16th Annual Kenmore Holiday Celebration Coming Soon!

The 16th Annual Kenmore Holiday Celebration will be Saturday December 6th, starting at 11:00 am. This community event will include an appearance by Santa, children's craft projects at many locations, the Children's Treasure Hunt, Adult Raffle for free prizes (donated by area businesses), food events (such as The Church on the Boulevard's pancake breakfast starting at 8:00 am), business open houses & special sales, Library open house, holiday costumed characters passing out candy, a juggler, clowns, and two free trolleys providing transportation all along Kenmore Boulevard from 6th Street to Shadyside Park and to the Nazarene Church & Immaculate Conception.

The days events will continue at 6:00 pm with all prize drawings, holiday music, and the tree lighting ceremony (sponsored by the Kenmore Community Council Inc) at Shadyside Park. The evening events will then culminate with the Children's Party with Santa Claus at Park United Methodist Church at 7:15 pm.

Many of the businesses on Kenmore Boulevard will not only be hosting sales & open houses, but will also be passing out special coupons for holiday purchases to be used before December 24th for Christmas shopping. And also during the event the four church anchor sites (Park United Methodist Church, Immaculate Conception, Kenmore Community Church of the Nazarene, and The Church on the Boulevard), will have special holiday events throughout the day!

This event is made possible through the volunteer efforts of Kenmore businesses, schools, churches, residents, and service organizations under the coordination of the Kenmore Board of Trade Events Committee. The Kenmore Clock Tower Will Soon be Here!



The Kenmore Board of Trade is pleased to announce that the Kenmore Clock Project will soon be a reality. The City of Akron has agreed to the spot chosen for the clock (in the center median of Kenmore Boulevard on the West side of 14th Street, across from Pierre's Brooklyn Pizza & Deli) and will purchase the foundation the Clock Tower will be placed on. After the base is completed (sometime in the next two months), the clock will be mounted. And in the early Spring, the bricks purchased by donations from area businesses & residents will be affixed to the base, and the clock will be officially dedicated. There is still room for a few more bricks (3-lined brick for \$100 donation, 5-lined brick for \$200 donation, and 8-lined brick for \$500 donation), and you can call 330-753-1151 for information on obtaining a brick form. The date for the dedication will be announced in the February issue of the Kenmore Connection. Thank you to all who donated for your patience while this project was completed.

Kenmore High School on Target

Inside the classrooms at Kenmore High School there is a movement gaining momentum to the benefit of the scholars and staff. It is a movement that continues improving the quality of instruction to best prepare the scholars for college and career readiness.

The Kenmore High School administrative team and staff have an expectation that each scholar will graduate on time with a plan to pursue his or her desired area of interest. We organize their choices into the following four areas: enrolling in a four-year traditional college or university; enrolling in a two-year school to obtain an associate's degree; joining the military, or starting in the work force with a plan for career advancement.

Regardless of what scholars choose, our staff members establish learning targets for their courses to help them focus on the necessary material for graduation. It is safe to say these learning targets are driving the instruction at Kenmore High School and throughout the district as well.

Learning targets are derived from the larger, more comprehensive learning goals established by the Ohio Department of Education for each particular content area, some of which align with the Common Core. Think of learning goals as the broad, complex statements of learning a scholar is expected to know for the course in general. Although it is very important for our scholars to know these statements, they often get confused with the difficult language used throughout.

So, to make it easier, the teaching staff creates learning targets for scholars. They work to rewrite the learning goals into language and statements the scholars can easily understand. The teaching staff then shares these targets with the scholars on a weekly and daily basis. Many staff members have adopted using a learning targets poster which was first started by the talented members of our English Department last year. Byron Hopkins, our

building principal, liked the poster so much he worked with the district to recreate one for each staff member to post in his or her classroom.

The amount of targets a scholar is expected to know ranges based on the material and content but usually falls within three to five targets per lesson. By giving the scholars these specific targets, it continually allows for an open conversation between staff and scholars about the learning taking place. This is extremely positive and helps encourage the scholars to share responsibility for their learning as well.

Many Kenmore staff members are taking things a step further and generating *I Can* statements for each learning target. These statements provide the scholar and teacher with an indication of their level of understanding of the material. It is a communication tool for them to use inside their classroom.

Eileen Everett describes how she uses the concept of learning targets and *I Can* statements in her math classrooms by stating, “I start my lesson by reading the learning targets to the class. I write them as *I Can* statements. For example, today in Algebra 1 my target was ‘I can solve a one-variable absolute-value equation’.” Mrs. Everett provides an excellent example of how to use learning targets properly to drive the instruction taking place at Kenmore High School.

