David passed away on July 22nd, at the age of 89. Throughout his life he devoted himself to his family and his community, having spent almost 35 years as a police officer with the City of Akron. Even with this busy schedule, he found time to be a part of the Kenmore Board, as the Security Director during the many years the Board held the Kenmore Olde Time Festival on Kenmore Boulevard, and as President of the Board in 1985. After he retired in 1990, he held the position of Director of Security at Rolling Acres Mall until its closing in 2008, and still attended many KBOT Luncheons were he always gave a report on the happenings at Rolling Acres.

It was in this capacity at Rolling Acres that I remember most about Dave, listening to his stories about the Mall, from both a business and a security aspect. Knowing that the Kenmore Events Committee coordinated the yearly Easter Craft & Egg Hunt at the Kenmore Community Center, he made it a point to make sure that we received the Easter Bunny costume that Rolling Acres had, just before they closed their doors (and we still use it today for our Easter event).

I am lucky to have most (but not all) of the minutes, reports & newsletters from almost 40 years of history of the Kenmore Board of Trade (and I am always looking for more, please let me know if you have any past records). While looking for stuff to put in the KBOT Flashback section of this newsletter, I come across David's name many times. His contributions will always be remembered!
