Is your business on a "Race to the Bottom"?



There was a great article in the Akron Beacon Journal two weeks ago (Monday January 20th), about the three Shopping Malls of Akron (Summit Mall, Chapel Hill Mall, and the gone but not forgotten Rolling Acres Mall). The article discussed the various reasons why Rolling Acres failed, Chapel Hill is about to fail, but Summit Mall is still going strong. One of the big reasons concerned how each Mall presented itself, which I think is appropriate for most of our Kenmore Chamber members.


It seems that both Rolling Acres & Chapel Hill were in a "Race to the Bottom", in that they both mostly sought tenants of the bargain store variety. It was thought that these stores would bring in lots of customers, but two factors doomed this plan. The first was that with cut-rate prices each business had a low margin of profit on the merchandise they sold. At the end of the 20th Century this worked OK, until Amazon and all the other internet discounters arrived on the scene. The convenience of shopping by mail, added to the even deeper discounts they could offer than those stores in the mall, sealed the fates of all those bargain stores that made up a majority of Rolling Acres & Chapel Hill's tenants. One after another, they closed and left those malls.

But how did Summit Mall not fall into this trap? One way was to seek out businesses who were "Racing to the Top", meaning businesses who offered more than just cut-rate prices. These higher-quality retailers and restaurants chose to offer better products & services along with a better experience than shoppers could get with most internet sites. The lesson here is obvious - no business succeeds if their only plan to attract customers is to under-cut all other businesses. You can never outlast Amazon or any internet store if you make no money. Or if the services you provide are of the lowest quality, and the only experience your customers receive are poor ones, then you also will close and be out of business. So "Race to the Top" by providing the best you can!
