But my friendly competitors decided to open their doors, limit the amount of people in their stores to 10 or less, wear gloves, and wipe down affected areas after every visit. By Saturday I had almost decided to do things their way, since they were experiencing much better sales than the closed door method I was using.

But after closing early on Saturday, with the thought that the next time I opened I would really be open, I got a call from a customer who was enough of a friend to have my personal cel number, who called to see why I closed my store early, as he was outside wanting to come in. After some talk he admitted that there was a good chance he had contacted the virus. He wasn't exhibiting any symptoms yet, but his ex-wife was in lock-down because she had all the signs of the virus. And not only did my friend say he had spent a lot of time with her before her quarantine (because they shared custody of their daughter, who also was around her mother a lot), but he said he had a co-worker who said his wife's brother also was now in quarantine waiting to see if he had the virus, and the co-worker kept coming to work and hanging around my friend. So he had encounters with two people who probably are contagious, and yet he was still wanting to visit my store with his probably sick daughter also and not worry about whether he was spreading the virus. Some friend!

So I wasn't going to open my store anyways when the Governor of Ohio announced on Sunday a total shut-down of all non-essential businesses until April 6th. And I am not upset, because of bored people like my friend who aren't worried in the least if they pass along this epidemic. The next two weeks will be tough, but I hope you all do the right thing and keep contact with other people to a minimum. You never know when you will meet people like my friend, which is why we are in this 'Lock-Down" situation to begin with.
