#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings to All!

This month is the 30th Anniversary of my business - Kenmore Komics & Games!



I often joke with people that it is the longest I've ever held a job, but I do not admit to them why that is. And since you fine members of the Kenmore Chamber let me ramble on at times in this column about "how to run a business" I thought I would give you a little background on why I think I can give you my opinion on this subject.

When I was 8 years old in Detroit a neighborhood lady, Mrs. Teller, hired me to feed & clean up after her 3 dogs & 8 cats, at 75 cents a week. I only quit after 5 years because my parents moved us to Jackson Michigan. I moved lawns & babysat until I finally got that coveted paperboy route in my neighborhood at age 15. At 18 I next went to the Ohio Institute of Technology in Columbus Ohio, where I got a job at the Columbus Airport restaurant. Having taught me to mop the floor & then wash dishes, bus tables & be the short order cook, I settled down into running the snack bar during the 11 pm to 7 am time slot. Since the airport was "dead" midnight to 5 am (except for those who worked there) I had lots of time to study. But that didn't last long. The manager of the gift shops in the airport was impressed with my work ethics (I kept a very clean & organized snack bar) and he hired me away to run the stocking & warehousing of all the items sold in these gift shops.

When I graduated with my Bachelors Degree in Electronic Engineering at age 21, I was hired by a seismic survey company which specialized in oil exploration, and ran the computer equipment in a truck used to collect this information from four to six 40,000 pound "vibrating" trucks supplying the energy put into the ground. For five years I worked in 6 different states out west, working 12-14 hour days, seven days a week, for weeks (and sometimes months) at a time. Then the oil glut of 1985 hit, and I decided it was time to look elsewhere for work, and so moved back in with my parents (who doesn't these days!) at the wonderful age of 26.

Did I mention I read comic books during all these jobs? So while again in Jackson I met the owner of a comic book store who just opened up 3 months before my return. He needed someone to set up his store and run it for awhile as he finished his last year in the asphalt business, and as I had both the knowledge of the product and the experience in sales, stocking, & set-up, he thought it would be a great idea to hire me.

I spent almost a year doing just that, and during that time I met a gentlemen who was impressed with my abilities and suggested I set up a store for him in Akron Ohio, and I could be a silent partner and look for work elsewhere after our store was up and running. So I said yes and we opened on May 7th 1987. And a funny thing happened. My partner was terrible at business, but I found that I liked what I was doing, and even better I liked Akron, and thought that it would be a great city to settle down in. So I bought out my partner after five months, said goodbye to my degree in electronics and kept the store, and have been here ever since!

Thanks to Lee & Jasper McCutchen, whose business was right next store to mine, I got involved fairly quickly with the Kenmore Board of Trade, now called the Kenmore Chamber of Commerce. Because of the Kenmore Connection, I learned how to sell advertising, and I think you will agree with me that with the life experiences I listed above that I have learned a lot about many subjects in the business world.

I might not always pick a subject that is related to your business, but I hope you will continue to let me speak.