The administration would like to invite any community member into our school to witness the positive changes taking place. We also would like to invite any parent or guardian of scholars who should attend Kenmore, but for one reason or another you have decided to have them educated elsewhere, to our school so we can have a conversation about re-enrolling them here if you are not satisfied with the quality of education they are receiving. First Glance News

In 2006, First Glance created programs to address the needs of the teen and young moms in the Kenmore area. Since the beginning, there has always been childcare to encourage the mothers to attend. As the moms have grown so have their children, and many are now school age. Two years ago First Glance addressed this need by creating a program just for these children called Tiny Glancers.

Realizing the need for an educational program, volunteer and philanthropist, Tami Valvo, who had been working with the young moms, passionately assembled and led a committee of seven women who all shared in the vision for educating the children. The team planned and hosted the HOPE fundraiser to create a space dedicated to hands-on learning. The event, which was held on September 7th, 2013, was a huge success raising the necessary funds to build and renovate a learning center within First Glance.

This new space, which opened October 14th, 2014, is structured to best meet the needs of these children. The learning center provides hands-on sensory learning activities that will help them learn to read and count. Toys will also be available to help them develop healthy social skills. The center includes a reading nook, an area dedicated to imaginative play, the “brain builder” to teach math concepts, and much more.

As the children participate in Tiny Glancers, the Teen and Young Moms programs will teach the mothers how to reinforce learned concepts throughout the week at home. This will be accomplished by sending home learning packets each week for the children and mothers to share in together. First Glance is excited to partner with these mothers to give their children an educational advantage as they enter and continue through preschool and elementary school.

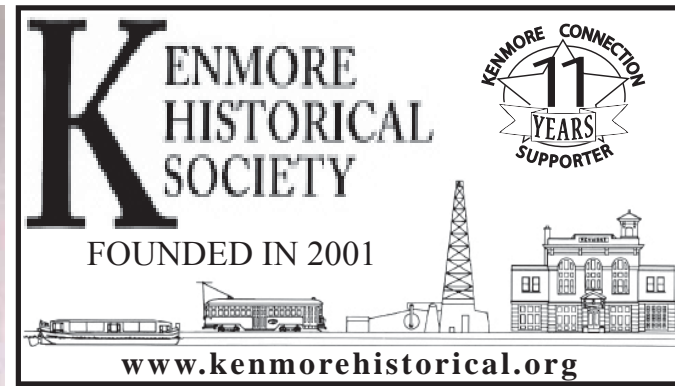

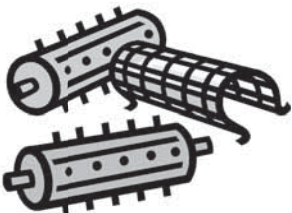

Feeding the Need, One Family at a Time

Shoreline Community Church has been reaching out to the Kenmore community and beyond through its food pantry ministry since 2009. Over 1000 individual families have received food and encouragement since the ministry's inception. What is really incredible about this number is that this small church is doing big things with hardly any advertising. Almost all people who received services at the pantry have come for help by word of mouth advertising.

The Food Pantry Ministry offers groceries to families in need every Friday. Check-in time is at 10:00 am. After a brief Gospel presentation, food is distributed. People are able to receive food from the pantry up to six times a year.

Shoreline desires to be a place of hope and help for the community and offers many other community events throughout the year such as a Community Picnic. The annual picnic features free food, games, a prayer tent, and door prizes such as grocery cards and gasoline cards, all provided to the neighborhood by the generous giving of the church congregation. The picnic is an opportunity for the church membership to get to know those living in the community and ascertain new ways to help meet their needs, both spiritually and otherwise.

The next community event on the calendar at Shoreline is the Annual Thanksgiving Turkey Giveaway Service. The service is being held at the church on Wednesday, November 19th, at 7:00 pm.

People who would otherwise have to go without a Thanksgiving dinner this year will be able to register at the weekly food pantry service until the November 14th deadline. Those who register will receive a ticket for their Free Frozen Turkey that will include all the trimmings, enough to feed a family of four. Ticket holders will redeem their tickets and receive their food by attending the special service. The church has a goal this year to provide one hundred turkeys, feeding over four hundred people. This year, the number may be much higher due to the large amount of early registrations. Forty families have requested help with Thanksgiving dinner the first week of October.

Shoreline Community Church does not accept any government assistance but totally relies upon contributions from their congregation and friends of the ministry in order to keep the pantry stocked. The ministry offers food for the soul and "a hand up" rather than a "hand out" to folks in need. Everyone receives a friendly welcome, several days of food, prayer, and an invitation to Sunday services.
