be evaluated and subject to change in the event it is not effective.)
- 6. Any correspondence with an individual who does not know the correct pass code.

Like any new protocol, APD will continue to evaluate and revisit this new set of operating procedures.


There are some changes in the Kenmore Historical Society. We will have three meetings plus an Open House this year. We invite you to mark your calendar and join us.






Upward Sports Program News

The main Smart Box includes seven frozen main meat proteins, frozen vegetables, starches such as french fries, rice, macaroni etc., one breakfast item, and a dessert, all for \$39. When we compared a Smart Box to a local grocery store the same items would have cost \$88, and when compared to a local discount store the price would have been between \$55 and \$60. Also available are monthly specials - for example the January menu specials included a Super Bowl Box for \$25, a Kids Box for \$25, a 5 pound box of Tyson chicken wings for \$17, or a 10 pound box of chicken breast for \$26. These are all examples of the high quality foods that are available to us from National and regional brand names, they are not seconds or damaged goods!

The home office for Smart Choice and our distributor are both located in Ohio. All food orders MUST BE PRE-ORDERED AND PRE-PAID. We accept Cash, Money Order, or Food Stamps/EBT/SNAP in person at designated order times at Park United Methodist Church.
