Are you tired of seeing abandoned tires?

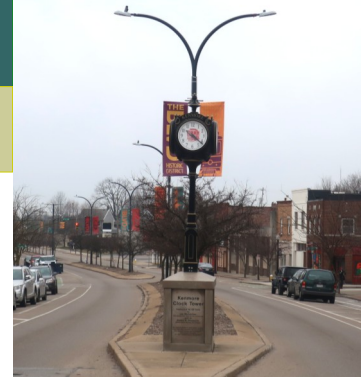
My beautiful wife Julie Ann is just starting on a big volunteer clean-up job she helps coordinate with **Keep Akron Beautiful** every April - The spring clean-up of Summit Lake and its shoreline. And she e-mailed me an article about one of the biggest litter problems Summit County faces, the problem of abandoned tires. When we do the clean-up, I always put on my waders and toss trash up onto the shore, and one of the hardest pieces of litter to toss is an old tire. The article Julie Ann sent me covered many of the reasons for and solutions to this problem (if you want to read the whole article email me and I will send it to you), but I thought I would reprint the following part about “What Residents Can Do To Help”:

- * If you see something suspicious, such as an individual unloading tires onto a property you know to be abandoned, please call the Akron Police non-emergency line at 330-375-2181, or you can submit an anonymous tip by downloading the Akron PD app powered by TIP411 for free from Apple or Android devices.
- * Call 3-1-1 or go online to akronohio.gov/311 to report dumping sites for clean-up.
- * Make sure your neighbors know to be on the lookout and be vigilant when it comes to keeping our city clean.
- * Call for a bulk pick up. If you have tires you need to get rid of, call 3-1-1 to schedule a pick-up. Residents can place up to 4 tires on the curb per year (a separate truck will be around to collect these bulk items).

It takes all of us to keep our communities clean. I will talk more about the Summit Lake Clean-Up next month.
