

#### Sole Proprietors Can Now Join the SOCA Benefit Plan

Anthem, NOACC and SOCA are very pleased to announce that the SOCA Benefit Plan MEWA is making room for sole proprietors. They can enroll in the plan starting July 1st. This means if you are the only employee of your business you now can get affordable Anthem Insurance for yourself.

The broker community has already received instructions from Anthem regarding new case submission, and may start quoting rates now.

An eligible sole proprietor must:

- Meet underwriting requirements.
- Work more than 30 hours per week (documentation required).

Regulations limit sole proprietor membership to 10 percent of total SOCA Benefit Plan membership. This is limited to sole proprietors. Presently this offer is not intended for non-profit organizations with one employee.
